## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to licenses to practice applied behavior
- 2 analysis and including effective date and implementation
- 3 provisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 135.24, subsection 7, paragraph d, Code
2 2017, is amended to read as follows:

d. "Health care provider" means a physician licensed under 3 4 chapter 148, a chiropractor licensed under chapter 151, a 5 physical therapist licensed pursuant to chapter 148A, an 6 occupational therapist licensed pursuant to chapter 148B, 7 a podiatrist licensed pursuant to chapter 149, a physician 8 assistant licensed and practicing under a supervising physician 9 pursuant to chapter 148C, a licensed practical nurse, a 10 registered nurse, or an advanced registered nurse practitioner 11 licensed pursuant to chapter 152 or 152E, a respiratory 12 therapist licensed pursuant to chapter 152B, a dentist, dental 13 hygienist, or dental assistant registered or licensed to 14 practice under chapter 153, an optometrist licensed pursuant to 15 chapter 154, a psychologist licensed pursuant to chapter 154B, 16 a social worker licensed pursuant to chapter 154C, a mental 17 health counselor, or a marital and family therapist, behavior 18 analyst, or assistant behavior analyst licensed pursuant to 19 chapter 154D, a speech pathologist or audiologist licensed 20 pursuant to chapter 154F, a pharmacist licensed pursuant to 21 chapter 155A, or an emergency medical care provider certified 22 pursuant to chapter 147A.

23 Sec. 2. Section 147.1, subsections 3 and 6, Code 2017, are 24 amended to read as follows:

3. "Licensed" or "certified", when applied to a physician
 and surgeon, podiatric physician, osteopathic physician and
 surgeon, physician assistant, psychologist, chiropractor,
 nurse, dentist, dental hygienist, dental assistant,
 optometrist, speech pathologist, audiologist, pharmacist,
 physical therapist, physical therapist assistant, occupational
 therapist, occupational therapy assistant, orthotist,
 prosthetist, pedorthist, respiratory care practitioner,
 practitioner of cosmetology arts and sciences, practitioner
 of barbering, funeral director, dietitian, <u>behavior analyst</u>,
 assistant behavior analyst, marital and family therapist,

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1 mental health counselor, respiratory care and polysomnography 2 practitioner, polysomnographic technologist, social worker, 3 massage therapist, athletic trainer, acupuncturist, nursing 4 home administrator, hearing aid specialist, or sign language 5 interpreter or transliterator means a person licensed under 6 this subtitle.

*Profession* means medicine and surgery, podiatry,
osteopathic medicine and surgery, practice as a physician
assistant, psychology, chiropractic, nursing, dentistry,
dental hygiene, dental assisting, optometry, speech pathology,
audiology, pharmacy, physical therapy, physical therapist
assisting, occupational therapy, occupational therapy
assisting, respiratory care, cosmetology arts and sciences,
barbering, mortuary science, <u>applied behavior analysis</u>, marital
and family therapy, mental health counseling, polysomnography,
social work, dietetics, massage therapy, athletic training,
acupuncture, nursing home administration, practice as a hearing
aid specialist, sign language interpreting or transliterating,
orthotics, prosthetics, or pedorthics.

20 Sec. 3. Section 147.2, subsection 1, Code 2017, is amended 21 to read as follows:

A person shall not engage in the practice of medicine
 and surgery, podiatry, osteopathic medicine and surgery,
 psychology, chiropractic, physical therapy, physical
 therapist assisting, nursing, dentistry, dental hygiene,
 dental assisting, optometry, speech pathology, audiology,
 occupational therapy, occupational therapy assisting,
 orthotics, prosthetics, pedorthics, respiratory care, pharmacy,
 cosmetology arts and sciences, barbering, social work,
 dietetics, <u>applied behavior analysis</u>, marital and family
 therapy or mental health counseling, massage therapy, mortuary
 science, polysomnography, athletic training, acupuncture,
 nursing home administration, or sign language interpreting or
 transliterating, or shall not practice as a physician assistant

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1 license for that purpose from the board for the profession.

2 Sec. 4. Section 147.13, subsection 16, Code 2017, is amended 3 to read as follows:

4 16. For <u>applied behavior analysis</u>, marital and family 5 therapy, and mental health counseling, the board of behavioral 6 science.

7 Sec. 5. Section 147.14, subsection 1, paragraph m, Code 8 2017, is amended to read as follows:

9 m. For behavioral science, three members licensed to 10 practice marital and family therapy, all of whom shall be 11 practicing marital and family therapists; three members 12 licensed to practice mental health counseling, one of whom 13 shall be employed in graduate teaching, training, or research 14 in mental health counseling and two of whom shall be practicing 15 mental health counselors; two licensed behavior analysts; one 16 licensed assistant behavior analyst; and three members who are 17 not licensed to practice marital and family therapy, applied 18 behavior analysis, or mental health counseling and who shall 19 represent the general public.

20 Sec. 6. Section 147.74, Code 2017, is amended by adding the 21 following new subsection:

<u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 14A. *a.* A behavior analyst licensed under
chapter 154D may use the letters "LBA" after the person's name. *b.* An assistant behavior analyst licensed under chapter 154D
may use the letters "LABA" after the person's name.

26 Sec. 7. Section 154D.1, Code 2017, is amended by adding the 27 following new subsections:

NEW SUBSECTION. 1A. "Certifying entity" means the behavior analyst certification board or another entity whose programs to certify professional practitioners of applied behavior analysis are accredited by the national commission for certifying agencies or the American national standards institute.

33 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 1B. "Licensed assistant behavior analyst"
34 means a person licensed to practice applied behavior analysis
35 under the supervision of a licensed behavior analyst under

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1 chapter 147 and this chapter.

<u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 1C. *Licensed behavior analyst* means a
person licensed to practice applied behavior analysis under
chapter 147 and this chapter.

<u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 6A. *Practice of applied behavior analysis* means the design, implementation, and evaluation
of instructional and environmental modification to produce
socially significant improvements in human behavior.

9 "Practice of applied behavior analysis" includes the empirical 10 identification of functional relations between behavior and 11 environmental factors, known as functional assessment and 12 analysis. "Practice of applied behavior analysis" excludes 13 psychological testing, psychotherapy, cognitive therapy, 14 sex therapy, psychoanalysis, hypnotherapy, and counseling as 15 treatment modalities.

16 Sec. 8. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 154D.2A Licensure — behavior analysts 17 — assistant behavior analysts.

18 1. An applicant for a license to practice as a behavior 19 analyst shall be granted a license by the board upon submitting 20 to the board proof of the applicant's current certification as 21 a behavior analyst or behavior analyst-doctoral by a certifying 22 entity.

23 2. An applicant for a license to practice as an assistant 24 behavior analyst shall be granted a license by the board upon 25 submitting to the board proof of the applicant's current 26 certification as an assistant behavior analyst by a certifying 27 entity. The applicant must also provide proof of ongoing 28 supervision by a licensed behavior analyst in accordance with 29 the requirements of the certifying entity.

30 Sec. 9. Section 154D.4, Code 2017, is amended by adding the 31 following new subsection:

32 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 3. This chapter and chapter 147 do not 33 prevent or restrict the practice of applied behavior analysis 34 by any of the following:

35 *a.* Persons licensed to practice other professions under

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1 this subtitle, provided that the person does not represent 2 that the person is a behavior analyst or assistant behavior 3 analyst unless also licensed as one, applied behavior analysis 4 is within the scope of practice of the person's profession, and 5 the services provided are within the boundaries of the person's 6 education, training, and competence.

*b.* Family members of recipients of applied behavior analysis services implementing applied behavior analysis treatment plans with the recipients under the extended authority and direction of a licensed behavior analyst or a licensed assistant behavior analyst. Such persons shall not represent themselves as behavior analysts or assistant behavior analysts.

13 c. Paraprofessional technicians who deliver applied behavior 14 analysis services under the extended authority and direction 15 of a licensed behavior analyst or licensed assistant behavior 16 analyst. Such persons shall not represent themselves as 17 behavior analysts or assistant behavior analysts and shall use 18 titles that indicate their nonprofessional status, including 19 but not limited to "assistant behavior analyst technician", 20 "behavior technician", "tutor", or "line therapist".

21 d. Behavior analysts who practice with nonhumans, including 22 but not limited to applied animal behaviorists and animal 23 trainers. Such individuals may use the title "behavior 24 analyst" but shall not represent themselves as licensed 25 behavior analysts or licensed assistant behavior analysts 26 unless they are licensed as such.

*e.* Professionals who provide general applied behavior analysis services to organizations, so long as those services are for the benefit of the organizations and do not involve direct services to individuals. Such professionals may use the title "behavior analyst" but shall not represent themselves as licensed behavior analysts or licensed assistant behavior analysts unless they are licensed as such.

*f.* Students whose applied behavior analysis activities are conducted within a defined program of study, course, practicum,

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1 internship, or postdoctoral fellowship, provided that the 2 applied behavior analysis activities are directly supervised 3 by a behavior analyst licensed in this state, an instructor in 4 a course sequence approved by a certifying entity, or another 5 qualified faculty member of the student's program. Such 6 students shall not present themselves as behavior analysts 7 or assistant behavior analysts and shall use titles that 8 clearly indicate their status, such as "student", "intern", or 9 "trainee".

10 g. Unlicensed persons pursuing supervised experience in 11 applied behavior analysis consistent with the experience 12 requirements of a certifying entity, provided such experience 13 is supervised in accordance with the requirements of the 14 certifying entity.

15 h. Individuals who teach applied behavior analysis or 16 conduct behavior-analytic research, provided that such teaching 17 or research does not involve the direct delivery of applied 18 behavior analysis services. Such individuals may use the 19 title "behavior analyst" but shall not represent themselves 20 as licensed behavior analysts or licensed assistant behavior 21 analysts unless they are licensed as such.

*i.* Behavior analysts licensed in another jurisdiction or certified by a certifying entity to practice independently and who work in this state no more than two thousand eighty hours swithin a calendar year.

*j.* Persons employed by a school board performing the duties of their positions. Such persons shall not represent themselves as licensed behavior analysts or licensed assistant behavior analysts unless they are licensed as such, and shall not offer applied behavior analysis services to any persons or entities other than their school employer or accept remuneration for providing applied behavior analysis services other than the remuneration they receive from their school employer.

35 Sec. 10. Section 154D.5, Code 2017, is amended to read as

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1 follows:

2 154D.5 Sexual conduct with client.

3 The license of a <u>behavior analyst</u>, an <u>assistant behavior</u> 4 <u>analyst</u>, <u>a</u> marital and family therapist, or a mental health 5 counselor shall be revoked if the board finds that the licensee 6 engaged in sexual activity with a client as determined by 7 board rule. The revocation shall be in addition to any other 8 penalties provided by law.

9 Sec. 11. Section 154D.7, Code 2017, is amended to read as 10 follows:

11 154D.7 Temporary license — marital and family therapy — 12 mental health counseling — fees.

Any person who has fulfilled all of the requirements for 13 14 licensure under this chapter section 154D.2, except for having 15 completed the postgraduate supervised clinical experience 16 requirement as determined by the board by rule, may apply 17 to the board for a temporary license. The license shall be 18 designated "temporary license in marital and family therapy" 19 or "temporary license in mental health counseling" and 20 shall authorize the licensee to practice marital and family 21 therapy or mental health counseling under the supervision of a 22 qualified supervisor as determined by the board by rule. The 23 license shall be valid for three years and may be renewed at 24 the discretion of the board. The fee for a temporary license 25 shall be set by the board to cover the administrative costs of 26 issuing the license, and if renewed, a renewal fee as set by 27 the board shall be required.

28 Sec. 12. Section 249A.15A, Code 2017, is amended by adding 29 the following new subsection:

30 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 5. The department shall adopt rules 31 pursuant to chapter 17A entitling behavior analysts and 32 assistant behavior analysts who are licensed pursuant to 33 chapter 154D to payment for behavioral health services provided 34 to recipients of medical assistance, subject to limitations 35 and exclusions the department finds necessary on the basis of

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1 federal laws and regulations.

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2 Sec. 13. EFFECTIVE DATE AND IMPLEMENTATION. This Act 3 shall take effect January 1, 2018, except that the board of 4 behavioral science may begin implementation prior to that date, 5 to the extent necessary to fully implement the provisions 6 providing for the licensure of behavior analysts and assistant 7 behavior analysts by January 1, 2018.

## EXPLANATION

9 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 10 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

11 This bill creates a licensure process for behavior analysts 12 and assistant behavior analysts who practice applied behavior 13 analysis. These professions, as defined in the bill, shall 14 be regulated by the board of behavioral science. Board seats 15 for two licensed behavior analysts and one licensed assistant 16 behavior analyst shall be added to the board of behavioral 17 science. The bill allows licensed behavior analysts to 18 refer to themselves as "LBAS" and licensed assistant behavior 19 analysts as "LABAS".

20 Under the bill, an applicant for a license to practice as 21 a behavior analyst shall be granted a license by the board of 22 behavioral science upon submitting proof to the board of the 23 applicant's certification as a behavior analyst or behavior 24 analyst-doctoral by a certifying entity. The bill defines 25 "certifying entity" as the behavior analyst certification 26 board or another entity whose programs to certify professional 27 practitioners of behavior analysis are accredited by the 28 national commission on certifying agencies or the American 29 national standards institute.

An applicant for a license as an assistant behavior analyst shall be granted a license by the board of behavioral science upon submitting to the board proof of the applicant's certification as an assistant behavior analyst verified by a certifying entity. The applicant must also provide proof of ongoing supervision by a licensed behavior analyst in

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1 accordance with the requirements of a certifying entity.

The bill exempts certain persons from the licensure requirements, including a person licensed to practice other health-related professions, behavior analysts who practice with nonhumans, family members of recipients of applied behavior analysis services, paraprofessional technicians, persons who provide general applied behavior analysis services to organizations, applied behavior analysis students, persons who teach behavior analysis or conduct behavior-analytic research, persons pursuing supervised experience in applied behavior analysis, behavior analysts licensed in another jurisdiction or certified by the certifying entity to practice independently and who work in this state no more than 2,080 hours within a calendar year, and persons employed by a school board performing the duties of their positions.

16 The bill requires the revocation of a behavior analyst's or 17 assistant behavior analyst's license if the board of behavioral 18 science finds that the licensee engaged in sexual activity with 19 a client. The revocation shall be in addition to any other 20 penalties provided by law.

The bill includes an effective date of January 1, 2018, except that the board of behavioral science may begin implementation prior to that date, to the extent necessary to fully implement the provisions providing for the licensure of behavior analysts and assistant behavior analysts by January 1, 2018.

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
