SENATE FILE 389 BY QUIRMBACH

A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to school district funding by establishing
- 2 a voter-approved district cost equity tax and levy or
- 3 reduction, modifying provisions establishing the district
- 4 cost per pupil, and including applicability provisions.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 257.10, subsection 2, paragraphs a and b,
- 2 Code 2017, are amended to read as follows:
- 3 a. For the budget year beginning July 1, 1992, and
- 4 succeeding budget years beginning before July 1, 2028, the
- 5 regular program district cost per pupil for each school
- 6 district for a budget year is the regular program district
- 7 cost per pupil for the base year plus the regular program
- 8 supplemental state aid for the budget year except as otherwise
- 9 provided in this subsection or otherwise adjusted under section
- 10 298.12, subsection 5.
- 11 b. If the regular program district cost per pupil of a
- 12 school district for the budget year under paragraph "a" exceeds
- 13 one hundred five percent of the regular program state cost
- 14 per pupil for the budget year and the state percent of growth
- 15 for the budget year is greater than two percent, the regular
- 16 program district cost per pupil for the budget year for that
- 17 district shall be reduced to one hundred five percent of the
- 18 regular program state cost per pupil for the budget year.
- 19 However, under such conditions, if the difference between the
- 20 regular program district cost per pupil for the budget year and
- 21 the regular program state cost per pupil for the budget year
- 22 is greater than an amount equal to two percent multiplied by
- 23 the regular program state cost per pupil for the base year, the
- 24 regular program district cost per pupil for the budget year
- 25 shall be reduced by the amount equal to two percent multiplied
- 26 by the regular program state cost per pupil for the base year.
- 27 Sec. 2. Section 257.10, subsection 2, Code 2017, is amended
- 28 by adding the following new paragraph:
- 29 NEW PARAGRAPH. c. For the budget year beginning July 1,
- 30 2028, and each succeeding budget year, the regular program
- 31 district cost per pupil for each school district for a budget
- 32 year is the regular program state cost per pupil for the budget
- 33 year.
- 34 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 298.12 District cost equity levy -
- 35 election.

1 l. In order to provide regular program district cost per
2 pupil equity among all school districts in the state, the
3 board of directors of a school district, following approval
4 at election under subsection 2, may certify for levy by April
5 15 of the school year preceding the budget year, a tax on all
6 taxable property in the school district for a district cost
7 equity levy or following approval at an election held pursuant
8 to subsection 5, shall reduce the school district's regular
9 program district cost per pupil to an amount not less than the

10 regular program state cost per pupil.

- 2. a. The board of directors of a school district may, on its own motion, or shall, upon receipt of a petition signed by eligible electors equal in number to at least thirty percent of the number of voters who voted at the last preceding regular school election, direct the county commissioner of elections to submit to the registered voters of the school district the question of whether to levy the district cost equity tax not to exceed an amount authorized under subsection 3 and for a period of time authorized by the voters, not to exceed ten years.

 20 The question shall be submitted at an election held on a date specified in section 39.2, subsection 4, paragraph "c".
- 22 b. If a majority of the votes cast upon the proposition is 23 in favor of the proposition, the board shall annually certify 24 the amount required for a fiscal year to the county board of 25 supervisors. The board of supervisors shall levy the amount 26 certified. The amount shall be deposited in the general fund 27 of the school district and may be used for any school general 28 fund purpose.
- c. The proposition to levy the district cost equity tax
 is not affected by a change in the boundaries of a school
 district, except as otherwise provided in this section.
 The district cost equity tax shall not be imposed in any
 reorganized school district unless the voters of each district
 involved in the reorganization had previously adopted the
 district cost equity tax. If each district involved in school

- 1 reorganization under chapter 275 has adopted the district
- 2 cost equity tax, and if the voters have not voted upon the
- 3 proposition to levy the district cost equity tax in the
- 4 reorganized district, the existing district cost equity tax
- 5 shall be in effect for the reorganized district for the fewest
- 6 number of approved years remaining in any of the districts and
- 7 until discontinued pursuant to this section and for the lowest
- 8 amount per pupil approved by the school districts involved in
- 9 the reorganization.
- 10 d. Once approved at an election, the authority of the
- 11 board to levy and collect the district cost equity tax shall
- 12 continue for the number of years authorized at election unless
- 13 the board votes to rescind the levy and collection of the tax
- 14 or the voters of the school district by majority vote approve
- 15 the discontinuance of the levy and collection of the tax. The
- 16 tax may be discontinued before the end of the period of years
- 17 authorized at election in the manner provided for imposition
- 18 of the tax under this section.
- 3. a. For budget years beginning on or after July 1, 2018,
- 20 but before July 1, 2028, the amount certified by a school
- 21 district for levy under this section for a school budget year
- 22 shall not exceed an amount equal to the difference between
- 23 the school district's regular program district cost per pupil
- 24 and the highest regular program district cost per pupil among
- 25 all school districts in the state, not to exceed one hundred
- 26 seventy-five dollars, multiplied by the school district's
- 27 weighted enrollment for the budget year.
- 28 b. For budget years beginning on or after July 1, 2028,
- 29 the amount certified by a school district for levy under this
- 30 section for a school budget year shall not exceed an amount
- 31 equal to one hundred seventy-five dollars multiplied by the
- 32 school district's weighted enrollment for the budget year.
- 33 4. Revenues received by a school district under this section
- 34 are miscellaneous income and shall not be included in any
- 35 computation of a school district's cost for any future budget

1 year.

5. a. The board of directors of a school district may, on 3 its own motion, or shall, upon receipt of a petition signed by 4 eligible electors equal in number to at least thirty percent of 5 the number of voters who voted at the last preceding regular 6 school election, direct the county commissioner of elections 7 to submit to the registered voters of the school district the 8 question of whether to reduce the school district's regular 9 program district cost per pupil to an amount not less than 10 the regular program state cost per pupil for a period of 11 time authorized by the voters, but ending not later than the 12 conclusion of the budget year beginning July 1, 2027. 13 question shall be submitted at an election held on a date 14 specified in section 39.2, subsection 4, paragraph c. If a majority of the votes cast upon the proposition 15 16 is in favor of the proposition, the school district's regular 17 program district cost per pupil under section 257.10, 18 subsection 2, paragraph "a", shall be reduced to the amount 19 approved at election, subject to the durational limitation in 20 paragraph "a". The reduction of a school district's regular program 21 22 district cost per pupil is not affected by a change in the 23 boundaries of a school district, except as otherwise provided 24 in this section. A reduction of the school district's 25 regular program district cost per pupil shall not apply to any 26 reorganized school district unless the voters of each district 27 involved in the reorganization had previously approved such a 28 reduction. If each district involved in school reorganization 29 under chapter 275 has approved such a reduction, and if the 30 voters have not voted upon the reduction proposition in the 31 reorganized district, the reduction shall be in effect for 32 the reorganized district for the fewest number of approved 33 years remaining in any of the districts and until discontinued 34 pursuant to this section and for the highest regular program 35 district cost per pupil approved by the school districts

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- 1 involved in the reorganization.
- 2 d. Once approved at an election, the reduction shall
- 3 continue for the number of years authorized at election unless
- 4 the board votes to rescind the reduction or the voters of the
- 5 school district by majority vote approve the discontinuance of
- 6 the reduction. The reduction may be discontinued before the
- 7 end of the period of years authorized at election in the manner
- 8 provided for imposition of the tax under this section.
- 9 Sec. 4. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to school budget
- 10 years beginning on or after July 1, 2018.
- 11 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 14 This bill authorizes the board of directors of a school
- 15 district, following voter approval, to certify for levy a tax
- 16 on all taxable property in the school district for a district
- 17 cost equity levy or to reduce the district's regular program
- 18 district cost per pupil.
- 19 The board of directors of a school district may, on its
- 20 own motion, or shall, upon receipt of a petition signed by
- 21 eligible electors equal in number to at least 30 percent of the
- 22 number of voters who voted at the last preceding regular school
- 23 election, direct the county commissioner of elections to submit
- 24 to the registered voters of the school district the question of
- 25 whether to levy the district cost equity tax and the length of
- 26 time authorized to impose the levy, not to exceed 10 years. If
- 27 the proposition is approved by majority vote, the board shall
- 28 annually certify the amount required for a fiscal year to the
- 29 county board of supervisors, not to exceed the maximum annual
- 30 amount determined in the bill.
- 31 The amount collected from the levy shall be placed in the
- 32 general fund of the school district and may be used for any
- 33 authorized school purpose. Once approved at an election, the
- 34 authority of the board to levy and collect the district cost
- 35 equity tax shall continue for the number of years authorized

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- 1 at election unless the board votes to rescind the levy or the
- 2 voters of the school district by majority vote approve the
- 3 discontinuance of the levy.
- 4 For budget years beginning or after July 1, 2018, but before
- 5 July 1, 2028, the amount certified by a school district for
- 6 levy for a school budget year shall not exceed an amount
- 7 equal to the difference between the school district's regular
- 8 program district cost per pupil and the highest regular program
- 9 district cost per pupil among all school districts in the
- 10 state, not to exceed \$175, multiplied by the school district's
- 11 budget enrollment. For budget years beginning on or after July
- 12 1, 2028, the amount certified by a school district for levy for
- 13 a school budget year shall not exceed an amount equal to \$175
- 14 multiplied by the school district's weighted enrollment for the
- 15 budget year.
- 16 The bill specifies that revenues received by a school
- 17 district from a district cost equity levy are miscellaneous
- 18 income and shall not be included in the calculation of district
- 19 cost in any future budget year.
- 20 The bill also provides that the board of directors of a
- 21 school district may, on its own motion, or shall, upon receipt
- 22 of a petition signed by eligible electors equal in number to
- 23 at least 30 percent of the number of voters who voted at the
- 24 last preceding regular school election, direct the county
- 25 commissioner of elections to submit to the registered voters
- 26 of the school district the question of whether to reduce the
- 27 school district's regular program district cost per pupil to an
- 28 amount not less than the regular program state cost per pupil
- 29 for a period of time authorized by the voters, but ending not
- 30 later than the conclusion of the budget year beginning July 1,
- 31 2027. If a majority of the votes cast upon the proposition
- 32 is in favor of the proposition, the school district's regular
- 33 program district cost per pupil shall be reduced to the amount
- 34 approved at election subject to the time limitation in the

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35 bill. Once approved at an election, the reduction shall

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- 1 continue for the number of years authorized at election unless
- 2 the board votes to rescind the reduction or the voters of the
- 3 school district by majority vote approve the discontinuance of
- 4 the reduction.
- 5 The bill also provides that for the budget year beginning
- 6 July 1, 2028, and each succeeding budget year, the regular
- 7 program district cost per pupil for each school district for a
- 8 budget year is the regular program state cost per pupil for the
- 9 budget year.
- 10 The bill applies to school budget years beginning on or after 11 July 1, 2018.
