A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the use of a false or secret compartment in a
- 2 motor vehicle, and providing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **321.284B False compartment in motor** 2 **vehicle**.
- 3 1. As used in this section, "false or secret compartment"
- 4 means any box, container, space, or enclosure that is intended
- 5 or designed to be used to store, conceal, camouflage, hide,
- 6 smuggle, transport, or prevent discovery of a person,
- 7 controlled substance, firearm, weapon, or other contraband and
- 8 that is within or attached to a motor vehicle including but not
- 9 limited to any of the following:
- 10 a. A false or altered fuel tank.
- 11 b. Original factory equipment of a vehicle that is modified,
- 12 altered, or changed.
- 13 c. A compartment, space, or box that is added to or
- 14 fabricated, made, or created from existing compartments,
- 15 spaces, or boxes within a vehicle.
- 2. A person who owns, operates, or possesses a motor vehicle
- 17 with the knowledge that the motor vehicle contains a false or
- 18 secret compartment, and who owns, operates, or possesses the
- 19 motor vehicle with the intent to store, conceal, camouflage,
- 20 hide, smuggle, transport, or prevent discovery of a person,
- 21 controlled substance, firearm, weapon, or other contraband
- 22 within the false or secret compartment, is guilty of an
- 23 aggravated misdemeanor.
- 3. A person who knowingly designs, assembles, constructs,
- 25 builds, alters, fabricates, attaches, fortifies, installs,
- 26 places, maintains, or causes to be placed a false or secret
- 27 compartment in a motor vehicle with the intent that the false
- 28 or secret compartment be used to store, conceal, camouflage,
- 29 hide, smuggle, transport, or prevent the discovery of a person,
- 30 controlled substance, firearm, weapon, or other contraband
- 31 within the false or secret compartment, is guilty of a class
- 32 "D" felony.
- 33 4. The fact that the false or secret compartment was
- 34 inoperable or was not in use or that the existence of the
- 35 compartment was known to a peace officer is not a defense to a

1 violation of this section.

2 EXPLANATION

- 3 This bill relates to the use of a false or secret compartment
- 4 in a motor vehicle, and provides penalties.
- 5 Under the bill, a person commits an aggravated misdemeanor
- 6 if the person owns, operates, or possesses a motor vehicle with
- 7 the knowledge that the motor vehicle contains a false or secret
- 8 compartment, and the person owns, operates, or possesses the
- 9 motor vehicle with the intent to hide or prevent the discovery
- 10 of a person, controlled substance, firearm, weapon, or other
- 11 contraband within the false or secret compartment.
- 12 Under the bill, a person commits a class "D" felony if
- 13 the person designs, assembles, constructs, builds, alters,
- 14 fabricates, attaches, fortifies, installs, places, or causes to
- 15 be placed a false or secret compartment, or maintains a false
- 16 compartment in a motor vehicle with the intent that the false
- 17 or secret compartment be used to store, conceal, camouflage,
- 18 hide, smuggle, transport, or prevent the discovery of a person,
- 19 controlled substance, firearm, weapon, or other contraband
- 20 within the false or secret compartment.
- 21 In addition, it shall be no defense in a prosecution for
- 22 a violation of the bill if the false or secret compartment
- 23 is inoperable or is not in use, or that the existence of the
- 24 compartment was known to a peace officer.
- 25 An aggravated misdemeanor is punishable by confinement for
- 26 no more than two years and a fine of at least \$625 but not more
- 27 than \$6,250. A class "D" felony is punishable by confinement
- 28 for no more than five years and a fine of at least \$750 but not
- 29 more than \$7,500.
