# House File 2296 - Introduced

## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act imposing a fee on certain fertilizers to be credited to
- 2 the water quality initiative fund.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 200.8, subsection 4, Code 2016, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 4. In addition to the fees imposed under subsection 1, a
- 4 groundwater protection fee and water quality initiative fee
- 5 shall be imposed upon nitrogen-based fertilizer. The  $\underline{Each}$  fee
- 6 shall be based upon the percentage of actual nitrogen contained
- 7 in the product. An eighty-two percent nitrogen solution shall
- 8 be taxed at a rate of seventy-five cents per ton. Other
- 9 nitrogen-based product formulations shall be taxed on the
- 10 percentage of actual nitrogen contained in the formulations
- 11 with the eighty-two percent nitrogen solution serving as the
- 12 base. The Each fee shall be paid to the secretary by each a
- 13 licensee registering to sell fertilizer to the secretary of
- 14 agriculture pursuant to section 200.5. The fees collected
- 15 by the secretary under this subsection shall be deposited
- 16 in the agriculture management account of credited to the
- 17 groundwater protection fund or the water quality initiative
- 18 fund in the manner described in section 200.9. The secretary
- 19 of agriculture shall adopt rules for the payment, filing, and
- 20 collection of groundwater protection the fees from paid by
- 21 licensees in conjunction with the collection of registration
- 22 and inspection fees paid by persons under subsection 1. The
- 23 secretary shall, by rule, allow an exemption to from the
- 24 payment of this fee the groundwater protection fee and water
- 25 quality initiative fee for fertilizers which contain trace
- 26 amounts of nitrogen.
- 27 Sec. 2. Section 200.9, Code 2016, is amended to read as
- 28 follows:
- 29 200.9 Fertilizer Use of fees.
- 30 1. Fees collected by the secretary for licenses and
- 31 inspection fees under sections 200.4 and 200.8, with
- 32 the exception of those fees collected for deposit in the
- 33 agriculture management account of the groundwater protection
- 34 fund, shall be deposited in the general fund of the state
- 35 and shall be subject to the requirements of section 8.60.

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- 1 Moneys deposited under this section to the general fund shall
- 2 be used only by the department secretary for the purpose of
- 3 inspection, sampling, analysis, preparation, and publishing
- 4 of reports and other expenses necessary for administration of
- 5 this chapter. The secretary may assign allocate moneys to
- 6 the Iowa agricultural experiment station for research, work
- 7 projects, and investigations as needed for the specific purpose
- 8 of improving the regulatory functions for enforcement of this
- 9 chapter.
- 10 2. Notwithstanding subsection 1, the groundwater protection
- 11 fee collected by the secretary pursuant to section 200.8,
- 12 subsection 4, shall be credited to the agriculture management
- 13 account of the groundwater protection fund created pursuant to
- 14 section 455E.11, subsection 2, paragraph "b". The water quality
- 15 initiative fee collected by the secretary pursuant to section
- 16 200.8, subsection 4, shall be credited to the water quality
- 17 initiative fund created pursuant to section 466B.45.
- 18 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 21 BILL. This bill provides that the groundwater protection
- 22 fee imposed on the sale of nitrogen-based fertilizer and
- 23 credited to the agriculture management account of the
- 24 groundwater protection fund would have a counterpart (water
- 25 quality initiative fee). The new fee would be imposed on the
- 26 same basis as the groundwater protection fee but would be
- 27 credited to the water quality initiative fund.
- 28 BACKGROUND FEES ON FERTILIZERS AND SOIL CONDITIONERS.
- 29 Each brand and grade of a commercial fertilizer or soil
- 30 conditioner must be registered with the department of
- 31 agriculture and land stewardship headed by the secretary of
- 32 agriculture (secretary) (Code section 200.5). A person who
- 33 is engaged in the manufacture or sale of fertilizers and soil
- 34 conditioners must obtain an annual license, register each
- 35 fertilizer or soil conditioner, and pay the associated fees

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1 which are collected by the secretary (Code sections 200.4(1) 2 and 200.8(1)) and deposited into the general fund of the state 3 but are reserved for use by the secretary in administering 4 and enforcing regulations applying to fertilizers and soil 5 conditioners (Code sections 8.60 and 200.9). In addition 6 to fees reserved for use by the secretary, a nitrogen-based 7 fertilizer fee (groundwater protection fee) is required to be 8 paid by each licensee registering to sell fertilizer in this 9 state. Those fees are credited to the agriculture management 10 account of the groundwater protection fund to support projects 11 and programs designed to protect groundwater resources (Code 12 sections 200.9 and 455E.11(2)(b)). 13 BACKGROUND - WATER QUALITY INITIATIVE FUND. The water 14 quality initiative fund is created in the state treasury under 15 the management of the soil conservation and water quality 16 division of the department (Code section 466B.45). 17 of the initiative fund is to support and administer projects to 18 reduce nutrients in surface waters from nonpoint sources in a 19 scientific, reasonable, and cost-effective manner (Code section 20 466B.42).
