A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to required core curriculum and twenty-first
- 2 century learning skills addressed in rules adopted by the
- 3 state board of education.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

S.F. 431

- 1 Section 1. Section 256.7, subsection 26, paragraph a,
- 2 subparagraph (3), Code 2015, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 (3) The rules establishing a core curriculum shall address
- 4 the core content standards in subsection 28 and the skills and
- 5 knowledge students need to be successful in the twenty-first
- 6 century and shall address the curricular needs of students
- 7 in kindergarten through grade twelve in those areas. The
- 8 core curriculum shall include social studies and twenty-first
- 9 century learning skills which shall include but are not limited
- 10 to the following:
- 11 (a) Social studies, civic literacy, health literacy,
- 12 technology literacy, financial literacy, and employability
- 13 skills; and shall address the curricular needs of students in
- 14 kindergarten through grade twelve in those areas. The state
- 15 board shall further define the twenty-first century learning
- 16 skills components by rule.
- 17 (b) Music, visual art, drama and theater, and other fine
- 18 and applied arts. The department shall employ a consultant
- 19 to oversee the development of and compliance with the fine
- 20 arts core curriculum and to provide guidance for professional
- 21 development programs, strategies, and materials based on the
- 22 rules adopted by the state board pursuant to this subparagraph
- 23 division. This subparagraph division shall not be construed
- 24 to conflict with the provisions of section 256.11, subsection
- 25 3, 4, or 5, with regard to areas that are required to be
- 26 taught. The selection and administration of assessments of
- 27 music, visual art, drama and theater, or other fine arts
- 28 courses shall be determined locally by the school district or
- 29 accredited nonpublic school providing the educational program
- 30 in accordance with section 256.11. However, the department
- 31 may provide model assessments aligned with fine arts content
- 32 standards established by the state board.
- 33 Sec. 2. STATE MANDATE FUNDING SPECIFIED. In accordance with
- 34 Code section 25B.2, subsection 3, the state cost of requiring
- 35 compliance with any state mandate included in this Act shall

- 1 be paid by a school district from state school foundation aid
- 2 received by the school district under Code section 257.16.
- 3 This specification of the payment of the state cost shall be
- 4 deemed to meet all of the state funding-related requirements
- 5 of Code section 25B.2, subsection 3, and no additional state
- 6 funding shall be necessary for the full implementation of this
- 7 Act by and enforcement of this Act against all affected school
- 8 districts.
- 9 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 12 This bill modifies the required core curriculum and
- 13 twenty-first century learning skills and knowledge that the
- 14 state board of education is required to address in rule.
- 15 Currently, the required core curriculum includes English
- 16 or language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies.
- 17 The core curriculum must also include twenty-first century
- 18 learning skills, including but not limited to civic literacy,
- 19 health literacy, technology literacy, financial literacy, and
- 20 employability skills. The bill requires that the twenty-first
- 21 century learning skills also include music, visual art, drama
- 22 and theater, and other fine and applied arts.
- 23 The educational standards established under Code section
- 24 256.11 require accredited schools to include in grades 1-8
- 25 courses in music and visual art, and in grades 9-12, three
- 26 units in the fine arts which shall include at least two of
- 27 the following: dance, music, theater, and visual art. The
- 28 bill provides that nothing in the new provision expanding the
- 29 twenty-first century skills to include music, visual art,
- 30 drama and theater, and other fine and applied arts shall be
- 31 construed to conflict with the courses required under the
- 32 educational standards. Further, assessments for such courses
- 33 shall be locally determined, though the department of education
- 34 may provide model assessments aligned with fine arts content
- 35 standards established by the state board of education.

- 1 The bill also requires the department to employ a consultant
- 2 to oversee the development of and compliance with the fine
- 3 arts core curriculum and to provide guidance for professional
- 4 development programs, strategies, and materials based on
- 5 the rules relating to the fine arts core curriculum and the
- 6 twenty-first century fine arts learning skills adopted by the
- 7 state board.
- 8 The bill may include a state mandate as defined in Code
- 9 section 25B.3. The bill requires that the state cost of
- 10 any state mandate included in the bill be paid by a school
- 11 district from state school foundation aid received by the
- 12 school district under Code section 257.16. The specification
- 13 is deemed to constitute state compliance with any state mandate
- 14 funding-related requirements of Code section 25B.2. The
- 15 inclusion of this specification is intended to reinstate the
- 16 requirement of political subdivisions to comply with any state
- 17 mandates included in the bill.
