

**House File 2122 - Introduced**

**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to the retention of licensing fees for purposes  
2 related to the duties of the board of educational examiners.  
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 272.10, subsections 2 and 3, Code 2018,  
2 are amended to read as follows:

3 2. ~~Licensing fees are payable to the treasurer of state and~~  
4 ~~shall be deposited with the executive director of the board.~~  
5 ~~The executive director shall deposit twenty five percent of~~  
6 ~~the fees collected annually with the treasurer of state and~~  
7 ~~the fees shall be credited to the general fund of the state.~~  
8 ~~The remaining licensing fees collected during the fiscal year~~  
9 ~~under this chapter shall be retained by and are appropriated~~  
10 ~~to the board for the purposes related to the board's duties.~~  
11 Notwithstanding [section 8.33](#), licensing fees retained by and  
12 appropriated to the board pursuant to [this section](#) that remain  
13 unencumbered or unobligated at the close of the fiscal year  
14 shall not revert but shall remain available for expenditure for  
15 the activities of the board as provided in [this chapter](#) until  
16 the close of the succeeding fiscal year.

17 3. The executive director shall keep an accurate and  
18 detailed account of fees received, ~~including fees paid to the~~  
19 ~~treasurer of state and fees retained by the board.~~

20 EXPLANATION

21 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with  
22 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

23 This bill provides that the licensing fees established by  
24 the board of educational examiners and collected under Code  
25 chapter 272 shall be retained by the board.

26 The bill strikes language that requires the board's  
27 executive director to deposit 25 percent of the fees collected  
28 annually with the treasurer to be credited to the general fund  
29 of the state.
