House Study Bill 161 - Introduced

A BILL FOR

1	An	Act relating to contractor registration and licensing by the
2		department of public health and the department of workforce
3		development and related fees and including effective date

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 91C.1, subsection 3, Code 2017, is
2 amended to read as follows:

The labor services division of the department of 3 3. *a.* 4 workforce development and the Iowa department of public health 5 will work with stakeholders to develop a plan to combine the 6 contractor registration and contractor licensing application 7 process for contractors licensed under chapter 105, to be 8 implemented in time for licensing renewals due July 1, 2017. 9 The department of public health shall transfer to the labor 10 services division a portion of each contractor license fee 11 equal to three times the current contractor registration fee. 12 Effective July 1, 2017, a contractor licensed under chapter 13 105 shall register as a contractor under this chapter in 14 conjunction with the contractor licensing process. At no cost 15 to the labor services division, the department of public health 16 shall collect both the registration and licensing applications 17 as part of one combined application. The labor commissioner 18 shall design the contractor registration application form to 19 exclude from the division of labor's contractor registration 20 application process those contractors who are also covered by 21 chapter 105. The labor commissioner is authorized to adopt 22 rules as needed to accomplish a merger of the application 23 systems including transitional registration periods and fees. 24 b. Effective July 1, 2017, excluding registrations by 25 contractors that are exempt from the registration fee pursuant 26 to this section, the department of public health shall collect 27 and transfer to the labor services division a portion of each 28 contractor license fee equal to three times the contractor 29 registration fee for each three-year license or a prorated 30 portion thereof using a one-sixth deduction for each six-month 31 period of the renewal cycle. Sec. 2. Section 91C.2, subsection 3, Code 2017, is amended 32

33 to read as follows:

34 3. An out-of-state contractor shall either file a surety 35 bond, as provided in section 91C.7, with the division of labor

1 services in the amount of twenty-five thousand dollars for a
2 one-year period or shall provide a statement to the division
3 of labor services that the contractor is prequalified to bid
4 on projects for the department of transportation pursuant to
5 section 314.1.

6 Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. This Act, being deemed of 7 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

EXPLANATION

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9 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 10 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

Under current law, the labor services division of the department of workforce development and the department of public health are directed to develop a plan to combine the contractor registration and contractor licensing application process for contractors licensed under Code chapter 105, the lowa plumber, mechanical professional, and contractor licensing Act, to be implemented in time for licensing renewals due July la 1, 2017. As part of that process, the department of public portion of each contractor license fee equal to three times the current contractor registration fee.

This bill strikes language regarding such fee transfers. The bill instead requires the department of public health to collect and transfer to the labor services division a portion of each contractor license fee equal to three times the contractor registration fee for each three-year license or a prorated portion thereof using a one-sixth deduction for each six-month period of the renewal cycle beginning July 1, 2017. The bill excludes from the fee transfer requirements or registrations by contractors that are exempt from the registration fee pursuant to Code section 91C.1.

The bill also strikes language providing that \$25,000 surety 33 bonds filed with the division of labor services as provided in 34 Code section 91C.7 are filed for a one-year period.
