- 1 Section 1. Section 272.31, subsection 1, Code 2015, is
- 2 amended by adding the following new paragraph:
- 3 NEW PARAGRAPH. Oe. Successful completion of a certification
- 4 course for cardiopulmonary resuscitation and use of an
- 5 automated external defibrillator.
- 6 Sec. 2. Section 279.19B, subsection 1, Code 2015, is amended
- 7 by adding the following new paragraph:
- 8 NEW PARAGRAPH. Ob. An individual employed under paragraph
- 9 "a" shall possess a valid certificate of completion of a
- 10 nationally recognized course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- 11 and use of an automated external defibrillator.
- 12 Sec. 3. APPLICABILITY PROVISIONS. A person who possesses
- 13 a valid teaching license with a coaching endorsement or a
- 14 coaching authorization issued by the board of educational
- 15 examiners prior to July 1, 2015, shall have until July 1, 2016,
- 16 to meet the requirements of this Act.
- 17 EXPLANATION
- 18 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- 19 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 20 This bill provides that an applicant for a coaching
- 21 authorization or coaching endorsement issued by the board
- 22 of educational examiners and a person employed by a school
- 23 district as a coach must possess a valid certificate of
- 24 completion of a nationally recognized course in cardiopulmonary
- 25 resuscitation and use of an automated external defibrillator.
- 26 A person who possesses a valid teaching license with a
- 27 coaching endorsement or a coaching authorization issued by the
- 28 board prior to July 1, 2015, shall have until July 1, 2016, to
- 29 meet the requirements of the bill.
