## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to continuation of or reenrollment in certain
- 2 health care coverage by children of enrollees, and including
- 3 effective date and applicability provisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 509.3, subsection 1, paragraph h, Code
2 2017, is amended to read as follows:

A provision that the insurer will permit continuation of existing coverage or reenrollment in previously existing coverage for an individual who meets the requirements of section 513B.2, subsection 14, paragraph "a", "b", "c", "d", or "e", and who is an unmarried <u>a</u> child of an insured or enrollee who so elects, at least through the policy anniversary date on or after <u>until</u> the date the child marries, ceases to be a resident of this state, or attains the age of twenty-five years old, whichever occurs first, or so long as the unmarried child maintains full-time status as a student in an accredited institution of postsecondary education twenty-six.

14 Sec. 2. Section 509A.13B, Code 2017, is amended to read as 15 follows:

16 509A.13B Coverage of children — continuation or 17 reenrollment.

If a governing body, a county board of supervisors, or a ority council has procured accident or health care coverage for or its employees under this chapter, such coverage shall permit continuation of existing coverage or reenrollment in previously existing coverage for an individual who meets the requirements of section 513B.2, subsection 14, paragraph "a", "b", "c", "d", or "e", and who is an unmarried a child of an insured or enrollee who so elects, at least through the policy anniversary date on or after until the date the child marries, ceases to be a resident of this state, or attains the age of twenty-five years old, whichever occurs first, or so long as the unmarried ehild maintains full-time status as a student in an accredited institution of postsecondary education twenty-six.

31 Sec. 3. Section 514A.3B, subsection 2, Code 2017, is amended 32 to read as follows:

33 2. An insurer issuing an individual policy or contract 34 of accident and health insurance which provides coverage for 35 children of the insured shall permit continuation of existing

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1 coverage or reenrollment in previously existing coverage for 2 an individual who meets the requirements of section 513B.2, 3 subsection 14, paragraph "a", "b", "c", "d", or "e", and who is 4 an unmarried a child of an insured or enrollee who so elects, 5 at least through the policy anniversary date on or after until 6 the date the child marries, ceases to be a resident of this 7 state, or attains the age of twenty-five years old, whichever 8 occurs first, or so long as the unmarried child maintains 9 full-time status as a student in an accredited institution of 10 postsecondary education twenty-six.

11 Sec. 4. Section 514B.9A, Code 2017, is amended to read as
12 follows:

13 514B.9A Coverage of children — continuation or reenrollment. 14 A health maintenance organization which provides health care 15 coverage pursuant to an individual or group health maintenance 16 organization contract regulated under this chapter for 17 children of an enrollee shall permit continuation of existing 18 coverage or reenrollment in previously existing coverage for 19 an individual who meets the requirements of section 513B.2, 20 subsection 14, paragraph "a", "b", "c", "d", or "e", and who 21 is an unmarried a child of an enrollee who so elects, at 22 least through the policy anniversary date on or after until 23 the date the child marries, ceases to be a resident of this 24 state, or attains the age of twenty-five years old, whichever 25 occurs first, or so long as the unmarried child maintains 26 full-time status as a student in an accredited institution of 27 postsecondary education twenty-six.

28 Sec. 5. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. This Act, being deemed of 29 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

30 Sec. 6. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to policies, 31 contracts, or plans of accident or health care coverage 32 delivered, issued for delivery, continued, or renewed in this 33 state, on or after the effective date of this Act.

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## EXPLANATION

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The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with

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the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

2 This bill relates to continuation of or reenrollment of 3 certain dependents of enrollees in group, public employee, 4 individual, and health maintenance organization health care 5 coverage. The bill provides that a child of an enrollee who 6 so elects can continue or reenroll in the parent's health care 7 coverage until the date the child attains the age of 26. This 8 provision is consistent with federal law concerning coverage 9 of adult children.

10 The bill deletes a provision that requires such health 11 care coverage to permit an unmarried child of an enrollee to 12 continue or reenroll in such coverage until the child ceases to 13 be a resident of this state or attains the age of 25 years old, 14 whichever occurs first, or so long as the unmarried child is a 15 full-time student in an accredited institution of postsecondary 16 education.

17 The bill is effective upon enactment. The provisions of 18 the bill are applicable to policies, contracts, or plans 19 of accident or health care coverage delivered, issued for 20 delivery, continued, or renewed in this state, on or after 21 enactment of the bill.

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
