A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations to state
2 departments and agencies from the rebuild Iowa
3 infrastructure fund, the state bond repayment fund, the
4 technology reinvestment fund, and the revenue bonds capitals
5 fund, providing for related matters, and including effective
6 date provisions.
7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

DIVISION I

REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND

Section 1. REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND —

4 APPROPRIATIONS. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa
5 infrastructure fund to the following departments and agencies
6 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June
7 30, 2018, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is
8 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

9 1. DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

10 For major maintenance projects:

11 \$ 12,010,000

12 Of the moneys appropriated in this subsection, the
13 department shall expend such amount as is necessary for the
14 repair of elevators in facilities on the state capitol complex.

15 2. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP

16 a. (1) For deposit in the water quality initiative fund
17 created in section 466B.45 for purposes of supporting the
18 water quality initiative administered by the division of soil
19 conservation and water quality as provided in section 466B.42,
20 including salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous
21 purposes, notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph
22 "c":

23 \$ 5,200,000

24 (2) (a) The moneys appropriated in this lettered
25 paragraph shall be used to support demonstration projects in
26 subwatersheds as designated by the department that are part
27 of high-priority watersheds identified by the water resources
28 coordinating council.

29 (b) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph
30 shall be used to support demonstration projects in watersheds
31 generally, including regional watersheds, as designated by the
32 division and high-priority watersheds identified by the water
33 resources coordinating council.

34 (c) Of the moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph
35 for each fiscal year, \$225,000 is allocated to the Iowa

1 nutrient research center at Iowa state university of science
2 and technology for nutrient water monitoring network technology
3 and equipment. Of the moneys allocated in this subparagraph
4 division, not more than \$150,000 may be used for the operations
5 and maintenance of the nutrient water monitoring network.

6 (3) In supporting projects in watersheds and subwatersheds
7 as provided in subparagraph (2), subparagraph divisions (a) and
8 (b), all of the following shall apply:

9 (a) The demonstration projects shall utilize water quality
10 practices as described in the latest revision of the document
11 entitled "Iowa Nutrient Reduction Strategy" initially presented
12 in November 2012 by the department of agriculture and land
13 stewardship, the department of natural resources, and Iowa
14 state university of science and technology.

15 (b) The division shall implement demonstration projects
16 as provided in subparagraph division (a) by providing
17 for participation by persons who hold a legal interest in
18 agricultural land used in farming. To every extent practical,
19 the division shall provide for collaborative participation by
20 such persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land
21 located within the same subwatershed.

22 (c) The division shall implement demonstration projects on
23 a cost-share basis as determined by the division. However, the
24 state's share of the amount shall not exceed 50 percent of the
25 estimated cost of establishing the practice as determined by
26 the division or 50 percent of the actual cost of establishing
27 the practice, whichever is less.

28 (d) The demonstration projects shall be used to educate
29 other persons about the feasibility and value of establishing
30 similar water quality practices. The division shall promote
31 field day events for purposes of allowing interested persons to
32 establish water quality practices on their agricultural land.

33 (e) The division shall conduct water quality evaluations
34 within supported subwatersheds. Within a reasonable period
35 after accumulating information from such evaluations, the

1 division shall create an aggregated database of water quality
2 practices. Any information identifying a person holding a
3 legal interest in agricultural land or specific agricultural
4 land shall be a confidential record.

5 (4) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph
6 shall be used to support education and outreach in a manner
7 that encourages persons who hold a legal interest in
8 agricultural land used for farming to implement water quality
9 practices, including the establishment of such practices in
10 watersheds generally, and not limited to subwatersheds or
11 high-priority watersheds.

12 (5) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph
13 may be used to contract with persons to coordinate the
14 implementation of efforts provided in this paragraph.

15 (6) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph
16 may be used by the department to support urban soil and water
17 conservation efforts, which may include but are not limited
18 to management practices related to bioretention, landscaping,
19 the use of permeable or pervious pavement, and soil quality
20 restoration. The moneys shall be allocated on a cost-share
21 basis as provided in chapter 161A.

22 (7) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
23 contrary, the department may use moneys appropriated in
24 this lettered paragraph to carry out the provisions of this
25 paragraph on a cost-share basis in combination with other
26 moneys available to the department from a state or federal
27 source.

28 (8) Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in
29 this lettered paragraph may be used for costs of administration
30 and implementation of the water quality initiative administered
31 by the soil conservation division.

32 b. For deposit in the agricultural drainage well water
33 quality assistance fund created in section 460.303 for
34 purposes of supporting the agricultural drainage well water
35 quality assistance program as provided in section 460.304,

1 notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":
2 \$ 1,875,000
3 Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in this
4 lettered paragraph may be used for costs of administration and
5 implementation of soil conservation practices.
6 c. For deposit in the renewable fuels infrastructure fund
7 created in section 159A.16 for renewable fuel infrastructure

28 ends three years after the end of the fiscal year for which the
29 appropriation is made. However, if the project or projects for
30 which such appropriation was made are completed in an earlier
31 fiscal year, unencumbered or unobligated moneys shall revert at
32 the close of that same fiscal year.

23 \$100,000 is allocated for the costs of major maintenance of
24 monuments without dedicated funds available for maintenance and
25 restoration, subject to a requirement that moneys shall not be
26 allocated unless a match of at least \$2 for each \$1 allocated
27 is received from private sources.

28 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

32 fiscal year shall be used as directed by the general assembly
33 for public vertical infrastructure projects. For the purposes
34 of **this subsection**, "vertical infrastructure" includes only land
35 acquisition and construction; major renovation and major repair

1 of buildings; routine, recurring maintenance; all appurtenant
2 structures; utilities; site development; recreational trails;
3 renewable fuel infrastructure programs; and debt service
4 payments on academic revenue bonds issued in accordance
5 with chapter 262A for capital projects at board of regents
6 institutions. “*Vertical infrastructure*” does not include
7 operational expenses or leasing of a building, appurtenant
8 structure, or utility without a lease-purchase agreement.

9 Sec. 16. Section 8.57C, subsection 3, paragraph a,
10 subparagraph (2), Code 2017, is amended to read as follows:

11 (2) The fiscal year beginning July 1, ~~2017~~ 2018, and for
12 each subsequent fiscal year thereafter.

13 Sec. 17. Section 8.57C, subsection 3, Code 2017, is amended
14 by adding the following new paragraph:

15 NEW PARAGRAPH. *f.* There is appropriated from the rebuild
16 Iowa infrastructure fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
17 2017, and ending June 30, 2018, the sum of ten million dollars
18 to the technology reinvestment fund, notwithstanding section

26 EXPLANATION

27 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
28 the explanation’s substance by the members of the general assembly.

29 This bill relates to and makes appropriations to state
30 departments and agencies from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure
31 fund and the revenue bonds capitals fund, and provides for
32 related matters. The bill is organized by divisions.

33 DIVISION I — REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND. This
34 division appropriates project funding for FY 2017–2018 from
35 the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund for projects for the

1 departments of administrative services, agriculture and land
2 stewardship, the blind, cultural affairs, human rights, human
3 services, natural resources, public defense, public safety, and
4 transportation, and for the economic development authority,
5 treasurer of state, and the board of regents.

6 DIVISION II — TECHNOLOGY REINVESTMENT FUND. This division
7 appropriates project funding for FY 2017-2018 from the
8 technology reinvestment fund for the departments of education,
9 human rights, human services, management, public health, public
10 safety, and homeland security and emergency management, and
11 for the office of the chief information officer and the state
12 public defender.

13 DIVISION III — MISCELLANEOUS APPROPRIATIONS. This division
14 appropriates project funding for FY 2016-2017 from the revenue
15 bonds capitals fund to the department of administrative
16 services for major maintenance projects and for FY 2017-2018
17 from the state bond repayment fund for the state board of
18 regents for tuition replacement. This division takes effect
19 upon enactment.

20 DIVISION IV — CHANGES TO PRIOR APPROPRIATIONS. This
21 division makes a change to moneys appropriated from the
22 rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the board of regents for
23 a project at the state university of Iowa and projects at
24 the Iowa state university of science and technology for FY
25 2017-2018 and FY 2021-2022. The division also makes a change
26 to moneys appropriated from the state bond repayment fund to
27 the department of administrative services for repair of the
28 dome of the Iowa state capitol for FY 2016-2017 to authorize
29 expenditure of moneys remaining upon completion of repairs to
30 the dome for maintenance projects for the Iowa state capitol
31 and the Ola Babcock Miller building. This provision takes
32 effect upon enactment.

33 This division also makes a change to moneys appropriated
34 from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the department of
35 administrative services for major maintenance projects for FY

1 2016-2017. This provision takes effect upon enactment.

2 This division also makes a change in moneys appropriated
3 from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the state fair
4 authority for FY 2017-2018.

5 DIVISION V — MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS. Code section 8.57,
6 concerning the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund, is amended
7 to provide that the definition of "vertical infrastructure"
8 specifically includes renewable fuel infrastructure programs.
9 Code section 8.57C, concerning the technology reinvestment
10 fund, is amended to provide that the appropriation to the
11 fund from the general fund for fiscal years beginning on or
12 after July 1, 2017, is changed to fiscal years beginning on
13 or after July 1, 2018, and to provide for an appropriation to
14 the fund from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund for the
15 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, of \$10 million. Code
16 section 12.88, concerning the revenue bonds capitals fund, is
17 amended to provide that for FY 2017-2018, any unobligated and
18 unencumbered moneys in the fund from the previous fiscal year
19 are appropriated to the department of administrative services
20 for major maintenance projects.
