A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act establishing an emergency medical services task force.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

S.F. 227

- 1 Section 1. EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES TASK FORCE AND 2 REPORT.
- 3 1. The department of public health shall establish a task
- 4 force to ensure the future availability of quality emergency
- 5 medical services for the state.
- 6 2. The members of the task force shall be appointed by the
- 7 director of the department of public health, or the director's
- 8 designee, as follows:
- 9 a. A manager of a rural volunteer emergency medical
- 10 transport service.
- 11 b. A manager of a rural paid emergency medical transport
- 12 service.
- 13 c. A manager of an urban emergency medical transport
- 14 service.
- d. A manager of a nontransport emergency medical service.
- 16 e. A representative of a fire department-based emergency
- 17 medical service.
- 18 f. A representative of a hospital-based emergency medical
- 19 service.
- 20 g. A representative of a private, for-profit emergency
- 21 medical transport service.
- 22 h. A representative of a not-for-profit emergency medical
- 23 transport service.
- 24 i. A representative of the Iowa emergency medical services
- 25 association board of directors.
- j. A representative of an emergency medical services
- 27 training agency.
- 28 k. An urban emergency department physician.
- 29 l. A rural emergency department physician.
- 30 m. A representative of the Iowa emergency nurses
- 31 association.
- 32 n. A representative of the Iowa alliance in home care.
- 33 3. The task force shall discuss the current state of
- 34 emergency medical services in Iowa and make recommendations for
- 35 enhancement of Iowa's emergency medical services system. The

- 1 recommendations shall address issues facing volunteer and paid
- 2 rural emergency medical services, cost projections including
- 3 administration costs for all recommendations, the Medicaid
- 4 reimbursement fee schedule for ambulance services, and the
- 5 nature and scope of any recommended changes in regulations
- 6 governing emergency medical services.
- 7 4. The task force shall, by April 30, 2014, submit a
- 8 report of its findings and recommendations to the governor,
- 9 the general assembly, the department of public health, and the
- 10 emergency medical services advisory council. The emergency
- 11 medical services advisory council shall review the report and
- 12 make recommendations related to implementation of the report's
- 13 recommendations to the director of the department of public
- 14 health.
- 15 EXPLANATION
- 16 This bill establishes an emergency medical services task
- 17 force to ensure the future availability of quality emergency
- 18 medical services for the state. The director of the department
- 19 of public health, or the director's designee, must appoint
- 20 the members of the 14-person task force as provided in the
- 21 bill. The bill requires the task force to discuss the current
- 22 state of emergency medical services in the state and make
- 23 recommendations to enhance Iowa's emergency medical services
- 24 system. The bill requires the task force to submit a report of
- 25 its findings and recommendations to the governor, the general
- 26 assembly, the department of public health, and the emergency
- 27 medical services advisory council by April 30, 2014. The bill
- 28 requires the emergency medical services advisory council to
- 29 review the report and make recommendations for implementation
- 30 to the director of the department of public health.
