A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to consumer contract terms.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

S.F. 134

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **714.16D** Unfair consumer contract 2 terms.
- 3 1. For purposes of this section:
- 4 a. "Consumer" means a person who buys, leases, or rents 5 merchandise.
- 6 b. "Merchandise" means the same as defined in section 7 714.16.
- 8 c. "Person" means the same as defined in section 714.16.
- 9 2. A person shall not include in a contract or proposed
- 10 contract for the sale or lease of merchandise a provision
- ll waiving a consumer's right to make any statement regarding the
- 12 seller or lessor, the seller's or lessor's employees or agents,
- 13 or the merchandise.
- 3. A person shall not include in an agreement evidencing the
- 15 resolution of a dispute regarding a contract made in connection
- 16 with the sale or lease of merchandise a provision barring the
- 17 consumer from communicating information to a governmental
- 18 official or agency, or a representative of a governmental
- 19 official or agency.
- 20 4. A person shall not seek, threaten to enforce, or enforce
- 21 a contract provision or an agreement evidencing the resolution
- 22 of a dispute that violates this section. A person shall not
- 23 penalize a consumer for engaging in any conduct protected by
- 24 this section.
- 25 5. A waiver of any provision of this section is contrary to
- 26 public policy and is void and unenforceable.
- 27 6. An attempt by a person to have a consumer waive any
- 28 rights given in this section is a violation of this section.
- 7. A violation of this section is an unlawful practice under
- 30 section 714.16. The remedies and penalties provided by section
- 31 714.16 apply to a violation of this section.
- 32 EXPLANATION
- 33 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- 34 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 35 This bill forbids the inclusion, in a contract for the

1 sale or lease of merchandise, of any provision which would 2 prohibit a consumer from making any statement regarding the 3 seller, lessor, or the merchandise. The bill also forbids 4 the inclusion, in an agreement evidencing the resolution 5 of a dispute relating to the sale or lease of merchandise, 6 of any provision which would prohibit a consumer from 7 communicating information to a governmental official or agency. 8 "Merchandise" includes any objects, wares, goods, commodities, 9 intangibles, securities, bonds, debentures, stocks, real 10 estate or services. Any waiver of a consumer's rights to make 11 statements regarding the seller, lessor, or merchandise is void 12 and unenforceable. An attempt by a person to have a consumer 13 waive the consumer's rights to make a statement regarding the 14 seller, lessor, or merchandise is a violation of the new Code 15 section and is an unlawful practice under Code section 714.16. 16 Under Code section 714.16, with regard to unlawful practices, 17 the attorney general has the authority to issue subpoenas, 18 hold hearings, adopt administrative rules, and file lawsuits 19 to obtain temporary and permanent injunctive relief, consumer 20 reimbursement, costs and attorney fees, and civil penalties up 21 to \$40,000 per violation.
