A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act providing for a dyslexia response task force and report.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

S.F. 2360

- 1 Section 1. DYSLEXIA RESPONSE TASK FORCE AND REPORT.
- The department of education shall establish a dyslexia
- 3 task force. The task force shall consist of the following
- 4 members:
- 5 a. The director of the department of education or the
- 6 director's designee.
- 7 b. A representative of the Iowa reading research center.
- 8 c. A representative of an area education agency.
- 9 d. A representative of an institution of higher education
- 10 in Iowa with documented expertise in dyslexia and reading
- ll instruction.
- 12 e. A representative of the Iowa association of school
- 13 boards.
- 14 f. One school administrator.
- 15 g. One elementary general education teacher.
- 16 h. One reading specialist.
- i. One special education teacher.
- 18 j. Two representatives of decoding dyslexia who are parents
- 19 of children with dyslexia.
- 20 k. One representative of decoding dyslexia who is an
- 21 individual with dyslexia.
- 22 1. Two providers certified in a structured literacy reading
- 23 program.
- 24 m. One psychologist or speech language pathologist licensed
- 25 in the state of Iowa with experience in diagnosing dyslexia.
- 26 2. The department of education shall provide staffing
- 27 services for the task force.
- 28 3. The task force shall submit a report regarding its
- 29 findings and recommendations relating to dyslexia response
- 30 to the governor and the general assembly no later than
- 31 November 15, 2019. When making such recommendations, the
- 32 task force shall consider but not be limited to student
- 33 screening, interventions, teacher preparation and professional
- 34 development, classroom accommodations, and assistive
- 35 technology. The report shall include all of the following:

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- 1 a. An overview of the symptoms and effects of dyslexia.
- 2 b. An overview of current practices relating to dyslexia
- 3 response in Iowa schools.
- 4 c. A description of current concerns relating to dyslexia
- 5 response identified by the members of the task force.
- 6 d. Recommendations of any proposed legislation or
- 7 rulemaking or any additional personnel or funding needed to
- 8 address the needs of Iowa students with dyslexia.
- 9 e. Recommendations relating to dyslexia response for
- 10 specific stakeholder groups, including but not limited
- 11 to parents, educators, administrators, school boards, and
- 12 institutions of higher education.
- 13 f. A suggested timeline for implementation of the task
- 14 force's recommendations.
- 15 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 18 This bill directs the department of education to establish a
- 19 dyslexia task force, which will be staffed by the department.
- 20 The bill specifies the membership of the task force. The
- 21 bill directs the task force to submit a report regarding its
- 22 findings and recommendations relating to dyslexia response to
- 23 the governor and the general assembly no later than November
- 24 15, 2019. The bill specifies the content of the report.
