## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act modifying the threshold damage dollar amounts which
- 2 constitute the crimes of criminal mischief in the second,
- 3 third, and fourth degrees.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

## H.F. 2045

- 1 Section 1. Section 716.4, subsection 1, Code 2016, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 l. Criminal mischief is criminal mischief in the second
- 4 degree if the cost of replacing, repairing, or restoring the
- 5 property that is damaged, defaced, altered, or destroyed
- 6 exceeds one two thousand five hundred dollars but does not
- 7 exceed ten thousand dollars.
- 8 Sec. 2. Section 716.5, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code 2016,
- 9 is amended to read as follows:
- 10 a. The cost of replacing, repairing, or restoring the
- 11 property that is damaged, defaced, altered, or destroyed
- 12 exceeds five hundred one thousand dollars, but does not exceed
- 13 one two thousand five hundred dollars.
- 14 Sec. 3. Section 716.6, subsection 1, paragraph a,
- 15 subparagraph (1), Code 2016, is amended to read as follows:
- 16 (1) The cost of replacing, repairing, or restoring the
- 17 property that is damaged, defaced, altered, or destroyed
- 18 exceeds two hundred dollars, but does not exceed five hundred
- 19 one thousand dollars.
- 20 EXPLANATION
- 21 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 22 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 23 This bill modifies the threshold damage dollar amounts which
- 24 constitute the crimes of criminal mischief in the second,
- 25 third, and fourth degrees. "Criminal mischief" means any
- 26 damage, defacing, alteration, or destruction of property when
- 27 done intentionally by one who has no right to so act.
- 28 The bill changes the threshold dollar amounts to qualify for
- 29 prosecution for criminal mischief in the second degree from
- 30 damage exceeding \$1,000 but not exceeding \$10,000 to damage
- 31 exceeding \$2,500 but not exceeding \$10,000. Criminal mischief
- 32 in the second degree remains a class "D" felony. A class "D"
- 33 felony is punishable by confinement for no more than five years
- 34 and a fine of at least \$750 but not more than \$7,500.
- 35 The bill changes the threshold dollar amounts to qualify

- 1 for prosecution for criminal mischief in the third degree
- 2 from damage exceeding \$500 but not exceeding \$1,000 to damage
- 3 exceeding \$1,000 but not exceeding \$2,500. Criminal mischief
- 4 in the third degree remains an aggravated misdemeanor. An
- 5 aggravated misdemeanor is punishable by confinement for no more
- 6 than two years and a fine of at least \$625 but not more than
- 7 \$6,250.
- 8 The bill changes the threshold dollar amounts to qualify
- 9 for prosecution for criminal mischief in the fourth degree
- 10 from damage exceeding \$200 but not exceeding \$500 to damage
- 11 exceeding \$200 but not exceeding \$1,000. Criminal mischief in
- 12 the fourth degree remains a serious misdemeanor. A serious
- 13 misdemeanor is punishable by confinement for no more than one
- 14 year and a fine of at least \$315 but not more than \$1,875.
- 15 The bill does not modify the crimes of criminal mischief in
- 16 the first or fifth degree.
- 17 By changing the threshold dollar amounts to qualify for
- 18 prosecution for criminal mischief in the second, third, or
- 19 fourth degree, the bill also changes the criminal offenses
- 20 related to crops or crop operation property damage under Code
- 21 section 717A.3.
