A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to appropriations to the justice system, and
2 including effective date provisions.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

DIVISION I

FY 2016-2017 APPROPRIATIONS AND STATUTORY CHANGES

Section 1. 2015 Iowa Acts, chapter 135, section 23, is amended to read as follows:

SEC. 23. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE.

1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of justice for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

a. For the general office of attorney general for salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes, including the prosecuting attorneys training program, matching funds for federal violence against women grant programs, victim assistance grants, office of drug control policy prosecuting attorney program, and odometer fraud enforcement, and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

As a condition of receiving the appropriation provided in this lettered paragraph, the department of justice shall maintain a record of the estimated time incurred representing each agency or department.

b. For victim assistance grants:

The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph shall be used to provide grants to care providers providing services to crime victims of domestic abuse or to crime victims of rape and sexual assault.

The balance of the victim compensation fund established in section 915.94 may be used to provide salary and support of not more than 24 29.00 FTEs and to provide maintenance for the

1 victim compensation functions of the department of justice.

2 The department of justice shall transfer at least \$150,000
3 from the victim compensation fund established in [section 915.94](#)
4 to the victim assistance grant program.

5 Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in this
6 paragraph "b" that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
7 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
8 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
9 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

11 provided in [section 13.34](#):

14 2. a. The department of justice, in submitting budget
15 estimates for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2017, pursuant
16 to [section 8.23](#), shall include a report of funding from sources
17 other than amounts appropriated directly from the general fund
18 of the state to the department of justice or to the office of
19 consumer advocate. These funding sources shall include but
20 are not limited to reimbursements from other state agencies,
21 commissions, boards, or similar entities, and reimbursements
22 from special funds or internal accounts within the department
23 of justice. The department of justice shall also report actual
24 reimbursements for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2015,
25 and actual and expected reimbursements for the fiscal year
26 commencing July 1, 2016.

27 b. The department of justice shall include the report
28 required under paragraph "a", as well as information regarding
29 any revisions occurring as a result of reimbursements actually
30 received or expected at a later date, in a report to the
31 co-chairpersons and ranking members of the joint appropriations
32 subcommittee on the justice system and the legislative services
33 agency. The department of justice shall submit the report on
34 or before January 15, 2017.

23 a lease or contractual agreement pursuant to [section 904.809](#)
24 with a private corporation for the use of building space for
25 the purpose of providing inmate employment without providing
26 that the terms of the lease or contract establish safeguards to
27 restrict, to the greatest extent feasible, access by inmates
28 working for the private corporation to personal identifying
29 information of citizens.

30 concerning any farmland under the control of the department
31 that is not subject to a rental agreement or contract as of
32 January 1, 2011, without prior legislative approval; and
33 shall further attempt to provide job opportunities at the
34 farms for inmates. The department shall attempt to provide
35 job opportunities at the farms for inmates by encouraging

1 labor-intensive farming or gardening where appropriate; using

2 sanctions.

3 3. Each judicial district department of correctional
4 services shall provide alternatives to prison consistent with
5 chapter 901B. The alternatives to prison shall ensure public
6 safety while providing maximum rehabilitation to the offender.
7 A judicial district department of correctional services may
8 also establish a day program.

9 4. The governor's office of drug control policy shall
10 consider federal grants made to the department of corrections
11 for the benefit of each of the eight judicial district

4 draw more than the amount appropriated in this subsection and
5 incur a negative cash balance as long as there are receivables
6 equal to or greater than the negative balance and the amount
7 appropriated in this subsection is not exceeded at the close
8 of the fiscal year.

9 2. The Iowa law enforcement academy may select at least
10 five automobiles of the department of public safety, division
11 of state patrol, prior to turning over the automobiles to
12 the department of administrative services to be disposed
13 of by public auction, and the Iowa law enforcement academy

1 The bill appropriates moneys from the wireless E911
2 emergency communications fund to the department of homeland
3 security and emergency management for fiscal year 2016-2017.

4 The bill makes additional appropriations to the department
5 of public safety and the department of corrections in division
6 II for department-wide duties.

7 The bill amends Code section 915.94 to allow funds in the
8 victim compensation fund to be used to reimburse the Iowa law
9 enforcement academy for domestic abuse and human trafficking
10 training.

11 The bill amends Code section 915.95 to allow funds in the
12 human trafficking victim fund to be used to reimburse the
13 Iowa law enforcement academy for domestic abuse and human
14 trafficking training.

15 The bill extends the increase to the standing appropriations
16 from the consumer education and litigation fund in Code
17 section 714.16C. The annual appropriations are increased
