(SUCCESSOR TO SSB 1038)

**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to the transfer of moneys collected by the  
2 office of the chief information officer for furnishing  
3 certified abstracts of drivers' operating records.  
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 321A.3, subsection 1, Code 2017, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3 1. The department shall upon request furnish any person a  
4 certified abstract of the operating record of a person subject  
5 to chapter 321~~r~~, or 321J, or this chapter. The abstract shall  
6 also fully designate the motor vehicles, if any, registered in  
7 the name of the person. If there is no record of a conviction  
8 of the person having violated any law relating to the operation  
9 of a motor vehicle or of any injury or damage caused by the  
10 person, the department shall so certify. A fee of five dollars  
11 and fifty cents shall be paid for each abstract except for  
12 abstracts requested by state, county, or city officials, court  
13 officials, public transit officials, or other officials of a  
14 political subdivision of the state or a nonprofit charitable  
15 organization described in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal  
16 Revenue Code. ~~The~~ Except for any additional access fee  
17 collected under subsection 7, the department shall transfer the  
18 moneys collected under this section to the treasurer of state  
19 who shall credit to the general fund all moneys collected. If  
20 a fee established in this subsection is collected by the office  
21 of the chief information officer, created in section 8B.2, for  
22 a record furnished through an electronic portal maintained by  
23 the office of the chief information officer, the office of the  
24 chief information officer shall transfer the moneys collected  
25 under this subsection to the treasurer of state who shall  
26 credit the moneys to the general fund.

EXPLANATION

28 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with  
29 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

30 Under current law, moneys collected by the office of the  
31 chief information officer (OCIO) for furnishing certified  
32 abstracts of drivers' operating records through an electronic  
33 portal maintained by OCIO are transferred to the department  
34 of transportation which then transfers the moneys to the  
35 treasurer of state to be deposited in the general fund. This

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1 bill requires that the moneys collected by OCIO be transferred  
2 directly to the treasurer of state to be deposited in the  
3 general fund.
