(SUCCESSOR TO HSB 640)

## A BILL FOR

- An Act providing for the management of weeds, including noxious
  weeds, and making penalties applicable.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 317.1, Code 2018, is amended by adding 2 the following new subsection:

3 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 3. "*Department"* means the department of 4 agriculture and land stewardship.

5 Sec. 2. Section 317.1A, Code 2018, is amended by adding the 6 following new subsection:

7 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 3. A plant is also declared to be a noxious 8 weed as provided in rules adopted by the department pursuant 9 to chapter 17A. The department's determination shall be based 10 on a finding that the plant is competitive, persistent, or 11 pernicious, and may directly or indirectly injure or cause 12 damage to crops, other useful plants, livestock, or poultry; 13 irrigation, land, public roads, fish or wildlife resources; or 14 the public health.

15 Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 317.1B State weed commissioner. 16 The secretary of agriculture may appoint a state weed 17 commissioner to aid in the administration of this chapter 18 and carry out other duties as assigned by the secretary of 19 agriculture relating to the control or eradication of weeds. 20 Sec. 4. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 317.1C Department — powers and 21 duties.

The department shall assist commissioners, boards of 22 1. 23 supervisors, and cities in the interpretation of this chapter 24 and the administration and enforcement of this chapter. 25 2. a. The department may adopt administrative rules, 26 pursuant to chapter 17A, providing a list of plants that it 27 determines is noxious in the manner provided in section 317.1A. The department may establish priorities from the list 28 b. 29 of noxious weeds described in section 317.1A for control or 30 eradication. The priorities may be published annually and 31 made available to the state department of transportation, 32 counties, commissioners, and to the public on the internet 33 site controlled by the department of agriculture and land 34 stewardship. The state department of transportation, boards 35 of supervisors, and weed commissioners shall consider the

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1 priorities when establishing programs of weed control or 2 eradication pursuant to section 317.13.

3 3. The department may adopt rules, pursuant to chapter 4 17A, providing a list of recommended methods for control or 5 eradication of noxious weeds.

6 Sec. 5. Section 317.11, subsection 1, Code 2018, is amended 7 to read as follows:

8 1. The county boards of supervisors and the state department 9 of transportation shall control <u>or eradicate</u> noxious weeds 10 growing on the roads under their jurisdiction. <del>Spraying</del> 11 for control of noxious weeds shall be limited to those 12 circumstances when it is not practical to mow or otherwise 13 control the noxious weeds.

14 Sec. 6. Section 317.13, Code 2018, is amended to read as 15 follows:

16 317.13 Program of control or eradication.

17 <u>1.</u> The board of supervisors of each county may each 18 year, upon recommendation of the county weed commissioner by 19 resolution prescribe and order a program of weed control <u>or</u> 20 <u>eradication</u> for purposes of complying with all sections of 21 this chapter. The county board of supervisors of each county 22 may also <del>by</del> adopting <u>adopt</u> an integrated roadside vegetation 23 management plan <del>prescribe</del> and order <u>as part of</u> a program of 24 weed control <u>or eradication</u> for purposes of complying with all 25 sections of this chapter. The program for weed control ordered 26 or adopted by the county board of supervisors shall provide 27 that spraying for control of weeds shall be limited to those 28 circumstances when it is not practical to mow or otherwise 29 control the weeds.

30 <u>2.</u> The program of weed control <u>or eradication</u> shall include 31 <u>a program of issuing</u> permits for the burning, mowing, or 32 spraying of roadsides by private individuals. The county 33 board of supervisors shall allow only that burning, mowing, or 34 spraying of roadsides by private individuals that is consistent 35 with the adopted integrated roadside vegetation management

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1 plan. This paragraph subsection applies only to those roadside 2 areas of a county which are included in an integrated roadside 3 vegetation management plan.

4 Sec. 7. Section 317.18, Code 2018, is amended to read as 5 follows:

6 317.18 Order for weed control on roads.

The A county board of supervisors and the state department of 7 8 transportation shall control or eradicate noxious weeds growing 9 on the roads under their jurisdiction. A board of supervisors 10 may order all noxious weeds, within the right-of-way of 11 all roads under county jurisdiction to be cut, burned, or 12 otherwise controlled to prevent seed production or eradicated, 13 either upon its own motion or upon receipt of written notice 14 requesting the action from any residents of the township in 15 which the roads are located, or any person regularly using 16 the roads. The order shall be consistent with the county 17 integrated roadside vegetation management plan, if the county 18 has adopted such a plan, and the. The order shall define the 19 roads along which noxious weeds are required to be cut, burned, 20 or otherwise controlled or eradicated and shall require the 21 weeds to be cut, burned, or otherwise controlled or eradicated 22 within fifteen days after the publication of the order in 23 the official newspapers of the county or as prescribed in 24 the county's integrated roadside vegetation management plan. 25 The order shall provide that spraying for control of noxious 26 weeds shall be limited to those circumstances when it is not 27 practical to mow or otherwise control the weeds.

28 Sec. 8. Section 317.19, subsection 1, Code 2018, is amended 29 to read as follows:

30 1. The board of supervisors may appropriate moneys to 31 be used for the purposes of cutting, burning, or otherwise 32 controlling or eradicating weeds or brush within the 33 right-of-way of roads under county jurisdiction in a manner 34 consistent with the county's roadside vegetation management 35 plan, if the county has adopted such a plan, or in time to

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1 prevent reseeding program of weed control or eradication

2 <u>pursuant to section 317.13</u>, except as provided in section 3 314.17. The moneys appropriated shall not be spent on spraying 4 for control of weeds except in those circumstances when it is 5 not practical to mow or otherwise control the weeds.

6 Sec. 9. REPEALS. Sections 317.2, 317.5, 317.8, and 317.17,7 Code 2018, are repealed.

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## EXPLANATION

9 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 10 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

GENERAL. This bill provides for the control or eradication of weeds, including noxious weeds, by state and local governments under Code chapter 317 sometimes referred to as the "weed law" (Code section 317.8(3) and (4)). The control of weeds is the responsibility of a number of state and governmental entities, including the department of agriculture and land stewardship (DALS) headed by the secretary of agriculture (secretary), the department of transportation (DOT), county boards of supervisors (boards), and county weed commissioners (commissioners) appointed by their respective boards.

LIST OF NOXIOUS WEEDS. The bill authorizes DALS to declare a plant to be a noxious weed and added to the statutory list of noxious weeds (Code section 317.1A).

25 STATE WEED COMMISSIONER. The bill authorizes the secretary 26 of agriculture to appoint a state weed commissioner to aid in 27 the administration of the Code chapter and carry out related 28 duties as assigned by the secretary of agriculture.

29 DALS' POWERS AND DUTIES. The bill provides that DALS may 30 assist county weed commissioners, boards of supervisors, 31 and cities (local authorities) in the interpretation of 32 the Code chapter, and in the administration and enforcement 33 of its provisions. DALS may establish a list of priority 34 noxious weeds and methods of control or eradication to be 35 given consideration by the DOT and local authorities when

2 PROGRAM OR WEED CONTROL OR ERADICATION. The bill authorizes 3 a board to adopt a program of weed control or eradication. The 4 bill authorizes a board or DOT to control or eradicate noxious 5 weeds growing in roads.

REPEALED PROVISIONS. The bill eliminates a number of Code 6 7 chapter provisions, including providing for the secretary's 8 appointment of a state botanist (Code section 317.2), the 9 control of weeds in abandoned cemeteries (Code section 10 317.5), the duty of the secretary to serve as the state weed 11 commissioner and the authority to appoint a designee (Code 12 section 317.8), the power of the secretary or secretary's 13 designee to temporarily declare a new weed as noxious (Code 14 section 317.8), the authority of the secretary or designee to 15 impose a maximum penalty of a \$10 fine for each day, up to 16 10 days, that the state agency in control of land fails to 17 comply with an order for destruction of weeds (Code section 18 317.8), and the authority of a board to order a commissioner 19 to destroy a new weed declared to be noxious by the secretary 20 (Code section 317.17).

APPLICABLE PENALTY. An officer who neglects or fails to perform a duty under the Code chapter is guilty of a simple misdemeanor (Code section 317.24). A simple misdemeanor is punishable by confinement for no more than 30 days or a fine of at least \$65 but not more than \$625 or by both.

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
