A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to child abuse involving access to a child by a
- 2 person who is a sex offender.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 232.68, subsection 2, paragraph a,
- 2 subparagraph (9), Code 2018, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 (9) (a) Knowingly A person who is responsible for the
- 4 care of a child knowingly allowing a person another person
- 5 custody or of, control of over, or unsupervised access to a
- 6 child or minor child under the age of fourteen or a child with
- 7 a physical or mental disability, after knowing the person
- 8 other person is required to register or is on the sex offender
- 9 registry under chapter 692A for a violation of section 726.6.
- 10 (b) This subparagraph does not apply in any of the following
- 11 circumstances:
- 12 (i) A child living with a parent or guardian who is a sex
- 13 offender required to register or on the sex offender registry
- 14 under chapter 692A.
- 15 (ii) A child living with a parent or guardian who is married
- 16 to and living with a sex offender required to register or on
- 17 the sex offender registry under chapter 692A.
- 18 (iii) A child who is a sex offender required to register or
- 19 on the sex offender registry under chapter 692A who is living
- 20 with the child's parent, guardian, or foster parent and is also
- 21 living with the child to whom access was allowed.
- 22 (c) For purposes of this subparagraph, "control over" means
- 23 any of the following:
- 24 (i) A person who has accepted, undertaken, or assumed
- 25 supervision of a child from the parent or guardian of the
- 26 child.
- 27 (ii) A person who has undertaken or assumed temporary
- 28 supervision of a child without explicit consent from the parent
- 29 or guardian of the child.
- 30 EXPLANATION
- 31 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- 32 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 33 This bill amends the definition of "child abuse" in Code
- 34 chapter 232, relating to juvenile justice.
- 35 Under current law, "child abuse" is defined to include

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1 knowingly allowing a person who is required to register 2 or is on the sex offender registry for a violation of Code 3 section 726.6 (child endangerment) custody or control of, or 4 unsupervised access to, a child. Code chapter 232 defines a 5 "child" as any person under the age of 18. The bill amends current law to provide that child abuse 7 includes a person who is responsible for the care of a child 8 knowingly allowing another person custody of, control over, 9 or unsupervised access to a child under the age of 14 or a 10 child with a physical or mental disability, after knowing the ll other person is required to register or is on the sex offender The bill provides exceptions for a child living with 13 a parent or quardian who is a sex offender required to register 14 or on the sex offender registry, a child living with a parent 15 or quardian who is married to and living with a sex offender 16 required to register or on the sex offender registry, and a 17 child who is a sex offender required to register or on the 18 sex offender registry who is living with the child's parent, 19 guardian, or foster parent and is also living with the child to 20 whom access was allowed. The bill defines "control over" to mean a person who has 21 22 accepted, undertaken, or assumed supervision of a child

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23 from the parent or guardian of the child or a person who has 24 undertaken or assumed temporary supervision of a child without

25 explicit consent from the parent or guardian of the child.
