A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act establishing processes for voter approval of a
- 2 proposition to require a township to provide emergency
- 3 medical service and for voter approval of a higher
- 4 additional annual property tax levy rate for the provision
- 5 of township services.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 359.42, Code 2018, is amended to read as 2 follows:
- 3 359.42 Township fire protection service, emergency warning 4 system, and emergency medical service.
- 5 Except as otherwise provided in section 331.385, the
- 6 trustees of each township shall provide fire protection service
- 7 for the township, exclusive of any part of the township within
- 8 a benefited fire district and, unless required to provide
- 9 emergency medical service by proposition approved under section
- 10 359.44, may provide emergency medical service. The trustees
- 11 may purchase, own, rent, or maintain fire protection service
- 12 or emergency medical service apparatus or equipment or both
- 13 kinds of apparatus or equipment and provide housing for the
- 14 equipment. The trustees of a township which is located within
- 15 a county having a population of three hundred thousand or
- 16 more may also establish and maintain an emergency warning
- 17 system within the township. The trustees may contract with a
- 18 public or private agency under chapter 28E for the purpose of
- 19 providing any service or system required or authorized under
- 20 this section.
- 21 Sec. 2. Section 359.43, subsection 2, Code 2018, is amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 2. a. If the levy authorized under subsection 1 is
- 24 insufficient to provide the services authorized or required
- 25 under section 359.42, the township trustees may levy an
- 26 additional annual tax not exceeding twenty and one-fourth cents
- 27 per thousand dollars of assessed value of the taxable property
- 28 in the township, excluding any property within the corporate
- 29 limits of a city, to provide the services.
- 30 b. (1) The additional annual tax authorized under paragraph
- 31 <u>"a" may be imposed at a rate not exceeding forty and one-fourth</u>
- 32 cents per thousand dollars of assessed value if the trustees of
- 33 the township are providing emergency medical service for the
- 34 township and if the authority to impose the higher additional
- 35 annual tax rate is approved at election.

- 1 (2) (a) The board of township trustees may on its own
- 2 motion, and upon receipt of a valid petition shall, direct the
- 3 county commissioner of elections to submit to the registered
- 4 voters of the township in the areas where the additional
- 5 annual tax is imposed, the proposition of levying the higher
- 6 additional annual tax rate for a period of time stated in the
- 7 proposition.
- 8 (b) A valid petition shall be signed by eligible electors of
- 9 the township residing outside the corporate limits of a city
- 10 equal in number to at least twenty-five percent of the number
- 11 of votes cast in the township outside the corporate limits
- 12 of a city for the office of president of the United States
- 13 or governor at the preceding general election. The petition
- 14 shall include the signatures of the petitioners, a statement
- 15 of their place of residence, and the date on which they signed
- 16 the petition.
- 17 (c) The election shall be held at the next general election
- 18 following adoption of the board's motion or receipt of the
- 19 valid petition and may be included on the same ballot as a
- 20 proposition submitted to the voters under section 359.44.
- 21 However, a petition authorized by this section shall be filed
- 22 not later than eighty-two days before the date of the general
- 23 election if the proposition is to be voted upon at the general
- 24 election. If a valid petition is filed after that date, the
- 25 proposition shall be voted on at the general election following
- 26 the next general election.
- 27 (d) A petition shall be examined before it is accepted for
- 28 filing. If it appears valid on its face, it shall be accepted
- 29 for filing. If it lacks the required number of signatures, it
- 30 shall be returned to the petitioners.
- 31 (e) Petitions which have been accepted for filing are
- 32 valid unless written objections are filed. Objections must be
- 33 filed with the county auditor within five working days after
- 34 the petition was filed. The objection process in section
- 35 44.7 shall be followed for objections filed pursuant to this

- 1 section.
- 2 c. The proposition is adopted if a majority of those
- 3 voting on the proposition at the election approves it. If the
- 4 proposition is approved at election, the township trustees may
- 5 impose the additional annual tax authorized under paragraph "a"
- 6 at a rate not exceeding forty and one-fourth cents per thousand
- 7 dollars for the period of time approved at election, beginning
- 8 with the fiscal year beginning July 1 following the general
- 9 election at which the proposition was approved.
- 10 d. The proposition is not affected by a change in the
- 11 boundaries of the township.
- 12 e. An extension of the period of time for the authorization
- 13 to impose the higher additional annual tax rate or rescission
- 14 of the authorization to impose the higher additional annual tax
- 15 rate may be completed using the same procedure as is required
- 16 for initial approval. However, the authorization to impose
- 17 higher additional annual tax rate may also be rescinded under
- 18 section 359.44, subsection 7.
- 19 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 359.44 Emergency medical service —
- 20 motion or petition election.
- 21 1. a. Unless the county is providing emergency medical
- 22 service to a township pursuant to section 331.385, the board
- 23 of township trustees may on its own motion, and upon receipt
- 24 of a valid petition shall, direct the county commissioner of
- 25 elections to submit to the registered voters of the township,
- 26 excluding those areas of the township within corporate
- 27 boundaries of a city, the proposition of requiring the township
- 28 to provide emergency medical service to those areas of the
- 29 township outside the corporate limits of a city and outside
- 30 those areas being provided emergency medical service under
- 31 chapter 357F or 357J for a period of time stated in the
- 32 proposition but not less than four years.
- 33 b. A valid petition shall be signed by eliqible electors of
- 34 the township residing outside the corporate limits of a city
- 35 equal in number to at least twenty-five percent of the number

- 1 of votes cast in the township outside the corporate limits
- 2 of a city for the office of president of the United States
- 3 or governor at the preceding general election. The petition
- 4 shall include the signatures of the petitioners, a statement
- 5 of their place of residence, and the date on which they signed
- 6 the petition.
- 7 c. The election shall be held at the next general election
- 8 following adoption of the board's motion or receipt of the
- 9 valid petition. However, a petition authorized by this section
- 10 shall be filed not later than eighty-two days before the date
- 11 of the general election if the proposition is to be voted upon
- 12 at the general election. If a valid petition is filed after
- 13 that date, the proposition shall be voted on at the general
- 14 election following the next general election.
- 15 d. A petition shall be examined before it is accepted for
- 16 filing. If it appears valid on its face, it shall be accepted
- 17 for filing. If it lacks the required number of signatures, it
- 18 shall be returned to the petitioners.
- 19 e. Petitions which have been accepted for filing are valid
- 20 unless written objections are filed. Objections must be
- 21 filed with the county auditor within five working days after
- 22 the petition was filed. The objection process in section
- 23 44.7 shall be followed for objections filed pursuant to this
- 24 section.
- 25 2. The question shall be submitted to the voters in
- 26 substantially the following form:
- 28 County, Iowa, be required to provide emergency medical
- 29 service to those areas of township outside the

- 31 emergency medical service from another political subdivision
- 32 of this state and provide such service through imposition of
- 33 a property tax in those areas of the township outside the

- 35 3. The proposition to impose a higher additional annual tax

- 1 pursuant to section 359.43, subsection 2, shall be included on
- 2 the ballot and submitted to the voters at the same election as
- 3 the proposition to require the township to provide emergency
- 4 medical service under this section.
- 5 4. The proposition is adopted if a majority of those
- 6 voting on the proposition at the election approves it. If the
- 7 proposition is approved at election, the township trustees
- 8 shall provide emergency medical service to all areas of the
- 9 township outside the corporate limits of a city and those areas
- 10 not otherwise receiving such service under chapter 357F or 357J
- 11 using methods and funding authorized in sections 359.42 and
- 12 359.43 for the period of time approved at election, beginning
- 13 with the fiscal year beginning July 1 following the general
- 14 election at which the proposition was approved.
- 15 5. The proposition is not affected by a change in the
- 16 boundaries of the township.
- 17 6. An extension of the period of time for requiring the
- 18 township to provide emergency medical service under this
- 19 section or the rescission of the requirement to provide
- 20 emergency medical service may be completed using the same
- 21 procedure as is required for initial approval.
- 7. In lieu of the procedure under subsection 6, the
- 23 requirement for providing emergency medical service under this
- 24 section may be rescinded by resolution of the board of township
- 25 trustees, upon a finding that the emergency medical service
- 26 being provided has not been beneficial or is unnecessary.
- 27 If the requirement for providing emergency medical service
- 28 is rescinded under this subsection and the township ceases
- 29 to provide emergency medical service, the authorization for
- 30 imposition of a higher additional annual tax rate under section
- 31 359.43, subsection 2, paragraph "b", is terminated.
- 32 EXPLANATION
- 33 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 34 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 35 Current law authorizes but does not require the board of

1 township trustees to provide emergency medical service for 2 the township and to fund such service through imposition of 3 a property tax levy. This bill establishes a process for 4 voter approval of a proposition to require a board of township 5 trustees to provide emergency medical service to specified 6 areas of the township. The bill provides that unless the county is providing 8 emergency medical service to a township pursuant to Code 9 section 331.385, the board of township trustees may on its own 10 motion, and upon receipt of a valid petition shall, direct the 11 county commissioner of elections to submit to the registered 12 voters of the township, excluding those areas of the township 13 within corporate boundaries of a city, the proposition of 14 requiring the township to provide emergency medical service to 15 those areas of the township outside the corporate limits of a 16 city and outside those areas being provided emergency medical 17 service under Code chapter 357F (benefited emergency medical 18 services district) or 357J (emergency response district) for a 19 period of time stated in the proposition but not less than four 20 years. A valid petition must be signed by eligible electors of 21 22 the township residing outside the corporate limits of a city 23 equal in number to at least 25 percent of the number of votes 24 cast in the township outside the corporate limits of a city 25 for the office of president of the United States or governor 26 at the preceding general election. The election to vote on 27 the proposition is required to be held at the next general 28 election following adoption of the board's motion or receipt of 29 the valid petition, subject to a filing deadline specified in The bill also specifies the process for filing and 30 the bill. 31 hearing objections to the petition and the form of the question

1 to provide emergency medical service to those specified areas 2 of the township using methods and funding authorized in Code 3 sections 359.42 and 359.43 for the period of time approved 4 at election, beginning with the fiscal year beginning July 1 5 following the general election at which the proposition was The bill also requires that the proposition to 6 approved. 7 impose a higher additional annual tax pursuant to Code section 8 359.43(2), as amended in the bill, shall be included on the 9 ballot and submitted to the voters at the same election as 10 the proposition to require the township to provide emergency 11 medical service. 12 An extension of the period of time for requiring the township 13 to provide emergency medical service or the rescission of the 14 requirement to provide emergency medical service under the bill 15 may be completed using the same procedure as is required for 16 initial approval. In lieu of such process required for initial 17 approval, the requirement for providing emergency medical 18 service may be rescinded by resolution of the board of township 19 trustees, upon a finding that the emergency medical service 20 being provided has not been beneficial or is unnecessary. 21 the requirement for providing emergency medical service is 22 rescinded by resolution of the board and the township ceases 23 to provide emergency medical service, the authorization 24 for imposition of a higher additional annual tax rate is 25 terminated. 26 Current Code section 359.43 authorizes township trustees 27 to levy an annual tax not exceeding 40.5 cents per \$1,000 28 of assessed value of the taxable property in the township, 29 excluding property within a benefited fire district or within 30 the corporate limits of a city, for the purpose of providing 31 fire protection service and emergency medical service for the 32 township. If the 40.5-cent levy is insufficient to provide the 33 services authorized or required, the township trustees may levy 34 an additional annual tax not exceeding 20.25 cents per \$1,000 35 of assessed value.

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      The bill authorizes the township trustees to impose the
 2 additional annual tax at a rate not exceeding the 40.25 cents
 3 per $1,000 of assessed value if the trustees of the township
 4 are providing emergency medical service for the township and
 5 if the authority to impose the higher additional annual tax
 6 rate is approved at election. The board of township trustees
 7 may on its own motion, and upon receipt of a valid petition
 8 shall, direct the county commissioner of elections to submit to
 9 the registered voters of the township in the areas where the
10 additional annual tax is imposed, the proposition of levying
11 the higher additional annual tax rate for a period of time
12 stated in the proposition. The election is required to be held
13 at the next general election following adoption of the board's
14 motion or receipt of the valid petition and may be included
15 on the same ballot as a proposition requiring the township to
16 provide emergency medical service under Code section 359.44, as
17 enacted in the bill. The proposition is adopted if a majority
18 of those voting on the proposition at the election approves it.
19 An extension of the period of time for the authorization to
20 impose the higher additional annual tax rate or rescission of
21 the authorization to impose the higher additional annual tax
22 rate may be completed using the same procedure as is required
23 for initial approval. However, the authorization to impose
24 a higher additional annual tax rate may also be rescinded by
25 resolution of the board of township trustees.

      By operation of law, the bill applies to a county that has,
27 by resolution under Code section 331.385, assumed the exercise
28 of the powers and duties of township trustees relating to
29 fire protection service and emergency medical service for any
30 township located in the unincorporated area of the county.
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
