A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act allowing pickups to be used as school buses.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 321.373, subsection 3, Code 2018, is

The rules prescribed for school buses shall include 4 special rules for passenger automobiles, and other vehicles 5 designed to carry eight or fewer pupils, when used as school The rules shall allow pickups designed to carry nine 7 passengers or less, including the driver, and weighing ten 8 thousand pounds or less, to be used as school buses.

EXPLANATION

- 10 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly. 11
- 12 Currently, rules of the department of education permit 13 type III vehicles to be used as school buses. Under 281 IAC 14 44.2(5), type III vehicles are not regular school buses but 15 are used to transport students in a school-related context and 16 may be marked as a school bus. A type III vehicle is a van 17 or passenger car, including a minivan, sport utility vehicle, 18 or station wagon. The difference between a family automobile 19 and an equivalent type III vehicle is not the vehicle itself, 20 but rather its use, as type III vehicles are used by schools 21 for purposes of student transportation. To qualify as a type 22 III vehicle, the vehicle must carry a maximum of nine or fewer 23 people, including the driver, and weigh 10,000 pounds or less. 24 Under 281 IAC 44.5(1), vehicles classified as pickups are not 25 allowed to be used for student transportation.
- 26 This bill requires such rules to allow pickups designed 27 to carry nine passengers or less, including the driver, and 28 weighing ten thousand pounds or less, to be used as school 29 buses. Under Code section 321.1, a pickup is any motor vehicle 30 designed to carry merchandise or freight of any kind, not to 31 exceed 2,000 pounds.
- 32 Under current law, any person who operates or allows 33 the operation of any vehicle as a school bus which does 34 not comply with the requirements provided by law or by the 35 rules and regulations of the department of education, or

- 1 for which there is not a valid temporary certificate for
- 2 operation, is guilty of a simple misdemeanor (Code section
- 3 285.14). The department of education is required to review
- 4 all transportation arrangements when deemed necessary, to
- 5 disapprove any arrangements that are not in conformity with the
- 6 law and established standards, and to require the arrangements
- 7 to be altered or changed so that they do conform with the law
- 8 and established standards (Code section 285.8).
- 9 Under current law, all type III vehicles are prohibited from
- 10 carrying more passengers than there are seat belts as installed
- 11 by the manufacturer (281 IAC 44.5(1)(d)). In addition, trailer
- 12 hitches are allowed on type III vehicles in accordance with
- 13 the manufacturer's rated towing capacity, but students are not
- 14 allowed to be transported in the vehicle when the vehicle is
- 15 being used to tow (281 IAC 44.5(2)(j)). School bus drivers
- 16 must be at least 18 years of age on or before August 1 preceding
- 17 the opening of the school year for which a school bus driver's
- 18 authorization is required (281 IAC 43.14).
