A BILL FOR

1 An Act making appropriations to the department of cultural
2 affairs, the economic development authority, the Iowa
3 finance authority, the public employment relations board,
4 the department of workforce development, and the state board
5 of regents and certain regents institutions.
6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

2 FY 2016-2017
3 APPROPRIATIONS

4 Section 1. 2015 Iowa Acts, chapter 136, section 17, is
5 amended to read as follows:

6 SEC. 17. DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS.

7 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
8 to the department of cultural affairs for the fiscal year
9 beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017, the following
10 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
11 purposes designated:

7 1. APPROPRIATION

8 a. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
9 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year
10 beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017, the following
11 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
12 purposes designated in this subsection, and for not more than
13 the following full-time equivalent positions:

17 b. (1) For salaries, support, miscellaneous purposes,
18 programs, marketing, and the maintenance of an administration
19 division, a business development division, a community

23 this section are funded, in whole or in part, by the moneys
24 appropriated under this subsection or by other moneys received
25 by the authority, including certain federal moneys.

26 (3) For business development operations and programs,
27 international trade, export assistance, workforce recruitment,
28 and the partner state program.

29 (4) For transfer to a fund created pursuant to section
30 15.313 for purposes of financing strategic infrastructure
31 projects.

32 (5) For community economic development programs, tourism
33 operations, community assistance, plans for Iowa green corps
34 and summer youth programs, the mainstreet and rural mainstreet
35 programs, the school-to-career program, the community

1 development block grant, and housing and shelter-related
2 programs.

3 (6) For achieving the goals and accountability, and
4 fulfilling the requirements and duties required under this Act.

5 c. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in
6 this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
7 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
8 available for expenditure for the purposes designated in this
9 subsection until the close of the succeeding fiscal year.

10 2. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE RESTRICTIONS

11 a. A business creating jobs through moneys appropriated in
12 subsection 1 shall be subject to contract provisions requiring
13 new and retained jobs to be filled by individuals who are
14 citizens of the United States who reside within the United
15 States or any person authorized to work in the United States
16 pursuant to federal law, including legal resident aliens in the
17 United States.

18 b. Any vendor who receives moneys appropriated in
19 subsection 1 shall adhere to such contract provisions and
20 provide periodic assurances as the state shall require that the
21 jobs are filled solely by citizens of the United States who
22 reside within the United States or any person authorized to
23 work in the United States pursuant to federal law, including
24 legal resident aliens in the United States.

25 c. A business that receives financial assistance from
26 the authority from moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall
27 only employ individuals legally authorized to work in this
28 state. In addition to all other applicable penalties provided
29 by current law, all or a portion of the assistance received
30 by a business which is found to knowingly employ individuals
31 not legally authorized to work in this state is subject to
32 recapture by the authority.

33 3. USES OF APPROPRIATIONS

34 a. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the
35 authority may provide financial assistance in the form of a

1 grant to a community economic development entity for conducting
2 a local workforce recruitment effort designed to recruit former
3 citizens of the state and former students at colleges and
4 universities in the state to meet the needs of local employers.

5 b. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the
6 authority may provide financial assistance to early stage
7 industry companies being established by women entrepreneurs.

8 c. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the
9 authority may provide financial assistance in the form of
10 grants, loans, or forgivable loans for advanced research and
11 commercialization projects involving value-added agriculture,
12 advanced technology, or biotechnology.

13 d. The authority shall not use any moneys appropriated in
14 subsection 1 for purposes of providing financial assistance for
15 the Iowa green streets pilot project or for any other program
16 or project that involves the installation of geothermal systems
17 for melting snow and ice from streets or sidewalks.

18 4. WORLD FOOD PRIZE

19 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
20 to the economic development authority for the fiscal year
21 beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017, the following
22 amount for the world food prize and in lieu of the standing
23 appropriation in [section 15.368, subsection 1](#):

31 service for purposes of the Iowa state commission grant
32 program, the Iowa's promise and Iowa mentoring partnership
33 programs, and for not more than the following full-time
34 equivalent positions:

3 Of the moneys appropriated in this subsection, the authority
4 shall allocate ~~\$37,500~~ \$75,000 for purposes of the Iowa state

7 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this
8 subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close

22 a. There is appropriated from the ~~general fund of the state~~

24 8.75 to the Iowa economic development authority for the fiscal
25 year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017, the
26 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the
27 purposes designated:

29 fields of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics
30 with eligible Iowa employers as provided in section 15.411,
31 subsection 3, paragraph "c":

20 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes
21 designated:

 9 in cases where it would impose an undue hardship or be unjust
 10 under the circumstances. The moneys generated by the filing
 11 fee allowed under this subsection are appropriated to the
 12 department of workforce development to be used for purposes of
 13 administering the division of workers' compensation.

 14 for directed contract research or for nondirected research
 15 shall be \$1 for each \$3 of state funds. The match required
 16 for other businesses for directed contract research or
 17 for nondirected research shall be \$1 for each \$1 of state
 18 funds. The match required of industrial foundations or trade
 19 associations shall be \$1 for each \$1 of state funds.

20 Iowa state university of science and technology shall
 21 report annually to the joint appropriations subcommittee on
