## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act expanding the statewide preschool program to include
- 2 five-year-old children and including applicability
- 3 provisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 135.173A, subsection 4, paragraph p,
- 2 Code 2018, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 p. One person who is part of a local program implementing
- 4 the statewide preschool program for four-year-old young
- 5 children under chapter 256C.
- 6 Sec. 2. Section 135.173A, subsection 6, paragraph f, Code
- 7 2018, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 f. Make recommendations for improving collaborations
- 9 between the child care programs involving the department of
- 10 human services and programs supporting the education and
- 11 development of young children including but not limited to the
- 12 federal head start program; the statewide preschool program
- 13 for four-year-old young children; and the early childhood,
- 14 at-risk, and other early education programs administered by the
- 15 department of education.
- 16 Sec. 3. Section 256C.1, subsections 1 and 4, Code 2018, are
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 1. "Approved local program" means a school district's
- 19 program for four-year-old young children approved by the
- 20 department of education to provide high quality preschool
- 21 instruction.
- 22 4. "Preschool program" means the statewide preschool program
- 23 for four-year-old young children created in accordance with
- 24 this chapter.
- Sec. 4. Section 256C.1, Code 2018, is amended by adding the
- 26 following new subsection:
- NEW SUBSECTION. 7. "Young children" means children who are
- 28 four years of age or who are five years of age.
- 29 Sec. 5. Section 256C.2, Code 2018, is amended to read as
- 30 follows:
- 31 256C.2 Statewide preschool program for four-year-old young
- 32 children purpose.
- 33 1. A statewide preschool program for four-year-old young
- 34 children is established. The purpose of the preschool program
- 35 is to provide an opportunity for all young children in the

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- 1 state to enter school ready to learn by expanding voluntary
- 2 access to quality preschool curricula for all children who are
- 3 four years old or who are five years old.
- 4 2. The state board shall adopt rules in accordance with
- 5 chapter 17A as necessary to implement the preschool program as
- 6 provided in this chapter.
- 7 Sec. 6. Section 256C.3, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code
- 8 2018, is amended to read as follows:
- 9 a. A child who is a resident of Iowa and is four years of
- 10 age on or before September 15 of a school year or who is five
- 11 years of age on or before September 15 of a school year shall be
- 12 eligible to enroll in the preschool program under this chapter.
- 13 If such a child is enrolled under this chapter, the child shall
- 14 be considered to be of compulsory attendance age as provided in
- 15 section 299.1A, subsection 3.
- 16 Sec. 7. Section 256C.3, subsection 4, paragraph b, Code
- 17 2018, is amended to read as follows:
- 18 b. Subject to implementation of chapter 28E agreements
- 19 between a school district and community-based providers of
- 20 services to four-year-old children and five-year-old children,
- 21 a four-year-old child or eligible five-year-old child who is
- 22 enrolled in a child care center or child development home
- 23 licensed or registered under chapter 237A, or in an existing
- 24 public or private preschool program, shall be eligible for
- 25 services provided by the school district's local preschool
- 26 program.
- 27 Sec. 8. Section 256C.4, subsection 2, Code 2018, is amended
- 28 to read as follows:
- 29 2. Eligible student enrollment.
- 30 a. To be included as an eligible student in the enrollment
- 31 count of the preschool programming provided by a school
- 32 district approved to participate in the preschool program, a
- 33 child must be four years of age by September 15 or be five
- 34 years of age by September 15 in the base year and attending the
- 35 school district's approved local program.

- 1 b. The enrollment count of eligible students shall not
- 2 include a child who is included in the enrollment count
- 3 determined under section 257.6 or a child who is served by
- 4 a program already receiving state or federal funds for the
- 5 purpose of the provision of four-year-old or five-year-old
- 6 preschool programming while the child is being served by the
- 7 program. Such preschool programming includes but is not
- 8 limited to child development assistance programs provided under
- 9 chapter 256A, special education programs provided under section
- 10 256B.9, school ready children grant programs and other programs
- 11 provided under chapter 256I, and federal head start programs
- 12 and the services funded by Tit. I of the federal Elementary and
- 13 Secondary Education Act of 1965.
- 14 Sec. 9. Section 298A.2, subsection 2, paragraph a,
- 15 subparagraph (1), Code 2018, is amended to read as follows:
- 16 (1) An approved local program under the statewide preschool
- 17 program for four-year-old young children under chapter 256C.
- 18 Sec. 10. Section 298A.2, subsection 2, paragraph c,
- 19 subparagraph (1), Code 2018, is amended to read as follows:
- 20 (1) Start-up costs for an approved local program under the
- 21 statewide preschool program for four-year-old young children
- 22 under chapter 256C.
- 23 Sec. 11. Section 299.1A, subsection 3, Code 2018, is amended
- 24 to read as follows:
- 25 3. A child who has reached the age of four by September 15
- 26 or who has reached the age of five by September 15 and who is
- 27 enrolled in the statewide preschool program under chapter 256C
- 28 shall be considered to be of compulsory attendance age unless
- 29 the parent or guardian of the child submits written notice to
- 30 the school district implementing the program of the parent's or
- 31 quardian's intent to remove the child from enrollment in the
- 32 preschool program.
- 33 Sec. 12. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to school budget
- 34 years beginning on or after July 1, 2018.
- 35 EXPLANATION

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- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 3 This bill expands the statewide preschool program for
- 4 four-year-old children under Code chapter 256C to also include
- 5 five-year-old children. The program is administered by local
- 6 school districts subject to rules adopted by the state board of
- 7 education and receives funding through the school aid formula.
- 8 References to four-year-old children in the program named in
- 9 Code chapter 256C and in related Code provisions are changed
- 10 to "young children" or expanded to also refer to five-year-old
- 11 children.
- 12 The bill applies to school budget years beginning on or after
- 13 July 1, 2018.
