(SUCCESSOR TO SSB 3089)

A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to public funding and regulatory matters
2 and making, reducing, transferring, and supplementing
3 appropriations for expenditures in the fiscal year beginning
4 July 1, 2017, and including effective date provisions.
5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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DIVISION I

APPROPRIATION REDUCTIONS

Section 1. EXECUTIVE AND JUDICIAL BRANCH APPROPRIATION REDUCTIONS.

1. For the period beginning on the effective date of this section and ending on June 30, 2018, the following departments and agencies and the judicial branch are subject to a reduction in expenditures made from appropriations from the general fund in the following amounts:

- a. Department of administrative services \$ 62,560
- b. Auditor of state \$ 24,186
- c. Department of commerce \$ 37,299
- d. Governor's office \$ 62,664
- e. Governor's office of drug control policy \$ 6,174
- f. Department of human rights \$ 21,228
- g. Department of inspections and appeals \$ 307,122
- h. State public defender \$ 236,041
- i. Department of management \$ 67,887
- j. Department of revenue \$ 428,271
- k. Secretary of state

In identifying and implementing the reduction pursuant to this paragraph, the director of the department shall be authorized to make allocations between department divisions in the manner and to the extent as the director determines appropriate, in consultation with the department of management.

24 2. The department of management, in consultation with
25 the departments and agencies and the judicial branch listed
26 in subsection 1, shall identify and implement the reductions
27 in subsection 1 with respect to the appropriate general fund
28 appropriations. Within fifteen days of the effective date of
29 this section, the department of management shall transmit a
30 report to the general assembly and legislative services agency
31 listing the appropriation reductions applied.

32 3. In order to implement the reductions in subsection 1,
33 the departments and agencies and the judicial branch may adjust
34 allocations made from appropriations that are being reduced.

35 4. In order to implement the reductions in subsection 1, the

1 department of management may reduce a standing appropriation to
2 a department or agency required to reduce expenditures pursuant
3 to subsection 1.

4 Sec. 2. LIMITATIONS OF STANDING APPROPRIATION — FY
5 2017-2018. Notwithstanding the standing appropriation in the
6 following designated section for the fiscal year beginning July
7 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2018, the amount appropriated from
8 the general fund of the state pursuant to the section for the
9 following designated purpose shall not exceed the following
10 amount:

11 For regional tourism marketing under section 99F.11,
12 subsection 3, paragraph "d", subparagraph (2):

14 Sec. 3. TRANSFER — IOWA SKILLED WORKER AND JOB CREATION
15 FUND. There is transferred from the Iowa skilled worker and
16 job creation fund created in section 8.75 to the general fund
17 of the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, and
18 ending June 30, 2018, the following amount:

20 Sec. 4. SUPPLEMENTAL REIMBURSEMENT FOR GROUND EMERGENCY
21 MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION PROVIDED TO MEDICAID BENEFICIARIES. The
22 department of human services shall submit a Medicaid state
23 plan amendment to the centers for Medicare and Medicaid
24 services of the United States department of health and human
25 services to request authorization to establish and administer a
26 methodology to provide supplemental reimbursement to eligible
27 ground emergency medical transportation providers that provide
28 ground emergency medical transportation services to Medicaid
29 beneficiaries. For purposes of this section, "eligible ground
30 emergency medical transportation provider" means a provider who
31 provides ground emergency medical transportation services to
32 Medicaid beneficiaries and is enrolled as a Medicaid provider
33 during the period being claimed.

34 Sec. 5. 2017 Iowa Acts, chapter 169, section 17, subsection
35 1, paragraph a, subparagraph (1) is amended to read as follows:

5 Sec. 6. 2017 Iowa Acts, chapter 170, section 5, subsection
6 1, is amended to read as follows:

7 1. The appropriations made pursuant to [section 2.12](#) for the
8 expenses of the general assembly and legislative agencies for
9 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30,
10 2018, are reduced by the following amount:

16 SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS

17 Sec. 8. INDIGENT DEFENSE. There is appropriated from the
18 general fund of the state to the office of the state public
19 defender of the department of inspections and appeals for the
20 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2018,
21 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary to
22 supplement appropriations made for the following designated
23 purpose:

24 For payments on behalf of eligible adults and juveniles from
25 the indigent defense fund in accordance with section 815.11:
26 \$ 1,700,000

27 Sec. 9. UTILITY COSTS. There is appropriated from the
28 general fund of the state to the department of administrative
29 services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, and ending
30 June 30, 2018, the following amount, or so much thereof as is
31 necessary, to supplement appropriations made for the following
32 designated purpose:

35 DIVISION III

1 EFFECTIVE DATE

2 Sec. 10. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. This Act, being deemed
3 of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

4 EXPLANATION

5 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
6 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

7 This bill relates to public funding and regulatory matters
8 and making, reducing, transferring, and supplementing
9 appropriations for expenditures for the fiscal year 2017-2018.
10 The bill is organized by divisions.

11 APPROPRIATION REDUCTIONS. For the fiscal year 2017-2018,
12 the bill limits expenditures made from appropriations from
13 the general fund for certain listed departments and agencies
14 and the judicial branch. The bill requires the department
15 of management, in consultation with the departments and
16 agencies and the judicial branch, to identify and implement
17 the reductions and to file a report with the general assembly
18 and the legislative services agency listing the appropriation
19 reductions applied within 15 days of the effective date
20 of the bill. The bill allows departments and agencies
21 and the judicial branch to adjust allocations made within
22 appropriations that are being reduced. The bill allows the
23 department of management to reduce standing appropriations to
24 such departments and agencies.

25 The bill limits a standing appropriation to the economic
26 development authority for purposes of regional tourism
27 marketing.

28 The bill transfers moneys from the Iowa skilled worker and
29 job creation fund to the general fund of the state for FY
30 2017-2018.

31 The bill requires the department of human services to submit
32 a Medicaid state plan amendment to the centers for Medicare and
33 Medicaid services of the United States department of health
34 and human services to request authorization to establish and
35 administer a methodology to provide supplemental reimbursement

1 to eligible ground emergency medical transportation providers
2 that provide ground emergency medical transportation services
3 to Medicaid beneficiaries.

4 The bill reduces an appropriation to the economic
5 development authority from the Iowa skilled worker and job
6 creation fund for FY 2017-2018.

7 The bill increases the reduction to the standing unlimited
8 appropriation to the general assembly.

9 The bill repeals an appropriation to the offices of the
10 governor and the lieutenant governor for the fiscal year
11 2017-2018 for expenses incurred during the gubernatorial
12 transition.

13 SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS. The bill makes supplemental
14 appropriations to the state public defender of the department
15 of inspections and appeals for payments on behalf of eligible
16 adults and juveniles from the indigent defense fund.

17 The bill makes supplemental appropriations to the department
18 of administrative services for payments of utility costs.

19 EFFECTIVE DATE. The bill takes effect upon enactment.
