A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to probate, by amending the court fees in
2 probate and including applicability provisions.
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 633.31, Code 2018, is amended to read as
2 follows:

3 **633.31 Calendar — court fees in probate.**

4 1. The clerk shall keep a court calendar, and enter thereon
5 such matters as the court may prescribe.

6 2. The clerk shall charge and collect ~~the following fees in~~
7 ~~connection with probate matters, which shall be deposited in~~
8 ~~the account established under section 602.8108: probate fees~~
9 as follows:

10 a. ~~For services performed in short form probates pursuant~~

14 (1) Filing a petition to invoke the jurisdiction of the
15 court for the administration of trusts under section 633A.6201
16 or where the jurisdiction of the court is otherwise exercised

20 (3) Filing a petition for guardianship of a minor, a person
21 with a mental illness, or other person laboring under legal
22 disability unless the petition is part of a combined filing
23 with a conservatorship.

7 ~~other services performed in estates administered under this~~
8 ~~chapter or chapter 635, the clerk shall charge and collect an~~
9 ~~administration fee in the amount of one-quarter of one percent~~
10 ~~of the value of the gross assets of the decedent's estate~~
11 ~~listed in the probate inventory minus the value of all of the~~
12 ~~following, not to exceed two thousand five hundred dollars:~~

- 13 a. Joint tenancy property.
- 14 b. Transfers during the decedent's lifetime.
- 15 c. Nonprobate assets, including but not limited to
16 life insurance, annuities, individual retirement accounts,
17 retirement plans, transfer on death securities accounts,
18 payable on death bank accounts, and similar assets payable to
19 beneficiaries other than the estate of the decedent.

20 4. For other services performed in conservatorship,
21 the clerk shall charge and collect an administrative fee of
22 one-quarter of one percent of the value of the gross assets of
23 the conservatorship listed in the inventory, not to exceed two
24 thousand five hundred dollars.

25 5. An administration fee shall not be charged on any
26 property transferred to an estate from a conservatorship
27 that has been administered in this state and for which an
28 administration fee has been assessed and paid.

29 6. Court fees collected under this section shall be
30 deposited in the account established under section 602.8108.

31 Sec. 2. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies July 1, 2018, to
32 estates of decedents dying on or after that date.

33 EXPLANATION

34 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
35 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

1 This bill amends Code section 633.31 by altering the court
2 fees in probate and including applicability provisions. The
3 bill sets forth the following fees. The fee is \$185 to any of
4 the following: filing a petition to invoke the jurisdiction of
5 the court for the administration of trusts under Code section
6 633A.6201 or where the jurisdiction of the court is otherwise
7 exercised over trusts as provided by law; filing a petition to
8 open a court-administered testamentary trust; filing a petition
9 for guardianship of a minor, a person with a mental illness,
10 or other person laboring under legal disability unless the
11 petition is part of a combined filing with a conservatorship.
12 The fee is \$50 for any of the following: filing a short form
13 probate pursuant to Code sections 450.22 and 450.44; filing
14 a petition for probate of a will without administration or a
15 petition under Code section 633.290, other than probate of
16 a will; and filing and indexing a transcript. The fee is
17 \$20 for any of the following: taking and approving a bond
18 or the sureties on a bond; preparing a certificate and seal;
19 certifying a change of title; and issuing a clerk's commission
20 to appraisers. The fee is \$0.50 per page for copies of court
21 records.

22 The bill also provides for the following administration
23 fees. For other services performed in estates administered
24 under Code chapters 633 and 635, the clerk shall charge and
25 collect an administration fee in the amount of 0.25 percent
26 of the value of the gross assets of the decedent's estate
27 listed in the probate inventory minus the value of all of the
28 following, not to exceed \$2,500: joint tenancy property;
29 transfers during the decedent's lifetime; and nonprobate
30 assets, including but not limited to life insurance, annuities,
31 individual retirement accounts, retirement plans, transfer on
32 death securities accounts, payable on death bank accounts,
33 and similar assets payable to beneficiaries other than
34 the estate of the decedent. For other services performed
35 in conservatorship, the clerk shall charge and collect an

1 administrative fee of 0.25 percent of the value of the gross
2 assets of the conservatorship listed in the inventory, not to
3 exceed \$2,500.

4 Finally, the bill provides that an administration fee shall
5 not be charged on any property transferred to an estate from a
6 conservatorship that has been administered in this state and
7 for which an administration fee has been assessed and paid.

8 The bill applies to estates of decedents dying on or after
9 July 1, 2018.
