A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to county medical examiner fees.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 Section 1. Section 331.802, subsection 2, paragraph b, Code 2 2016, is amended to read as follows:
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- 3 b. (1) Except as provided in section 218.64 or as otherwise
- 4 provided by law, for each preliminary investigation and the
- 5 preparation and submission of the required reports, the county
- 6 medical examiner and medical examiner investigator shall
- 7 receive from the county of appointment or the decedent's county
- 8 of residence a fee determined by the board of the county of
- 9 appointment plus the examiner's and investigator's actual
- 10 expenses.
- 11 (2) The fee and expenses paid by shall be submitted by the
- 12 county medical examiner and the medical examiner investigator
- 13 as a joint invoice to the county of appointment shall be
- 14 reimbursed to the county of appointment by the county of the
- 15 person's residence which may immediately pay the invoice. If
- 16 the county of appointment pays the invoice, the county of
- 17 appointment shall seek reimbursement from the decedent's county
- 18 of residence.
- 19 (3) If the county of appointment elects not to pay an
- 20 invoice under subparagraph (2), the county shall forward
- 21 the joint invoice to the decedent's county of residence for
- 22 payment to the county medical examiner and the medical examiner
- 23 investigator. If the county medical examiner and medical
- 24 examiner investigator do not receive payment from the county
- 25 of the decedent's residence within sixty days of receiving the
- 26 joint invoice, the county of appointment shall pay the invoice.
- 27 (4) However, if If the person's death is caused by a
- 28 defendant for whom a judgment of conviction and sentence
- 29 is rendered under section 707.2, 707.3, 707.4, 707.5, or
- 30 707.6A, the county of the person's residence or the county of
- 31 appointment, as applicable, may recover from the defendant the
- 32 fee and expenses.

33 EXPLANATION

The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

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1 This bill relates to county medical examiner fees. 2 Under current law, a county medical examiner conducting an 3 investigation and preparing reports related to a death that 4 affects the public interest is required to receive a fee and 5 reimbursement for expenses from the county appointing the 6 medical examiner, and the decedent's county of residence is 7 required to reimburse the county of appointment. Under the bill, either the county of appointment or the 9 decedent's county of residence is required to pay such fees 10 and expenses to the county medical examiner (examiner) and the 11 medical examiner investigator (investigator), based upon a 12 joint invoice. Under the bill, the examiner and investigator 13 are required to submit a joint invoice to the appointing 14 county. The appointing county may pay the joint invoice and 15 seek reimbursement from the decedent's county of residence 16 or the appointing county may forward the unpaid invoice to 17 the decedent's county of residence. If the decedent's county 18 of residence does not pay the invoice within 60 days, the 19 appointing county is required to pay the invoice. The bill maintains provisions allowing the decedent's county 21 of residence to recover the fee and expense costs paid from 22 individuals convicted of causing the death, and extends the 23 provision to also allow appointing counties to recover such 24 costs, if applicable.
