# A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to and making appropriations to state
- 2 departments and agencies from the rebuild Iowa
- 3 infrastructure fund and the technology reinvestment fund,
- 4 providing for related matters, and including effective date
- 5 provisions.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 DIVISION I REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND 2 3 Section 1. REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND -4 APPROPRIATIONS. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa 5 infrastructure fund to the following departments and agencies 6 for the following fiscal years, the following amounts, or so 7 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes 8 designated: 9 1. DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES 10 For major maintenance projects: FY 2018-2019: 11 12 ..... \$ 14,400,000 13 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP 2. 14 (1) For deposit in the water quality initiative fund a. 15 created in section 466B.45 for purposes of supporting the 16 water quality initiative administered by the division of soil 17 conservation and water quality as provided in section 466B.42, 18 including salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous 19 purposes, notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph 20 °c″: 21 FY 2018-2019: 22 ..... \$ 5,200,000 (2) (a) The moneys appropriated in this lettered 23 24 paragraph shall be used to support demonstration projects in 25 subwatersheds as designated by the department that are part 26 of high-priority watersheds identified by the water resources 27 coordinating council. 28 The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph (b) 29 shall be used to support demonstration projects in watersheds 30 generally, including regional watersheds, as designated by the 31 division and high-priority watersheds identified by the water 32 resources coordinating council. 33 (3) In supporting projects in watersheds and subwatersheds 34 as provided in subparagraph (2), subparagraph divisions (a) and 35 (b), all of the following shall apply:

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(a) The demonstration projects shall utilize water quality
 practices as described in the latest revision of the document
 entitled "Iowa Nutrient Reduction Strategy" initially presented
 in November 2012 by the department of agriculture and land
 stewardship, the department of natural resources, and Iowa
 state university of science and technology.

7 (b) The division shall implement demonstration projects 8 as provided in subparagraph division (a) by providing 9 for participation by persons who hold a legal interest in 10 agricultural land used in farming. To every extent practical, 11 the division shall provide for collaborative participation by 12 such persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land 13 located within the same subwatershed.

14 (c) The division shall implement demonstration projects on 15 a cost-share basis as determined by the division. Except for 16 edge-of-field practices, the state's share of the amount shall 17 not exceed 50 percent of the estimated cost of establishing the 18 practice as determined by the division or 50 percent of the 19 actual cost of establishing the practice, whichever is less. 20 (d) The demonstration projects shall be used to educate

21 other persons about the feasibility and value of establishing 22 similar water quality practices. The division shall promote 23 field day events for purposes of allowing interested persons to 24 establish water quality practices on their agricultural land. 25 (e) The division shall conduct water quality evaluations 26 within supported subwatersheds. Within a reasonable period 27 after accumulating information from such evaluations, the 28 division shall create an aggregated database of water quality 29 practices. Any information identifying a person holding a 30 legal interest in agricultural land or specific agricultural 31 land shall be a confidential record.

32 (4) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph 33 shall be used to support education and outreach in a manner 34 that encourages persons who hold a legal interest in 35 agricultural land used for farming to implement water quality

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1 practices, including the establishment of such practices in 2 watersheds generally, and not limited to subwatersheds or 3 high-priority watersheds.

4 (5) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph 5 may be used to contract with persons to coordinate the 6 implementation of efforts provided in this paragraph.

7 (6) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph 8 may be used by the department to support urban soil and water 9 conservation efforts, which may include but are not limited 10 to management practices related to bioretention, landscaping, 11 the use of permeable or pervious pavement, and soil quality 12 restoration. The moneys shall be allocated on a cost-share 13 basis as provided in chapter 161A.

14 (7) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the 15 contrary, the department may use moneys appropriated in 16 this lettered paragraph to carry out the provisions of this 17 paragraph on a cost-share basis in combination with other 18 moneys available to the department from a state or federal 19 source.

20 (8) Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in 21 this lettered paragraph may be used for costs of administration 22 and implementation of the water quality initiative administered 23 by the soil conservation division.

Section 456A.33B, subsection 1, paragraph c, 10 subparagraph (4), Code 2018, is amended by striking the ll subparagraph. 12 EXPLANATION 13 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly. 14 15 This bill relates to and makes appropriations to state 16 departments and agencies from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure 17 fund and the technology reinvestment fund, and provides for 18 related matters. The bill is organized by divisions. DIVISION I — REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND. 19 This 20 division appropriates project funding for FY 2018-2019 from 21 the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund for projects for the 22 departments of administrative services, agriculture and land 23 stewardship, human rights, human services, natural resources, 24 public defense, public safety, and transportation, and for the 25 office of the chief information officer, economic development 26 authority, treasurer of state, and the judicial branch. The 27 division also appropriates project funding from the rebuild 28 Iowa infrastructure fund for multiple fiscal years to the 29 department of cultural affairs, the board of regents, and the 30 law enforcement academy. DIVISION II - TECHNOLOGY REINVESTMENT FUND. 31 This division 32 appropriates project funding for FY 2018-2019 from the 33 technology reinvestment fund for the departments of education, 34 human rights, management, public health, homeland security and 35 emergency management, public safety, and natural resources,

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1 and for the office of the chief information officer, the 2 state public defender, judicial branch, and board of parole. 3 This division also appropriates project funding for multiple 4 fiscal years beginning in FY 2018-2019 from the technology 5 reinvestment fund to the department of human services and the 6 secretary of state.

DIVISION III - CHANGES TO PRIOR APPROPRIATIONS. 7 This 8 division makes a change to the reversion provision for 9 moneys appropriated to the department of education from the 10 technology reinvestment fund in FY 2012-2013. The division 11 makes a change to moneys appropriated from the rebuild Iowa 12 infrastructure fund to the board of regents for a project at 13 the state university of Iowa and for projects at the Iowa 14 state university of science and technology, and the state 15 fair authority to authorize reimbursement of infrastructure 16 costs incurred in the prior fiscal year. The division also 17 changes project funding for a project at the Iowa state 18 university of science and technology. The division also makes 19 a change to the reversion provision applicable to moneys 20 appropriated from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the 21 department of natural resources for FY 2014-2015, and adds a 22 reversion provision to moneys appropriated from the technology 23 reinvestment fund in the 2017 Iowa Acts.

24 This division takes effect upon enactment.

DIVISION IV — MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS. Code section 8.57C, concerning the technology reinvestment fund, is amended to provide that the appropriation to the fund from the general fund for fiscal years beginning on or after July 1, 2018, is changed to fiscal years beginning on or after July 1, 2019, and to provide for an appropriation to the fund from the rebuild lowa infrastructure fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, of \$14.4 million.

33 DIVISION V — LAKE RESTORATION. Code section 456A.33B, 34 concerning lake restoration plan and report, is amended to 35 provide that the terms "public shallow lake or wetland" and a

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1 "significant public lake" include a lake or wetland owned by
2 a public entity organized pursuant to Code chapter 357E. In
3 addition, the division strikes the requirement that a "public
4 shallow lake or wetland" and a "significant public lake" does
5 not have a watershed-to-lake surface area ratio of greater than
6 two hundred to one.
