A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act prohibiting persons from intentionally blocking or
- organizing others to block the movement of traffic on
- 3 certain highways, and providing penalties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

H.F. 226

- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 318.6A Intentional blocking of
 2 traffic prohibited organizing others to block prohibited —
 3 penalties exceptions.
- 1. A person shall not loiter on the traveled portion of
- 5 the right-of-way of a highway with a speed limit of fifty-five
- 6 miles per hour or more with the intention of blocking the
- 7 normal and reasonable movement of motor vehicle traffic.
- 8 A person who violates this subsection commits a serious
- 9 misdemeanor punishable by a fine in the amount of one thousand
- 10 dollars, which shall be in lieu of any other punishment imposed
- ll under this chapter.
- 12 2. A person shall not perform an activity related to
- 13 organizing, scheduling, or otherwise assembling a group of
- 14 persons if the person knows or should reasonably know the group
- 15 of persons will violate subsection 1. A person who violates
- 16 this subsection commits an aggravated misdemeanor, which shall
- 17 be in lieu of any other punishment imposed under this chapter.
- 18 3. This section shall not apply to a person who blocks
- 19 the movement of traffic for the purpose of obtaining law
- 20 enforcement, medical, or mechanical assistance. This section
- 21 shall also not apply to a person who is a peace officer or
- 22 emergency responder, who is engaged in highway construction
- 23 or maintenance, or who is an employee of a federal, state, or
- 24 local government, if the person is acting within the scope of
- 25 the person's duties.
- 26 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 29 Under current law, a person is prohibited from placing an
- 30 obstruction in the highway right-of-way, including the traveled
- 31 portion of the roadway. A person who violates this provision
- 32 is subject to an injunction and guilty of creating a public
- 33 nuisance, an aggravated misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment
- 34 not to exceed two years and a fine of at least \$625 but not to
- 35 exceed \$6,250. Any obstruction is subject to removal.

H.F. 226

- 1 This bill prohibits a person from loitering on the traveled
- 2 portion of the right-of-way of a highway with a speed limit
- 3 of 55 miles per hour or more with the intention of blocking
- 4 the normal and reasonable movement of motor vehicle traffic.
- 5 A person who violates this provision commits a serious
- 6 misdemeanor punishable by a fine of \$1,000, which is in lieu of
- 7 any other punishment imposed under Code chapter 318.
- 8 The bill also prohibits a person from performing an activity
- 9 related to organizing, scheduling, or otherwise assembling a
- 10 group of persons if the person knows or should reasonably know
- 11 the group of persons will loiter on the traveled portion of
- 12 the right-of-way of a highway with a speed limit of 55 miles
- 13 per hour or more with the intention of blocking the normal and
- 14 reasonable movement of motor vehicle traffic. A person who
- 15 violates this provision commits an aggravated misdemeanor,
- 16 which is in lieu of any other punishment imposed under Code
- 17 chapter 318.
- 18 The bill does not apply to a person who blocks the movement
- 19 of traffic for the purpose of obtaining law enforcement,
- 20 medical, or mechanical assistance. In addition, the
- 21 bill does not apply to a person who is a peace officer or
- 22 emergency responder, who is engaged in highway construction
- 23 or maintenance, or who is an employee of a federal, state, or
- 24 local government, if the person is acting within the scope of
- 25 the person's duties.
