A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act related to absentee ballot deadlines.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 53.17, subsection 2, Code 2015, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 2. In order for the ballot to be counted, the return
- 4 envelope must be received in the commissioner's office before
- 5 the polls close on election day or must be clearly postmarked
- 6 by an officially authorized postal service not later than the
- 7 day before the election and received by the commissioner not
- 8 later than noon on the Monday following the election or must
- 9 be clearly postmarked by received by the commissioner through
- 10 an officially authorized postal service not later than 5:00
- 11 p.m. on the day before after the election and received by the
- 12 commissioner not later than noon on the Monday following the
- 13 election.
- 14 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 17 This bill relates to absentee ballot deadlines. Under
- 18 current law, an absentee ballot received by a county
- 19 commissioner of elections is valid if it is received by the
- 20 commissioner before the polls close on election day or if it is
- 21 clearly postmarked by an officially authorized postal service
- 22 not later than the day before the election and is received by
- 23 the commissioner not later than noon on the Monday following
- 24 the election. Under the bill, for an absentee ballot to be
- 25 counted it must be received in the commissioner's office
- 26 before the polls close on election day or it must be clearly
- 27 postmarked not later than the day before the election and be
- 28 received by the commissioner by noon on the Monday following
- 29 the election or it must be received by the commissioner through
- 30 an officially authorized postal service not later than 5:00
- 31 p.m. on the day after the election.
