## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act prohibiting a person or club holding a liquor control
- 2 license or retail wine or beer permit from selling or
- 3 possessing alcoholic liquor in powdered or crystalline form
- 4 for consumption and making penalties applicable.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

## S.F. 123

- 1 Section 1. Section 123.3, subsection 5, Code 2015, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 5. "Alcoholic liquor" or "intoxicating liquor" means the
- 4 varieties of liquor defined in subsections 3 and 43 which
- 5 contain more than five percent of alcohol by weight, beverages
- 6 made as described in subsection 7 which beverages contain more
- 7 than five percent of alcohol by weight or six and twenty-five
- 8 hundredths percent of alcohol by volume but which are not wine
- 9 as defined in subsection 47 or high alcoholic content beer as
- 10 defined in subsection 19, and every other liquid, or solid,
- 11 powder, or crystal, patented or not, containing spirits and
- 12 every beverage obtained by the process described in subsection
- 13 47 containing more than seventeen percent alcohol by weight or
- 14 twenty-one and twenty-five hundredths percent of alcohol by
- 15 volume, and susceptible of being consumed by a human being,
- 16 for beverage purposes. Alcohol manufactured in this state
- 17 for use as fuel pursuant to an experimental distilled spirits
- 18 plant permit or its equivalent issued by the federal bureau of
- 19 alcohol, tobacco and firearms is not an "alcoholic liquor".
- 20 Sec. 2. Section 123.49, subsection 2, Code 2015, is amended
- 21 by adding the following new paragraph:
- 22 NEW PARAGRAPH. m. Sell, give, possess, or otherwise supply
- 23 for human consumption powdered or crystalline alcoholic liquor.
- 24 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 27 This bill prohibits a person or club holding a liquor control
- 28 license or retail wine or beer permit, or their agents or
- 29 employees, from selling, giving, possessing, or supplying for
- 30 human consumption powdered or crystalline alcoholic liquor.
- 31 Pursuant to the provisions of Code section 123.50, a violation
- 32 of the provisions of the bill is a simple misdemeanor and
- 33 is grounds for the revocation or suspension of the person's
- 34 license or permit.
