8	BE	IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 DIVISION I 2 STATE AND DISTRICT COSTS PER PUPIL Section 1. Section 257.2, subsection 12, Code 2017, is 3 4 amended to read as follows: 5 12. "Supplemental state aid" means the amount by which state 6 cost per pupil and district cost per pupil will increase from 7 one budget year to the next as the result of the state percent 8 of growth. 9 Sec. 2. Section 257.8, subsection 5, Code 2017, is amended 10 to read as follows: 5. Alternate supplemental state aid — definitions. 11 12 a. For budget years beginning July 1, 2000, and subsequent 13 budget years, references to the terms "supplemental state aid", 14 "regular program state cost per pupil", and "regular program 15 district cost per pupil" shall mean those terms as calculated 16 for those school districts that calculated regular program 17 supplemental state aid for the school budget year beginning 18 July 1, 1999, with the additional thirty-eight dollars 19 specified in section 257.8, subsection 4, Code 2013. 20 b. For the budget year beginning July 1, 2017, and 21 subsequent budget years, references to "supplemental state 22 aid" and "regular program state cost per pupil" shall mean 23 those terms as calculated including the additional amounts 24 for specified budget years under section 257.9, subsection 25 2, paragraphs "b" and "c", and references to "regular program 26 district cost per pupil" shall mean that term as calculated 27 including any adjustments made under section 257.10, subsection 28 2. 29 Sec. 3. Section 257.9, subsection 2, Code 2017, is amended 30 to read as follows: 2. Regular program state cost per pupil for 1992-1993 and 31 32 succeeding years. 33 a. For the budget year beginning July 1, 1992, and 34 succeeding budget years beginning before July 1, 2017, the 35 regular program state cost per pupil for a budget year is the

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1 regular program state cost per pupil for the base year plus the 2 regular program supplemental state aid for the budget year. b. For the budget year beginning July 1, 2017, the regular 3 4 program state cost per pupil is the regular program state 5 cost per pupil for the base year plus the regular program 6 supplemental state aid for the budget year, plus five dollars. c. For the budget year beginning July 1, 2018, the regular 7 8 program state cost per pupil is the regular program state 9 cost per pupil for the base year plus the regular program 10 supplemental state aid for the budget year, plus ten dollars. 11 d. For the budget year beginning July 1, 2019, and 12 succeeding budget years beginning before July 1, 2027, the 13 regular program state cost per pupil for a budget year is the 14 regular program state cost per pupil for the base year plus the 15 regular program supplemental state aid for the budget year, 16 plus twenty dollars. e. For the budget year beginning July 1, 2027, and 17 18 succeeding budget years, the regular program state cost per 19 pupil for a budget year is the regular program state cost per 20 pupil for the base year plus the regular program supplemental 21 state aid for the budget year. Sec. 4. Section 257.10, subsection 2, paragraph b, Code 22 23 2017, is amended to read as follows: If the regular program district cost per pupil of a 24 b. 25 school district for the budget year under paragraph "a'' exceeds 26 one hundred five percent of the regular program state cost 27 per pupil for the budget year and the state percent of growth 28 for the budget year is greater than two percent, the regular 29 program district cost per pupil for the budget year for that 30 district shall be reduced to one hundred five percent of the 31 regular program state cost per pupil for the budget year. 32 However, under such conditions, if the difference between the 33 regular program district cost per pupil for the budget year and 34 the regular program state cost per pupil for the budget year 35 is greater than an amount equal to two percent multiplied by

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1 the regular program state cost per pupil for the base year, the 2 regular program district cost per pupil for the budget year 3 shall be reduced by the amount equal to two percent multiplied 4 by the regular program state cost per pupil for the base year. 5 Sec. 5. Section 257.10, subsection 2, Code 2017, is amended 6 by adding the following new paragraph:

7 <u>NEW PARAGRAPH</u>. *c.* For the budget year beginning July 1, 8 2017, and succeeding budget years, if the regular program 9 district cost per pupil for the budget year calculated under 10 this subsection in any school district is less than the 11 regular program state cost per pupil for the budget year, the 12 department of management shall increase the regular program 13 district cost per pupil of that district to an amount equal to 14 the regular program state cost per pupil for the budget year. 15 Sec. 6. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. This division of this 16 Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon 17 enactment.

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DIVISION II

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SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPPLEMENTARY WEIGHTING

20 Sec. 7. Section 257.11, Code 2017, is amended by adding the 21 following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 7A. School district transportation costs.
a. In order to provide additional funds for school district
transportation costs resulting from the transportation of
resident pupils required by chapter 285 and paid from sources
other than the district's physical plant and equipment levy
fund under section 298A.4 or revenue received from the secure
an advanced vision for education fund under section 423F.2, a
supplementary weighting plan for such pupils is adopted.

30 b. Each school district shall be assigned a supplementary 31 weighting amount as follows:

32 (1) For the budget year beginning July 1, 2017, ten percent 33 of the combined weighting amount calculated under paragraph 34 c, subparagraph (2), for that budget year.

35 (2) For the budget year beginning July 1, 2018, twenty

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1 percent of the combined weighting amount calculated under 2 paragraph "c", subparagraph (2), for that budget year. (3) For the budget year beginning July 1, 2019, thirty 3 4 percent of the combined weighting amount calculated under 5 paragraph c'', subparagraph (2), for that budget year. (4) For the budget year beginning July 1, 2020, forty 6 7 percent of the combined weighting amount calculated under 8 paragraph c'', subparagraph (2), for that budget year. 9 (5) For the budget year beginning July 1, 2021, fifty 10 percent of the combined weighting amount calculated under 11 paragraph c'', subparagraph (2), for that budget year. 12 (6) For the budget year beginning July 1, 2022, sixty 13 percent of the combined weighting amount calculated under 14 paragraph "c", subparagraph (2), for that budget year. 15 (7) For the budget year beginning July 1, 2023, seventy 16 percent of the combined weighting amount calculated under 17 paragraph "c", subparagraph (2), for that budget year. (8) For the budget year beginning July 1, 2024, eighty 18 19 percent of the combined weighting amount calculated under 20 paragraph "c", subparagraph (2), for that budget year. 21 (9) For the budget year beginning July 1, 2025, ninety 22 percent of the combined weighting amount calculated under 23 paragraph c'', subparagraph (2), for that budget year. 24 (10) For the budget year beginning July 1, 2026, and each 25 succeeding budget year, one hundred percent of the combined 26 weighting amount calculated under paragraph "c'', subparagraph 27 (2), for that budget year.

28 c. (1) (a) Transportation cost factor. For each budget 29 year beginning on or after July 1, 2017, the department of 30 management shall calculate for each school district all of the 31 following:

32 (i) The sum of the school district's total transportation 33 costs incurred for the transportation of pupils required under 34 chapter 285, and paid from sources other than the district's 35 physical plant and equipment levy fund under section 298A.4

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1 or revenue received from the secure an advanced vision for 2 education fund under section 423F.2, for the three years 3 immediately preceding the base year.

4 (ii) The sum of the school district's regular program 5 district cost for the three years immediately preceding the 6 base year, excluding amounts attributable to budget adjustments 7 received under section 257.14.

8 (iii) The school district's budget enrollment multiplied by 9 the quotient of the school district's amount under subparagraph 10 subdivision (i) divided by the school district's amount under 11 subparagraph subdivision (ii).

(iv) The school district's amount under subparagraph subdivision (iii) divided by the sum of the amounts calculated under subparagraph subdivision (iii) for all school districts. (v) The amount calculated under subparagraph subdivision (iv) multiplied by ninety percent of the sum of all school districts' transportation costs incurred for the transportation of pupils required under chapter 285 for the year preceding the base year and paid from sources other than the district's physical plant and equipment levy fund under section 298A.4 or revenue received from the secure an advanced vision for education fund under section 423F.2.

(vi) The quotient of the amount calculated under
subparagraph subdivision (v) divided by the regular program
state cost per pupil for the budget year.

(b) Budget enrollment factor. For each budget year peginning on or after July 1, 2017, the department of management shall calculate for each school district all of the following:

30 (i) The quotient of the school district's budget enrollment 31 divided by the statewide total budget enrollment multiplied by 32 five percent of the sum of all school districts' transportation 33 costs incurred for the transportation of pupils required under 34 chapter 285 for the year preceding the base year and paid from 35 sources other than the district's physical plant and equipment

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1 levy fund under section 298A.4 or revenue received from the 2 secure an advanced vision for education fund under section 3 423F.2.

4 (ii) The amount calculated under subparagraph subdivision 5 (i) divided by the regular program state cost per pupil for the 6 budget year.

7 (c) Route miles factor. For each budget year beginning 8 on or after July 1, 2017, the department of management shall 9 calculate for each school district all of the following: 10 (i) The quotient of the school district's total route 11 miles traveled for the transportation of pupils required under 12 chapter 285 for the year preceding the base year divided by the 13 school district's budget enrollment.

14 (ii) The school district's amount under subparagraph
15 subdivision (i) divided by the sum of the amounts calculated
16 under subparagraph subdivision (i) for all school districts.

(iii) The amount calculated under subparagraph subdivision (ii) multiplied by five percent of the sum of all school districts' transportation costs incurred for the transportation of pupils required under chapter 285 for the year preceding the base year and paid from sources other than the district's physical plant and equipment levy fund under section 298A.4 or revenue received from the secure an advanced vision for education fund under section 423F.2.

25 (iv) The amount calculated under subparagraph subdivision 26 (iii) divided by the regular program state cost per pupil for 27 the budget year.

28 (2) The combined weighting amount for each school district29 is the sum of the following:

30 (a) The amount calculated under subparagraph (1),
31 subparagraph division (a), subparagraph subdivision (vi).
32 (b) The amount calculated under subparagraph (1),
33 subparagraph division (b), subparagraph subdivision (ii).
34 (c) The amount calculated under subparagraph (1),
35 subparagraph division (c), subparagraph subdivision (iv).

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d. Funding received by a school district as the result of
 supplementary weighting under this subsection shall not affect
 a school district's eligibility for transportation assistance
 under section 257.31, subsection 17.

5 e. Amounts received by a school district as the result 6 of supplementary weighting under this subsection shall be 7 deposited in the school district's general fund and may be used 8 for any general fund purpose.

9 f. If a school district established as the result of a 10 reorganization under chapter 275 does not have sufficient 11 transportation cost data, regular program district cost per 12 pupil data, or enrollment data for the calculation of amounts 13 required under this subsection, the department of management 14 shall use estimated transportation cost data, regular program 15 district cost per pupil data, and enrollment data derived from 16 data for prior budget years from each district involved in 17 the reorganization until such amounts can be calculated using 18 actual data for the reorganized school district.

19 g. For the budget years beginning July 1, 2017, July 1, 20 2018, and July 1, 2019, and if necessary, any subsequent budget 21 years, if insufficient or incomplete transportation cost data 22 makes the implementation of this subsection impractical, the 23 department of management shall, in consultation with the 24 department of education and the legislative services agency, 25 establish procedures and modified methodologies for calculating 26 supplementary weighting and funding amounts under this 27 subsection.

28 Sec. 8. Section 257.11, subsection 8, Code 2017, is amended 29 to read as follows:

30 8. Pupils ineligible. A Except for transportation weighting 31 under subsection 7A, a pupil eligible for the weighting plan 32 provided in section 256B.9 is not eligible for supplementary 33 weighting pursuant to this section unless it is determined 34 that the course generating the supplemental weighting has no 35 relationship to the pupil's disability. A pupil attending an

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1 alternative program or an at-risk pupils' program, including 2 alternative high school programs, is not eligible for 3 supplementary weighting under subsection 2.

4 Sec. 9. Section 257.31, subsection 17, paragraphs a and d,5 Code 2017, are amended to read as follows:

a. If a district's average transportation costs per
pupil exceed the state average transportation costs per
pupil determined under paragraph "c" by one hundred fifty
percent, the committee may grant transportation assistance aid
to the district using exclusively the funds transferred to
the committee in accordance with section 321.34, subsection
22. Such aid shall be miscellaneous income and shall not be
included in district cost.

d. Funds transferred to the committee in accordance with 14 15 section 321.34, subsection 22, are appropriated to and may be 16 expended for the purposes of the committee, as described in 17 this section subsection. However, highest priority shall be 18 given to districts that meet the conditions described in this 19 subsection. Notwithstanding any other provision of the Code, 20 unencumbered or unobligated funds transferred to the committee 21 pursuant to section 321.34, subsection 22, remaining on June 22 30 of the fiscal year for which the funds were transferred, 23 shall not revert but shall be available for expenditure for the 24 purposes of this subsection in subsequent fiscal years. 25 Sec. 10. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. This division of this 26 Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon 27 enactment.

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EXPLANATION

The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

This bill relates to school district finance by modifying provisions relating to the calculation of the regular program state cost per pupil and the regular program district cost per pupil and establishing a supplementary weighting plan for certain mandatory school district transportation costs.

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Division I of the bill relates to the determination of the regular program state cost per pupil and the determination of regular program district cost per pupil for school districts. Those amounts are used to determine supplemental state aid amounts for each school budget year, determining the budget authority for each school district, and determining amounts of preschool foundation aid for schools participating in the statewide preschool program for four-year-old children under Ocde chapter 256C.

Current Code section 257.9 provides that for the budget 10 11 year beginning July 1, 1992, and succeeding budget years, the 12 regular program state cost per pupil for a budget year is the 13 regular program state cost per pupil for the base year plus the 14 regular program supplemental state aid for the budget year. 15 Under the bill, for the budget year beginning July 1, 2017, 16 the regular program state cost per pupil is the regular program 17 state cost per pupil for the base year plus the regular program 18 supplemental state aid for the budget year, plus \$5. For 19 the budget year beginning July 1, 2018, the regular program 20 state cost per pupil is the regular program state cost per 21 pupil for the base year plus the regular program supplemental 22 state aid for the budget year, plus \$10. For the budget year 23 beginning July 1, 2019, and succeeding budget years beginning 24 before July 1, 2027, the regular program state cost per pupil 25 is the regular program state cost per pupil for the base 26 year plus the regular program supplemental state aid for the 27 budget year, plus \$20. Then with the budget year beginning 28 July 1, 2027, and succeeding budget years, the regular program 29 state cost per pupil will again be calculated as the regular 30 program state cost per pupil for the base year plus the regular 31 program supplemental state aid for the budget year without any 32 additional amount added.

33 The bill amends Code section 257.10 to provide that if 34 the regular program district cost per pupil for the budget 35 year calculated in any school district is less than the

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1 regular program state cost per pupil for the budget year, the 2 department of management shall increase the regular program 3 district cost per pupil of that district to an amount equal to 4 the regular program state cost per pupil for the budget year. 5 Division I of the bill takes effect upon enactment. 6 Division II of the bill establishes a supplementary 7 weighting plan for school district transportation costs 8 resulting from the transportation of pupils as required under 9 Code chapter 285.

10 The bill establishes a methodology for calculating the 11 amount of supplementary weighting assigned to each school 12 district. The calculation is made using school district 13 transportation cost data, school district enrollment data, 14 and school district transportation route mile data. The 15 amount of the supplementary weighting is phased in over a 16 period of 10 school budget years beginning with the budget 17 year beginning July 1, 2017. Under the bill, if a school 18 district established as the result of a reorganization does not 19 have sufficient data for the calculation of amounts required 20 under the bill, the department of management is required to 21 use estimated data derived from data for prior budget years 22 from each district involved in the reorganization until such 23 amounts can be calculated using actual data for the reorganized 24 school district. In addition, for specified budget years, 25 if insufficient or incomplete transportation cost data makes 26 the implementation of division II of the bill impractical, 27 the department of management is required to, in consultation 28 with the department of education and the legislative services 29 agency, establish procedures and modified methodologies for 30 calculating supplementary weighting and funding amounts under 31 division II of the bill.

32 The bill specifies that funding received by a school 33 district as the result of supplementary weighting in the 34 bill does not affect a school district's eligibility for 35 transportation assistance granted by the school budget

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1 review committee and specifies that transportation assistance 2 granted by the school budget review committee may only be 3 granted using funds transferred to the committee in accordance 4 with Code section 321.34(22). The bill also provides that 5 funding received by a school district as the result of the 6 supplementary weighting must be deposited in the school 7 district's general fund and may be used for any general fund 8 purpose.

9 Division II of the bill takes effect upon enactment.
