**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations to state  
2 departments and agencies from the rebuild Iowa  
3 infrastructure fund, the state bond repayment fund, the  
4 technology reinvestment fund, and the revenue bonds capitals  
5 fund, providing for related matters, and including effective  
6 date provisions.  
7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

DIVISION I

REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND

Section 1. REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND —

4 APPROPRIATIONS. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa  
5 infrastructure fund to the following departments and agencies  
6 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June  
7 30, 2018, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is  
8 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

9 1. DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

10 For major maintenance projects:

11 ..... \$ 12,010,000

12 Of the moneys appropriated in this subsection, \$2,000,000  
13 is allocated for the cost to modernize, upgrade, or replace  
14 elevator systems in facilities on the state capitol complex.  
15 The department shall give priority for projects modernizing  
16 elevator systems wherever possible.

17 2. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP

18 a. (1) For deposit in the water quality initiative fund  
19 created in section 466B.45 for purposes of supporting the  
20 water quality initiative administered by the division of soil  
21 conservation and water quality as provided in section 466B.42,  
22 including salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous  
23 purposes, notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph  
24 "c":

25 ..... \$ 5,200,000

26 (2) (a) The moneys appropriated in this lettered  
27 paragraph shall be used to support demonstration projects in  
28 subwatersheds as designated by the department that are part  
29 of high-priority watersheds identified by the water resources  
30 coordinating council.

31 (b) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph  
32 shall be used to support demonstration projects in watersheds  
33 generally, including regional watersheds, as designated by the  
34 division and high-priority watersheds identified by the water  
35 resources coordinating council.

1 (3) In supporting projects in watersheds and subwatersheds  
2 as provided in subparagraph (2), subparagraph divisions (a) and  
3 (b), all of the following shall apply:

4 (a) The demonstration projects shall utilize water quality  
5 practices as described in the latest revision of the document  
6 entitled "Iowa Nutrient Reduction Strategy" initially presented  
7 in November 2012 by the department of agriculture and land  
8 stewardship, the department of natural resources, and Iowa  
9 state university of science and technology.

10 (b) The division shall implement demonstration projects  
11 as provided in subparagraph division (a) by providing  
12 for participation by persons who hold a legal interest in  
13 agricultural land used in farming. To every extent practical,  
14 the division shall provide for collaborative participation by  
15 such persons who hold a legal interest in agricultural land  
16 located within the same subwatershed.

17 (c) The division shall implement demonstration projects on  
18 a cost-share basis as determined by the division. However,  
19 the state's share of the amount, except for edge-of-field  
20 practices, shall not exceed 50 percent of the estimated cost  
21 of establishing the practice as determined by the division or  
22 50 percent of the actual cost of establishing the practice,  
23 whichever is less.

24 (d) The demonstration projects shall be used to educate  
25 other persons about the feasibility and value of establishing  
26 similar water quality practices. The division shall promote  
27 field day events for purposes of allowing interested persons to  
28 establish water quality practices on their agricultural land.

29 (e) The division shall conduct water quality evaluations  
30 within supported subwatersheds. Within a reasonable period  
31 after accumulating information from such evaluations, the  
32 division shall create an aggregated database of water quality  
33 practices. Any information identifying a person holding a  
34 legal interest in agricultural land or specific agricultural  
35 land shall be a confidential record.

1 (4) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph  
2 shall be used to support education and outreach in a manner  
3 that encourages persons who hold a legal interest in  
4 agricultural land used for farming to implement water quality  
5 practices, including the establishment of such practices in  
6 watersheds generally, and not limited to subwatersheds or  
7 high-priority watersheds.

8 (5) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph  
9 may be used to contract with persons to coordinate the  
10 implementation of efforts provided in this paragraph.

11 (6) The moneys appropriated in this lettered paragraph  
12 may be used by the department to support urban soil and water  
13 conservation efforts, which may include but are not limited  
14 to management practices related to bioretention, landscaping,  
15 the use of permeable or pervious pavement, and soil quality  
16 restoration. The moneys shall be allocated on a cost-share  
17 basis as provided in chapter 161A.

18 (7) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the  
19 contrary, the department may use moneys appropriated in  
20 this lettered paragraph to carry out the provisions of this  
21 paragraph on a cost-share basis in combination with other  
22 moneys available to the department from a state or federal  
23 source.

24 (8) Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in  
25 this lettered paragraph may be used for costs of administration  
26 and implementation of the water quality initiative administered  
27 by the soil conservation division.

28 b. For deposit in the agricultural drainage well water  
29 quality assistance fund created in section 460.303 for  
30 purposes of supporting the agricultural drainage well water  
31 quality assistance program as provided in section 460.304,  
32 notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 5, paragraph "c":  
33 ..... \$ 1,875,000

34 Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in this  
35 lettered paragraph may be used for costs of administration and

1 implementation of soil conservation practices.

2 c. For deposit in the renewable fuels infrastructure fund  
3 created in section 159A.16 for renewable fuel infrastructure  
4 programs:

6 3. DEPARTMENT FOR THE BLIND

23 ends three years after the end of the fiscal year for which the  
24 appropriation is made. However, if the project or projects for  
25 which such appropriation was made are completed in an earlier  
26 fiscal year, unencumbered or unobligated moneys shall revert at  
27 the close of that same fiscal year.

2 institutions. *“Vertical infrastructure”* does not include

4 structure, or utility without a lease-purchase agreement.

23 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with  
24 the explanation’s substance by the members of the general assembly.

25 This bill relates to and makes appropriations to state  
26 departments and agencies from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure  
27 fund and the revenue bonds capitals fund, and provides for  
28 related matters. The bill is organized by divisions.

29 DIVISION I — REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND. This  
30 division appropriates project funding for FY 2017–2018 from  
31 the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund for projects for the  
32 departments of administrative services, agriculture and land  
33 stewardship, the blind, cultural affairs, human rights, human  
34 services, natural resources, public defense, public safety, and  
35 transportation, and for the economic development authority,

1 treasurer of state, and the board of regents.

2 DIVISION II — TECHNOLOGY REINVESTMENT FUND. This division  
3 appropriates project funding for FY 2017-2018 from the  
4 technology reinvestment fund for the departments of education,  
5 human rights, human services, management, public health, public  
6 safety, and homeland security and emergency management, and  
7 for the office of the chief information officer and the state  
8 public defender.

9 DIVISION III — MISCELLANEOUS APPROPRIATIONS. This division  
10 appropriates project funding for FY 2016-2017 from the revenue  
11 bonds capitals fund to the department of administrative  
12 services for major maintenance projects and for FY 2017-2018  
13 from the state bond repayment fund for the state board of  
14 regents for tuition replacement. This division takes effect  
15 upon enactment.

16 DIVISION IV — CHANGES TO PRIOR APPROPRIATIONS. This  
17 division makes a change to moneys appropriated from the  
18 rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the board of regents for  
19 a project at the state university of Iowa and projects at  
20 the Iowa state university of science and technology for FY  
21 2017-2018 and FY 2021-2022. The division also makes a change  
22 to moneys appropriated from the state bond repayment fund to  
23 the department of administrative services for repair of the  
24 dome of the Iowa state capitol for FY 2016-2017 to authorize  
25 expenditure of moneys remaining upon completion of repairs to  
26 the dome for maintenance projects for the Iowa state capitol  
27 and the Ola Babcock Miller building. This provision takes  
28 effect upon enactment.

29 This division also makes a change to moneys appropriated  
30 from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the department of  
31 administrative services for major maintenance projects for FY  
32 2016-2017. This provision takes effect upon enactment.

33 This division also makes a change in moneys appropriated  
34 from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the state fair  
35 authority for FY 2017-2018.



1       DIVISION V — MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS. Code section 8.57,  
2 concerning the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund, is amended  
3 to provide that the definition of "vertical infrastructure"  
4 specifically includes renewable fuel infrastructure programs.  
5 Code section 8.57C, concerning the technology reinvestment  
6 fund, is amended to provide that the appropriation to the  
7 fund from the general fund for fiscal years beginning on or  
8 after July 1, 2017, is changed to fiscal years beginning on  
9 or after July 1, 2018, and to provide for an appropriation to  
10 the fund from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund for the  
11 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, of \$10 million. Code  
12 section 12.88, concerning the revenue bonds capitals fund, is  
13 amended to provide that for FY 2017-2018, any unobligated and  
14 unencumbered moneys in the fund from the previous fiscal year  
15 are appropriated to the department of administrative services  
16 for major maintenance projects.
