- 2 of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.
- 3 EXPLANATION
- 4 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- 5 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 6 This bill relates to public funding and regulatory matters
- 7 and making, reducing, transferring, and supplementing
- 8 appropriations for expenditures for the fiscal year 2016-2017.
- 9 The bill is organized by divisions.
- 10 APPROPRIATION REDUCTIONS. For the fiscal year 2016-2017,
- 11 the bill limits expenditures made from appropriations from
- 12 the general fund for certain listed departments and agencies
- 13 and the judicial branch. The bill requires the department
- 14 of management, in consultation with the departments and
- 15 agencies and the judicial branch, to identify and implement
- 16 the reductions and to file a report with the general assembly
- 17 and the legislative services agency listing the appropriation
- 18 reductions applied within 15 days of the effective date
- 19 of the bill. The bill allows departments and agencies and
- 20 the judicial branch to use moneys received for training and
- 21 technology in order to implement the reductions and to adjust
- 22 allocations made within appropriations that are being reduced.
- 23 The bill allows the department of management to reduce standing
- 24 appropriations to such departments and agencies.
- 25 The bill reduces the appropriation to the department of
- 26 human services for the fiscal year 2016-2017 for medical
- 27 assistance program reimbursement and associated costs.
- 28 The bill increases the reduction to the standing unlimited
- 29 appropriation to the general assembly.

- 6 MISCELLANEOUS REALLOCATIONS AND ADJUSTMENTS TO HEALTH
- 7 AND HUMAN SERVICES-RELATED APPROPRIATIONS. The bill
- 8 makes reallocations and adjustments to health and human
- 9 services-related appropriations for the 2016-2017 fiscal year.
- 10 The bill makes adjustments to four appropriations related to
- 11 the temporary assistance for needy families block grant (TANF).
- 12 The bill reduces an appropriation to the family investment
- 13 program (FIP). The bill makes adjustments to the state match
- 14 for a disproportionate share hospital payment under the medical
- 15 assistance program. The bill increases an appropriation to the
- 16 department of human services for purposes of medical contracts.
- 17 The bill reduces the appropriation for the state supplementary
