Section 1. Section 35A.5, subsection 18, Code 2018, is
 amended by striking the subsection.

3 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 546B.1 Definitions.

4 When used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise 5 requires:

6 1. "Compensation" means money, property, or anything else
7 of value, which includes but is not limited to exclusive
8 arrangements or agreements for the provision of services or the
9 purchase of products.

10 2. "Person" includes, where applicable, natural persons, 11 corporations, trusts, unincorporated associations, and 12 partnerships.

13 3. "Trade or commerce" includes the marketing or sale 14 of assets, goods, or services, or any commerce directly or 15 indirectly affecting the people of this state.

16 4. "Veteran" means as defined in section 35.1.

17 5. "Veterans' benefit matter" means any preparation, 18 presentation, or prosecution of a claim affecting a person who 19 has filed or has expressed an intention to file an application 20 for determination of payment, service, commodity, function, 21 or status, entitlement to which is determined under laws 22 administered by the United States department of veterans 23 affairs or the Iowa department of veterans affairs pertaining 24 to veterans and their dependents or survivors.

25 Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 546B.2 Advertising or promotion 26 disclosures.

1. A person who advertises or promotes any event, presentation, seminar, workshop, or other public gathering regarding veterans' benefits or entitlements shall include a disclosure as provided in this section and must disseminate the disclosure, both orally and in writing, at the beginning of the event, presentation, seminar, workshop, or other public gathering. The written disclosure must be in the same type size and font as the term "veteran" or any variation of that term as used in the advertisement or promotional materials

2 gathering.

3 2. The disclosure required by this section shall be in the 4 following form:

5 This event is not sponsored by, or affiliated with, the 6 United States Department of Veterans Affairs, the Iowa 7 Department of Veterans Affairs, or any other congressionally 8 chartered or recognized organization of honorably discharged 9 members of the Armed Forces of the United States or any 10 of their auxiliaries. Products or services that may be 11 discussed at this event are not necessarily endorsed by those 12 organizations. You may qualify for benefits other than or in 13 addition to the benefits discussed at this event.

14 3. The requirement to provide a disclosure as provided 15 in this section shall not apply under any of the following 16 circumstances:

a. The United States department of veterans affairs,
the Iowa department of veterans affairs, or any other
congressionally chartered or recognized organization of
honorably discharged members of the armed forces of the
United States or any of their auxiliaries have granted written
permission to the person for the use of its name, symbol,
or insignia to advertise or promote any event, presentation,
seminar, workshop, or other public gathering regarding
veterans' benefits or entitlements.

b. The event, presentation, seminar, workshop, or public
gathering is part of an accredited continuing legal education
course.

Sec. 4. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 546B.3 Prohibited acts or practices.
A person who commits any of the following acts or practices
commits a violation of this chapter:

32 1. Receives compensation for advising or assisting another 33 person with a veterans' benefit matter, except as permitted 34 under Title 38 of the United States Code.

35 2. Uses financial or other personal information gathered

3. Receives compensation for referring another person to a
5 person accredited by the United States department of veterans
6 affairs.

7 4. Represents, either directly or by implication, and
8 either orally or in writing, that the receipt of a certain
9 level of veterans' benefits is guaranteed.

10 5. Fails to provide a disclosure required to be provided 11 pursuant to section 546B.2.

Sec. 5. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 546B.4 Inapplicability of chapter.
This chapter does not apply to officers, employees, or
volunteers of the state, or of any county, city, or other
political subdivision, or of a federal agency of the United
States, who are acting in their official capacity.

Sec. 6. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 546B.5 Unfair practice — penalties. A violation of this chapter is a violation of section 714.16, subsection 2, paragraph "a". Any civil penalty recovered for a violation of this chapter shall be deposited in the veterans trust fund created in section 35A.13.

Sec. 7. REPEAL. Chapter 546B, Code 2018, is repealed.
 EXPLANATION

This bill concerns the providing of certain veterans' benefits services and the conducting of events related to veterans' benefits.

The bill repeals current Code chapter 546B regarding veterans' benefits assistance and disclosures and provides for new provisions governing the providing of certain veterans' benefits. Current law requires the provision of certain disclosures if a person advertises or provides veterans' benefit services and requires the department of veterans affairs to develop a written disclosure statement for purposes

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1 of the current Code chapter. In addition, current law provides
2 a maximum \$1,000 civil penalty per violation and further
3 provides that any penalties recovered would be deposited in the
4 veterans trust fund.

5 New Code section 546B.1 provides definitions governing the 6 new Code chapter. Terms defined include compensation, person, 7 trade or commerce, veteran, and veterans' benefit matter. 8 Specifically, the bill defines a veterans' benefit matter as 9 any activity related to a claim affecting a person regarding 10 any application for certain veterans' benefits for veterans and 11 their dependents and survivors.

12 New Code section 546B.2 provides for the disclosures 13 required for any person advertising or promoting any event, 14 presentation, seminar, workshop, or other public gathering 15 regarding veterans' benefits or entitlements. The new Code 16 section specifies the form of the disclosure which generally 17 provides that the event is not sponsored by a governmental 18 agency for veterans or by any officially recognized 19 organization of veterans. The new Code section requires the 20 disclosure be disseminated, both orally and in writing, at 21 the beginning of an event related to veterans' benefits and 22 entitlements. The new Code section also specifies certain 23 face and font requirements for a written disclosure. The new 24 Code section also provides that the disclosure is not required 25 if permission from a governmental agency for veterans or by 26 any officially recognized organization of veterans to use the 27 agency's or organization's name for the event has been provided 28 or if the event is part of an accredited continuing legal 29 education course.

New Code section 546B.3 describes those acts that would constitute a violation of the new Code chapter. Specifically, a violation occurs if a person receives compensation for advising or assisting another person with a veterans' benefit matter or for referring a person to a person accredited by the Sunited States department of veterans affairs, uses financial

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1 or other personal information gathered in order to prepare 2 documents for, or represent the interests of, another in 3 a veterans' benefit matter, guarantees a certain level of 4 benefits, or fails to provide the disclosures required by the 5 new Code chapter.

6 New Code section 546B.4 provides that the new Code chapter 7 does not apply to government employees or volunteers acting in 8 their official capacity.

9 New Code section 546B.5 provides that a violation of this new 10 Code chapter is a violation of Code section 714.16, subsection 11 2, paragraph "a", an unfair practice related to consumer 12 frauds. Code section 714.16 provides for the ability of the 13 attorney general to obtain injunctive relief related to the 14 unfair practice and the ability to recover a civil penalty 15 of up to \$40,000 per violation. The new Code section also 16 provides that any civil penalty recovered for a violation of 17 the new Code chapter shall be deposited in the veterans trust 18 fund.

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
