- 1 Section 1. Section 282.1, subsection 2, Code 2018, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 2. For purposes of this section, "resident" means a child 4 who is meets either of the following requirements:
- \underline{a} . Is physically present in a district, whose residence has
- 6 not been established in another district by operation of law,
- 7 and who meets any of the following conditions:
- 8 $\frac{a}{a}$ (1) Is in the district for the purpose of making a home
- 9 and not solely for school purposes.
- 10 b. (2) Meets the definitional requirements of the term
- 11 "homeless individual" under 42 U.S.C. §11302(a) and (c).
- 12 e_{τ} (3) Lives in a juvenile detention center or residential
- 13 facility in the district.
- 14 b. Is domiciled with the child's parent or guardian who is
- 15 on active duty in the military service of the United States and
- 16 is stationed and domiciled at a federal military installation
- 17 located in an out-of-state county that is contiguous to a
- 18 county in this state with a population in excess of one hundred
- 19 fifty thousand. The parent or guardian of a child who meets
- 20 the requirements of this paragraph may enroll the child in a
- 21 school district in this state that is located in the county
- 22 contiguous to the military installation. Notwithstanding
- 23 section 285.1 relating to transportation of resident pupils,
- 24 the parent or guardian is responsible for transporting the
- 25 child without reimbursement to and from a point on a regular
- 26 school bus route of the district of enrollment.
- 27 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- 29 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 30 This bill provides that a child who lives with the child's
- 31 parent or quardian who is on active duty in the military
- 32 service of the United States and is stationed and domiciled at
- 33 certain federal military installations is considered a resident
- 34 of the state and may enroll in a school district in this state,
- 35 free of tuition, that is located in the county contiguous

- 1 to the military installation. The parent or guardian is
- 2 responsible for transporting the child without reimbursement to
- 3 and from a point on a regular school bus route of the district
- 4 of enrollment.
