A BILL FOR

1 An Act making an appropriation to the department of public
2 defense for the Iowa junior reserve officers' training corps
3 cadet leadership challenge and including effective date
4 provisions.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. IOWA JUNIOR RESERVE OFFICERS' TRAINING CORPS
2 CADET LEADERSHIP CHALLENGE APPROPRIATION.

3 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the
4 state to the department of public defense for the fiscal year
5 beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2016, the following
6 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
7 purposes designated:

8 For the Iowa junior reserve officers' training corps cadet
9 leadership challenge to be held at Camp Dodge in June 2016, for
10 transportation, personnel, and all other necessary expenses:
11 \$ 50,000

12 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. This Act, being deemed of
13 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

14 EXPLANATION

15 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
16 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

17 This bill appropriates \$50,000 to the department of public
18 defense from the general fund of the state for FY 2015-2016
19 for purposes of providing transportation, personnel, and all
20 other necessary expenses for the junior reserve officers'
21 training corps cadet leadership challenge to be held at Camp
22 Dodge in June 2016. The junior reserve officers' training
23 corps is designed to teach high school students the value of
24 citizenship, leadership, service to the community, personal
25 responsibility, and a sense of accomplishment, while instilling
26 in them self-esteem, teamwork, and self-discipline. The Iowa
27 junior reserve officers' training corps cadet leadership
28 challenge is an annual leadership program for Iowa high school
29 students enrolled in the junior reserve officers' training
30 corps program.

31 The bill takes effect upon enactment.
