A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the amounts paid to a receiving district
2 for a pupil participating in open enrollment and including
3 applicability provisions.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 282.18, subsection 7, Code 2018, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 7. a. A pupil participating in open enrollment shall be
4 counted, for state school foundation aid purposes, in the
5 pupil's district of residence. A pupil's residence, for
6 purposes of this section, means a residence under section
7 282.1. The board of directors of the district of residence
8 shall pay to the receiving district an amount equal to the sum
9 of the ~~state cost~~ following:

10 (1) The regular program foundation base per pupil for the
11 previous school fiscal year plus either minus the amount per
12 pupil of foundation property tax in the district of residence
13 for the previous fiscal year.

14 (2) Either the teacher leadership supplement state district
15 cost per pupil for the previous fiscal year as provided in
16 section ~~257.9~~ 257.10 or the teacher leadership supplement
17 foundation aid for the previous fiscal year as provided in
18 section 284.13, subsection 1, paragraph "d", if both the
19 district of residence and the receiving district are receiving
20 such supplements, plus any.

21 (3) The teacher salary supplement district cost per pupil
22 for the previous fiscal year for the district of residence.

23 (4) The professional development supplement district cost
24 per pupil for the previous fiscal year for the district of
25 residence.

26 (5) The early intervention supplement district cost
27 per pupil for the previous fiscal year for the district of
28 residence.

29 (6) The area education agency teacher salary supplement
30 district cost per pupil for the previous fiscal year for the
31 district of residence.

32 (7) The area education agency professional development
33 supplement district cost per pupil for the previous fiscal year
34 for the district of residence.

35 (8) The special education support services foundation

1 base per pupil for the previous fiscal year multiplied by the
2 pupil's special education weighted enrollment for the previous
3 fiscal year.

4 (9) Any moneys received for the pupil as a result of the
5 non-English speaking weighting under section 280.4, subsection
6 3, for the previous school year multiplied by the regular
7 program state cost per pupil for the previous fiscal year.

8 (10) The amount of any per pupil federal funding received by
9 the district of residence as the result of the pupil.

10 b. If the pupil participating in open enrollment is also
11 an eligible pupil under [section 261E.6](#), the receiving district
12 shall, in addition to the amount paid under paragraph "a", pay
13 the tuition reimbursement amount to an eligible postsecondary
14 institution as provided in [section 261E.7](#).

15 Sec. 2. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to school budget
16 years beginning on or after July 1, 2019.

17 EXPLANATION

18 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
19 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

20 Current Code section 282.18(7) provides that a pupil
21 participating in open enrollment shall be counted, for state
22 school foundation aid purposes, in the pupil's district of
23 residence. The school district of residence then is required
24 to pay to the receiving district the sum of the state cost per
25 pupil for the previous school year plus either the teacher
26 leadership supplement state cost per pupil for the previous
27 fiscal year or the teacher leadership supplement foundation aid
28 for the previous fiscal year if both the district of residence
29 and the receiving district are receiving such supplements,
30 plus any moneys received for the pupil as a result of the
31 non-English speaking weighting and any eligible postsecondary
32 tuition reimbursement amounts under Code section 261E.7, if
33 applicable.

34 This bill modifies the amount required to be paid from
35 the district of residence to the receiving district to be

1 an amount equal to the following: (1) the regular program
2 foundation base per pupil for the previous fiscal year minus
3 the amount per pupil of foundation property tax in the district
4 of residence for the previous fiscal year; (2) either the
5 teacher leadership supplement district cost per pupil for the
6 previous fiscal year or the teacher leadership supplement
7 foundation aid for the previous fiscal year, if both the
8 district of residence and the receiving district are receiving
9 such supplements; (3) the teacher salary supplement district
10 cost per pupil for the previous fiscal year for the district of
11 residence; (4) the professional development supplement district
12 cost per pupil for the previous fiscal year for the district
13 of residence; (5) the early intervention supplement district
14 cost per pupil for the previous fiscal year for the district
15 of residence; (6) the area education agency teacher salary
16 supplement district cost per pupil for the previous fiscal year
17 for the district of residence; (7) the area education agency
18 professional development supplement district cost per pupil
19 for the previous fiscal year for the district of residence;
20 (8) the special education support services foundation base per
21 pupil for the previous fiscal year multiplied by the pupil's
22 special education weighted enrollment for the previous fiscal
23 year; (9) any moneys received for the pupil as a result of the
24 non-English speaking weighting, for the previous school year
25 multiplied by the regular program state cost per pupil for the
26 previous fiscal year; and (10) the amount of any per pupil
27 federal funding received by the district of residence as the
28 result of the pupil.

29 By operation of law, the changes in the bill also apply
30 to the amount required to be paid by a resident district to
31 a charter school or innovation zone consortium under Code
32 chapter 256F when the pupil enrolls in such a school outside
33 the pupil's district of residence.

34 The bill applies to school budget years beginning on or after
35 July 1, 2019.
