A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to improving student literacy skills, including
- 2 addressing dyslexia, and providing teacher assistance.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 256.9, subsection 53, paragraph c, 2 subparagraph (1), subparagraph division (e), Code 2014, is 3 amended to read as follows: (e) Professional development strategies and materials to 5 support teacher effectiveness in student literacy development. 6 The center shall collaborate and coordinate with the area 7 education agencies to develop and offer to school districts at 8 no cost professional development services to enhance the skills 9 of elementary teachers in the use of evidence-based strategies 10 to improve the literacy skills of all students. Sec. 2. Section 279.68, subsection 2, paragraph d, 11 12 subparagraph (3), subparagraph division (a), Code 2014, is 13 amended to read as follows: 14 (a) Assists students assessed as exhibiting a substantial 15 deficiency in reading to develop the skills to read at 16 grade level. Assistance shall include but not be limited to 17 strategies that formally address dyslexia, when appropriate. 18 For purposes of this subparagraph division (a), "dyslexia" means 19 a specific learning disability that is neurological in origin 20 and is characterized by difficulties with accurate or fluent 21 word recognition and by poor spelling and decoding abilities. 22 These difficulties typically result from a deficit in the 23 phonological component of language that is often unexpected in 24 relation to other cognitive abilities. - 9 reading enhancement and acceleration development initiative
- 10 that assists students assessed as exhibiting a substantial

- 12 level. The bill requires such assistance to include but not
- 13 be limited to strategies that formally address dyslexia, when
- 14 appropriate. The bill defines "dyslexia".
