A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to possession and storage of game or
- 2 fur-bearing animals and their pelts and including penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 481A.57, Code 2016, is amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 481A.57 Possession and storage.
- 4 A person having lawful possession of game or fur-bearing
- 5 animals or their pelts, except deer venison, may hold them for
- 6 not to exceed thirty days after the close of the open season
- 7 for such game or furbearers. A person having lawful possession
- 8 of deer venison which is lawfully taken by that person with
- 9 a valid deer hunting or trapping license, may hold, possess,
- 10 or store the deer venison game or fur-bearing animals or their
- 11 pelts from the date of taking until the following September
- 12 1. From September 1 until the first day of the next deer open
- 13 season for which the person holds a valid deer hunting license,
- 14 the person shall not possess more than twenty-five pounds of
- 15 deer venison. Any person may possess up to twenty-five pounds
- 16 of deer venison if the deer was obtained from a lawful source.
- 17 A permit to hold for a longer period may be granted by the
- 18 department.
- 19 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 22 This bill provides that a person having lawful possession
- 23 of game or fur-bearing animals or their pelts lawfully taken
- 24 by that person with a valid hunting or trapping license may
- 25 hold, possess, or store them from the date of taking. The bill
- 26 retains current law allowing any person to possess up to 25
- 27 pounds of deer venison if the deer was obtained from a lawful
- 28 source. The scheduled fine for a violation of the bill's
- 29 provisions is \$100.
- 30 Currently, a person having lawful possession of game or
- 31 fur-bearing animals or their pelts may hold them for not to
- 32 exceed 30 days after the close of the open season for such game
- 33 or furbearers. For deer venison, a person may hold any amount
- 34 of venison taken with a valid hunting license, from the date
- 35 of taking until the following September 1. From September 1

- 1 until the first day of the next deer hunting open season for
- 2 which the person holds a valid deer hunting license, the person
- 3 shall not hold more than 25 pounds of venison. The department
- 4 of natural resources may grant a permit allowing a person to
- 5 exceed these time restrictions.
