A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations involving state
2 government entities involved with agriculture, natural
3 resources, and environmental protection, and including
4 effective date provisions.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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DIVISION I
DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP
GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR FY 2016-2017

Section 1. 2015 Iowa Acts, chapter 132, section 24, is amended to read as follows:

SEC. 24. GENERAL FUND — DEPARTMENT.

1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017, the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

For purposes of supporting the department, including its divisions, for administration, regulation, and programs; for salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes; and for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

2. Of the amount appropriated in subsection 1, the following amount is transferred to Iowa state university of science and technology, to be used for the university's midwest grape and wine industry institute:

3. The department shall submit a report each quarter of the fiscal year to the legislative services agency, the department of management, the members of the joint appropriations subcommittee on agriculture and natural resources, and the chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and house committees on appropriations. The report shall describe in detail the expenditure of moneys appropriated in this section to support the department's administration, regulation, and programs.

22 INSPECTION.

23 1. There is appropriated from the renewable fuel
24 infrastructure fund created in [section 159A.16](#) to the
25 department of agriculture and land stewardship for the fiscal
26 year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017, the
27 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
28 used for the purposes designated:

29 For purposes of the inspection of motor fuel, including	
30 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

24 Sec. 5. 2015 Iowa Acts, chapter 132, section 28, is amended
25 to read as follows:

26 SEC. 28. LOCAL FOOD AND FARM PROGRAM.

27 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
28 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
29 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017,
30 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
31 used for the purposes designated:

32 For purposes of supporting the local food and farm program
33 pursuant to [chapter 267A](#):

1 2. The department shall enter into a cost-sharing agreement
2 with Iowa state university of science and technology to support
3 the local food and farm program coordinator position as part of
4 the university's cooperative extension service in agriculture

6 3. Notwithstanding **section 8.33**, moneys appropriated in
7 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
8 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
9 available to be used for the purposes designated until the
10 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

11 Sec. 6. 2015 Iowa Acts, chapter 132, section 29, is amended
12 to read as follows:

13 SEC. 29. AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION.

14 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
15 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
16 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017,
17 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
18 used for the purposes designated:

19 For purposes of allocating moneys to an Iowa association
20 affiliated with a national organization which promotes
21 agricultural education providing for future farmers:

24 2. Notwithstanding **section 8.33**, moneys appropriated for
25 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, in this section that
26 remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close of the fiscal
27 year shall not revert but shall remain available to be used
28 for the purposes designated until the close of the succeeding
29 fiscal year.

30 Sec. 7. 2015 Iowa Acts, chapter 132, section 30, is amended
31 to read as follows:

32 SEC. 30. FARMERS WITH DISABILITIES PROGRAM.

33 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
34 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
35 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017,

1 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
2 used for the purposes designated:

3 For purposes of supporting a program for farmers with
4 disabilities:

5	\$	65,000

7 2. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used for
8 the public purpose of providing a grant to a national nonprofit
9 organization with over 80 years of experience in assisting
10 children and adults with disabilities and special needs. The
11 moneys shall be used to support a nationally recognized program
12 that began in 1986 and has been replicated in at least 30 other
13 states, but which is not available through any other entity
14 in this state, and that provides assistance to farmers with
15 disabilities in all 99 counties to allow the farmers to remain
16 in their own homes and be gainfully engaged in farming through
17 provision of agricultural worksite and home modification
18 consultations, peer support services, services to families,
19 information and referral, and equipment loan services.

20 3. Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), moneys appropriated in
21 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the
22 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain
23 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the
24 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

27 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP

28 WATER QUALITY INITIATIVE

29 APPROPRIATIONS FOR FY 2016-2017

30 Sec. 8. 2015 Iowa Acts, chapter 132, section 31, is amended
31 to read as follows:

32 SEC. 31. WATER QUALITY INITIATIVE — GENERAL.

33 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
34 to the department of agriculture and land stewardship for the
35 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017,

1 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
2 used for the purposes designated:

3 For deposit in the water quality initiative fund created in
4 section 466B.45, for purposes of supporting the water quality
5 initiative administered by the division of soil conservation
6 and water quality as provided in [section 466B.42](#), including
7 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:
8 \$ ~~2,200,000~~
9 4,400,000

10 2. a. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall be
11 used to support projects in subwatersheds as designated by the
12 division that are part of high-priority watersheds identified
13 by the water resources coordinating council established
14 pursuant to [section 466B.3](#).

15 b. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used to
16 support projects in watersheds generally, including regional
17 watersheds, as designated by the division and high-priority
18 watersheds identified by the water resources coordinating
19 council established pursuant to [section 466B.3](#).

20 3. In supporting projects in subwatersheds and watersheds
21 as provided in subsection 2, all of the following shall apply:

22 a. The demonstration projects shall utilize water quality
23 practices as described in the latest revision of the document
24 entitled "Iowa Nutrient Reduction Strategy" initially presented
25 in November 2012 by the department of agriculture and land
26 stewardship, the department of natural resources, and Iowa
27 state university of science and technology.

28 b. The division shall implement demonstration projects as
29 provided in paragraph "a" by providing for participation by
30 persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land used in
31 farming. To every extent practical, the division shall provide
32 for collaborative participation by such persons who hold a
33 legal interest in agricultural land located within the same
34 subwatershed.

35 c. The division shall implement a demonstration project on

1 a cost-share basis as determined by the division. However, the
2 state's share of the amount shall not exceed 50 percent of the
3 estimated cost of establishing the practice as determined by
4 the division or 50 percent of the actual cost of establishing
5 the practice, whichever is less.

6 d. The demonstration projects shall be used to educate other
7 persons about the feasibility and value of establishing similar
8 water quality practices. The division shall promote field day
9 events for purposes of allowing interested persons to establish
10 water quality practices on their agricultural land.

11 e. The division shall conduct water quality evaluations
12 within supported subwatersheds. Within a reasonable period
13 after accumulating information from such evaluations, the
14 division shall create an aggregated database of water quality
15 practices. Any information identifying a person holding a
16 legal interest in agricultural land or specific agricultural
17 land shall be a confidential record under [section 22.7](#).

18 4. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used
19 to support education and outreach in a manner that encourages
20 persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land used for
21 farming to implement water quality practices, including the
22 establishment of such practices in watersheds generally, and
23 not limited to subwatersheds or high-priority watersheds.

24 5. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 may be used
25 to contract with persons to coordinate the implementation of
26 efforts provided in this section.

27 6. The moneys appropriated in subsection 1 may be used by
28 the department to support urban soil and water conservation
29 efforts, which may include but are not limited to management
30 practices related to bioretention, landscaping, the use of
31 permeable or pervious pavement, and soil quality restoration.
32 The moneys shall be allocated on a cost-share basis as provided
33 in [chapter 161A](#).

34 7. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
35 contrary, the department may use moneys appropriated in

1 subsection 1 to carry out the provisions of this section on a
2 cost-share basis in combination with other moneys available to
3 the department from a state or federal source.

4 8. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in
5 this section may be used to pay for the costs of administering
6 and implementing the water quality initiative by the
7 department's division of soil conservation and water quality as
8 provided in [section 466B.42](#) and this section.

9 DIVISION III

10 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

11 GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR FY 2016-2017

12 Sec. 9. 2015 Iowa Acts, chapter 132, section 32, is amended
13 to read as follows:

14 SEC. 32. GENERAL FUND — DEPARTMENT.

15 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
16 to the department of natural resources for the fiscal year
17 beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017, the following
18 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the
19 purposes designated:

20	For purposes of supporting the department, including its	
21	divisions, for administration, regulation, and programs; for	
22	salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes; and	
23	for not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

27 2. Of the number of full-time equivalent positions
28 authorized to the department pursuant to subsection 1, 50.00
29 full-time equivalent positions shall be allocated by the

31 maintenance, upkeep, and sanitary services at state parks.
32 This subsection shall not impact park ranger or park manager
33 positions within the department.

34 3. The department shall submit a report each quarter of the
35 fiscal year to the legislative services agency, the department

1 of management, the members of the joint appropriations
2 subcommittee on agriculture and natural resources, and the
3 chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and house
4 committees on appropriations. The report shall describe in
5 detail the expenditure of moneys appropriated under this
6 section to support the department's administration, regulation,
7 and programs.

8 Sec. 10. 2015 Iowa Acts, chapter 132, section 33, is amended
9 to read as follows:

10 SEC. 33. STATE FISH AND GAME PROTECTION FUND — REGULATION
11 AND ADVANCEMENT OF OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES.

12 1. There is appropriated from the state fish and game
13 protection fund to the department of natural resources for the
14 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017,
15 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
16 used for the purposes designated:

17 For purposes of supporting the regulation or advancement of
18 hunting, fishing, or trapping, or the protection, propagation,
19 restoration, management, or harvest of fish or wildlife,
20 including for administration, regulation, law enforcement, and
21 programs; and for salaries, support, maintenance, equipment,
22 and miscellaneous purposes:

25 2. Notwithstanding [section 455A.10](#), the department may use
26 the unappropriated balance remaining in the state fish and game
27 protection fund to provide for the funding of health and life
28 insurance premium payments from unused sick leave balances of
29 conservation peace officers employed in a protection occupation
30 who retire, pursuant to [section 97B.49B](#).

31 3. Notwithstanding [section 455A.10](#), the department of
32 natural resources may use the unappropriated balance remaining
33 in the state fish and game protection fund for the fiscal
34 year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30, 2017, as is
35 necessary to fund salary adjustments for departmental employees

1 for which the general assembly has made an operating budget
2 appropriation in subsection 1.

3 Sec. 11. 2015 Iowa Acts, chapter 132, section 34, is amended
4 to read as follows:

5 SEC. 34. GROUNDWATER PROTECTION FUND — WATER QUALITY.

6 There is appropriated from the groundwater protection fund
7 created in section 455E.11 to the department of natural
8 resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016,
9 and ending June 30, 2017, from those moneys which are not
10 allocated pursuant to that section, the following amount, or
11 so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes
12 designated:

26 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending June 30,

31 medicine for the operation of the veterinary diagnostic
32 laboratory and for not more than the following full-time
33 equivalent positions:

2 2. a. Iowa state university of science and technology
3 shall not reduce the amount that it allocates to support the
4 college of veterinary medicine from any other source due to the
5 appropriation made in this section.

7 support the college of veterinary medicine, if the same
8 percentage of reduction imposed on the college of veterinary
9 medicine is also imposed on all of Iowa state university of
10 science and technology's budget units.

11 3. If by June 30, 2017, Iowa state university of science and
12 technology fails to allocate the moneys appropriated in this
13 section to the college of veterinary medicine in accordance
14 with this section, the moneys appropriated in this section for

2 Sec. 18. 2015 Iowa Acts, chapter 132, section 41, is amended
3 to read as follows:

4 SEC. 41. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP.

5 There is appropriated from the environment first fund created
6 in [section 8.57A](#) to the department of agriculture and land
7 stewardship for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and
8 ending June 30, 2017, the following amounts, or so much thereof
9 as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

10 1. CONSERVATION RESERVE ENHANCEMENT PROGRAM (CREP)

11 a. For the conservation reserve enhancement program to
12 restore and construct wetlands for the purposes of intercepting
13 tile line runoff, reducing nutrient loss, improving water
14 quality, and enhancing agricultural production practices:

29 multiobjective resource protections for flood control, water
30 quality, erosion control, and natural resource conservation:

34 in paragraph "a" may be used for costs of administration and

1 3. FARM MANAGEMENT DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM

3 management demonstration program to demonstrate the
4 effectiveness and adaptability of emerging practices in
5 agronomy that protect water resources and provide other

10 in paragraph "a" may be used for costs of administration and

14 soybean growers to provide for an agriculture and environment
15 performance program in order to carry out the purposes of this
16 subsection as specified in paragraph "a".

22 b. Of the moneys appropriated in paragraph "a", the
23 department shall support field staff providing technical
24 assistance by allocating fifty percent of the amount that the

27 appropriated in paragraph "a", the department shall allocate an

17 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
18 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

19 GENERAL. This bill relates to agriculture and natural
20 resources by making appropriations for the fiscal year
21 2016-2017 to support related entities, including the department
22 of agriculture and land stewardship (DALs), the department of
23 natural resources (DNR), and Iowa state university of science
24 and technology (ISU).

25 The bill primarily appropriates moneys to DALs and DNR.
26 The appropriations are made to support those departments for
27 administration, regulation, and support of programs. The bill
28 requires the departments to submit quarterly reports to the
29 general assembly and department of management regarding the
30 expenditure of appropriated moneys. The bill also provides
31 moneys to support specific programs or projects administered by
32 those departments. The bill appropriates moneys from a number
33 of sources, including the general fund of the state, the state
34 fish and game protection fund, the groundwater protection fund
35 (Code section 455E.11), and the environment first fund (Code

1 section 8.57A). The bill is organized into divisions.

2 DALS — GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS. For DALS, moneys are
3 appropriated from the general fund in order to support its
4 administrative divisions. Moneys are transferred to ISU to
5 support its midwest grape and wine institute.

6 Moneys are appropriated from a number of other sources to
7 DALS in order to support designated purposes, including moneys
8 derived from unclaimed winnings from horse and dog races, for
9 administration and enforcement of racing regulations (Code
10 section 99D.22); and moneys credited to the renewable fuel
11 infrastructure fund (Code section 159A.16), for purposes of
12 motor fuel inspection and auditing biofuel processing and
13 production (Code chapter 214A).

14 Moneys are appropriated from the general fund of the state
15 to DALS in order to support specific purposes including
16 milk inspection (Code section 192.109), the local food and
17 farm program (Code chapter 267A), an agricultural education
18 organization, and assistance to farmers with disabilities.

19 DALS — GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS — WATER QUALITY
20 INITIATIVE. Moneys are appropriated from the general fund of
21 the state to DALS for deposit in the water quality initiative
22 fund (Code section 466B.45), including to support high-priority
23 watershed projects.

24 DNR — GENERAL FUND AND OTHER MAJOR FUNDS APPROPRIATIONS.
25 Moneys are appropriated from a number of funds to DNR in order
26 to support its administrative divisions involving natural
27 resources and environmental protection, including from the
28 general fund of the state, the state fish and game protection
29 fund, and the groundwater protection fund.

30 Moneys are appropriated from a number of sources to support
31 designated purposes, including moneys deposited in the
32 special snowmobile fund (Code section 321G.7) to provide for
33 administering and enforcing the state snowmobile programs; and
34 moneys deposited in the unassigned revenue fund for purposes
35 of paying for administration of the department's underground

1 storage tanks section.

2 Moneys are appropriated from the general fund of the state to
3 DNR in order to support specific purposes including floodplain
4 management and dam safety and forestry health management
5 programs.

6 ISU — SPECIAL GENERAL FUND AND OTHER FUNDS APPROPRIATIONS.
7 Moneys are appropriated from the general fund of the state
8 to ISU to support the operation of its veterinary diagnostic
9 laboratory. Moneys are also appropriated to ISU to support the
10 Iowa nutrient research center (Code section 466B.47).

11 DALS AND DNR — ENVIRONMENT FIRST FUND APPROPRIATIONS.
12 Moneys are appropriated from the environment first fund (Code
13 section 8.57A) to support a number of programs administered by
14 DALS and DNR. For DALS, the moneys are appropriated to support
15 programs involving soil and water conservation, watershed
16 protection and nutrient management, and the loess hills
17 development and conservation fund (Code section 161D.2); and
18 for DNR, moneys are appropriated to support programs involving
19 state parks, geographic information system data, water quality,
20 public water supplies, regulation of animal feeding operations,
21 air quality, and a geological and water survey.

22 REAP — ENVIRONMENT FIRST FUND IN LIEU OF GENERAL FUND
23 APPROPRIATION. Moneys are appropriated from the environment
24 first fund (Code section 8.57A) to the Iowa resources
25 enhancement and protection fund in lieu of the standing limited
26 appropriation of \$20 million (Code section 455A.18).

27 STATUTORY CHANGES — DNR STUDIES. DNR must conduct a study
28 of the long-term viability of maintaining the state forest
29 nurseries. It must also conduct a study of the feasibility of
30 installing electronic systems to allow it to collect user fees
31 from individuals to enter into state lands. As part of that
32 study, DNR must solicit input from state park users and state
33 park supporter groups regarding their willingness to provide
34 additional funding for the maintenance and operations of state
35 parks. The provisions take effect upon enactment.

1 STATUTORY CHANGES — ANIMAL AGRICULTURE — CIVIL PENALTIES.

2 Civil penalties that are assessed and collected by DNR are
3 to be credited to an Iowa nutrient research fund to support
4 the Iowa nutrient research center. Moneys from those civil
5 penalties are currently credited to the watershed improvement
6 fund to support the watershed improvement review board (Code
7 chapter 466A). The provisions take effect upon enactment.

8 STATUTORY CHANGES — WATERSHED IMPROVEMENT REVIEW BOARD
9 SUSPENSION OF NEW ACTIVITIES. The watershed improvement review
10 board and DALs' division of soil conservation and water quality
11 cannot establish any new activity, including a project, under
12 Code chapter 466A. The board and division must continue to
13 administer ongoing activities. The provisions take effect upon
14 enactment.

15 STATUTORY CHANGES — NUTRIENT REDUCTION PILOT PROJECT
16 — REVERSE AUCTION. DALs is required to establish a pilot
17 project to determine the feasibility and cost-effectiveness
18 of conducting reverse auctions when allocating financial
19 assistance to persons seeking to establish practices to reduce
20 the transport of nutrients from nonpoint sources.
