A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act concerning absences from work by veterans and members of
- 2 the military.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 29A.43, subsection 1, Code 2017, is
2 amended to read as follows:

1. A person shall not discriminate against any officer or 3 4 enlisted person of the national guard or organized reserves 5 of the armed forces of the United States or any member of the 6 civil air patrol because of that membership. An employer, 7 or agent of an employer, shall not discharge a person from 8 employment because of being an officer or enlisted person of 9 the military forces of the state or member of the civil air 10 patrol, or hinder or prevent the officer or enlisted person or 11 member of the civil air patrol from performing any military 12 service or civil air patrol duty the person is called upon 13 to perform by proper authority. A member of the national 14 guard or organized reserves of the armed forces of the United 15 States ordered to temporary duty or service, as defined in 16 section 29A.1, subsection 3, 8, or 12, or a member of the 17 civil air patrol performing duty pursuant to section 29A.3A, 18 for any purpose is entitled to a leave of absence during 19 the period of the duty or service, from the member's private 20 employment unless the employment is of a temporary nature. 21 Upon completion of the duty or service, the employer shall 22 restore the person to the position held prior to the leave of 23 absence or employ the person in a position of like seniority, 24 status, and pay. However, the person shall give evidence to 25 the employer of satisfactory completion of the duty or service, 26 and that the person is still qualified to perform the duties 27 of the position. The period of absence shall be construed as 28 an excused absence with leave, and shall in no way affect the 29 employee's rights to vacation, sick leave, bonus, or other 30 employment benefits relating to the employee's particular 31 employment or be considered an absence that would affect the 32 employee's rights for any bonus or other employee benefit 33 provided by the employer based on attendance at work. 34 Sec. 2. Section 91A.5A, subsection 1, Code 2017, is amended 35 to read as follows:

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1 1. An employer shall provide each employee who is a
 veteran, as defined in section 35.1, with holiday time off for
 Veterans Day, November 11, if the employee would otherwise be
 4 required to work on that day, as provided in this section. If
 5 an employee is provided holiday time off for Veterans Day as
 6 provided in this section, the employer shall not classify the
 7 time off as an absence from work for purposes of determining
 8 whether the employee is eligible for any benefit or bonus
 9 provided by the employer based on attendance at work.
 10 EXPLANATION

11 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 12 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

13 This bill concerns absences from work by members of the 14 military and veterans.

15 Code section 29A.43, concerning leaves of absence from 16 employment by any officer or enlisted person of the national 17 guard or organized reserves of the armed forces of the United 18 States or any member of the civil air patrol, is amended. The 19 bill provides that any absence from work based on that military 20 membership shall be considered an excused absence with leave 21 and shall not be considered an absence that would affect the 22 employee's rights for any bonus or other employee benefit 23 provided by the employer based on attendance at work. 24 Code section 91A.5A, concerning Veterans Day off for 25 veterans, is amended to provide that if a veteran is provided 26 Veterans Day off, the employer shall not classify the time off 27 as an absence from work for purposes of determining whether the 28 employee is eligible for any benefit or bonus provided by the 29 employer based on attendance at work.

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
