## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to child abuse involving access to a child by a
- 2 person who is required to register as a sex offender.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 3 (9) Knowingly A person who is responsible for the care of

- 6 under the age of fourteen or a child with a physical or mental
- 7 disability, after knowing the person individual is required to
- 8 register or is on the sex offender registry under chapter 692A

- 11 (a) A child is living with a parent or guardian who is a sex
- 12 offender required to register on the sex offender registry.

- 24 Under current law, "child abuse" is defined to include
- 25 knowingly allowing a person who is required to register or is
- 26 registered on the sex offender registry for a violation of Code
- 27 section 726.6 (child endangerment) custody or control of, or
- 28 unsupervised access to, the child. Code chapter 232 defines a
- 29 "child" as any person under the age of 18.

- 31 includes a person who is responsible for the care of a child
- 32 knowingly allowing an individual custody or control of, or
- 33 unsupervised access to, a child under the age of 14 or a
- 34 child with a physical or mental disability, after knowing the
- 35 individual is required to register or is on the sex offender

- 2 living with a parent or guardian who is a sex offender, a
- 3 child is living with a parent or guardian who is married to
- 4 and living with a sex offender, and when the sex offender with

- 6 lives with the child to whom access was allowed.
