## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the criminal offense of child endangerment
- 2 by prohibiting a sex offender convicted of a sex offense
- 3 against a minor access to a child or certain minors and by
- 4 prohibiting a parent or guardian from allowing such access,
- 5 and providing penalties.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 726.6, subsection 1, paragraph h, Code 2 2018, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 h. Knowingly allows a person custody or control of, or
- 4 unsupervised access to a child or a minor after knowing the
- 5 person is required to register due to a conviction for a sex
- 6 offense against a minor or is on the sex offender registry as
- 7 a sex offender due to a conviction for a sex offense against
- 8 a minor under chapter 692A. However, this paragraph does
- 9 not apply to a person who is a parent or guardian of a child
- 10 or a minor, who is and the parent or guardian is required
- 11 to register as a sex offender due to a conviction for a sex
- 12 offense against a minor, or to a person who is married to and
- 13 living with a person required to register as a sex offender  $\underline{\mathtt{due}}$
- 14 to a conviction for a sex offense against a minor.
- Sec. 2. Section 726.6, Code 2018, is amended by adding the
- 16 following new subsection:
- 17 NEW SUBSECTION. 1A. A person who knowingly takes custody or
- 18 control of a child or minor, or who knowingly has unsupervised
- 19 access to a child or minor while required to register as a sex
- 20 offender for a sex offense against a minor under chapter 692A,
- 21 commits child endangerment. However, this subsection does not
- 22 apply to a person who is a parent or guardian of the child or
- 23 minor, or to a person who is married to and living with a person
- 24 who is the parent or guardian of the child or minor.
- Sec. 3. Section 726.6, subsection 3, unnumbered paragraph
- 26 1, Code 2018, is amended to read as follows:
- 27 For the purposes of subsection 1 or 1A, "person having
- 28 control over a child or a minor" means any of the following:
- 29 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 32 This bill relates to the criminal offense of child
- 33 endangerment by prohibiting a sex offender convicted of a sex
- 34 offense against a minor access to a child or certain minors and
- 35 by prohibiting a parent or quardian from allowing such access.

1 For purposes of the bill, "a person having control over a 2 child or minor" means any of the following: a person who has 3 accepted, undertaken, or assumed supervision of a child or such 4 a minor from the parent or guardian of the child or minor; a 5 person who has undertaken or assumed temporary supervision of a 6 child or such a minor without explicit consent from the parent 7 or quardian of the child or minor; or a person who operates 8 a motor vehicle with a child or such a minor present in the 9 vehicle. Under the bill, a person who is the parent, guardian, or 10 11 person having custody or control over a child or a minor 12 under the age of 18 with a mental or physical disability, or 13 a person who is a member of the household in which a child 14 or such a minor resides, commits child endangerment when the 15 person knowingly allows a person custody or control of, or 16 unsupervised access to a child or a minor after knowing the 17 person is required to register due to a conviction for a sex 18 offense against a minor or is on the sex offender registry due 19 to a conviction for a sex offense against a minor under chapter 20 692A. However, this prohibition does not apply to a person who 21 is a parent or guardian of a child or a minor and the parent 22 or quardian is required to register as a sex offender due to a 23 conviction for a sex offense against a minor, or to a person 24 who is married to and living with a person required to register 25 as a sex offender due to a conviction for a sex offense against 26 a minor. A person who violates this provision also commits 27 child abuse pursuant to Code section 232.68(2)(a)(9). Under the bill, a person who knowingly takes custody or 28 29 control of a child or certain minors, or who knowingly has 30 unsupervised access to a child or certain minors while required 31 to register as a sex offender, commits child endangerment. 32 However, the bill does not apply to a person who is a parent or 33 guardian of the child or minor, or to a person who is married to 34 and living with a person who is the parent or guardian of the

35 child or minor.

- 1 The penalties for the commission of child endangerment
- 2 in violation of Code section 726.6 range from an aggravated
- 3 misdemeanor to a class "B" felony depending upon the
- 4 circumstances of the case.
