## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to requirements for and restrictions on special
- 2 minor's driver's licenses, and making penalties applicable.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 321.194, subsection 2, paragraph a, Code
- 2 2020, is amended by adding the following new subparagraph:
- NEW SUBPARAGRAPH. (03) If the licensee is employed, the
- 4 licensee may operate a motor vehicle during the hours of 5:00
- 5 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. over the most direct and accessible route
- 6 between the licensee's residence or school of enrollment and
- 7 the licensee's place of employment, provided the driving
- 8 distance between the licensee's place of employment and the
- 9 nearest point on the route on which the licensee is authorized
- 10 to travel under subparagraph (1), subparagraph division (a), or
- 11 subparagraph (2), subparagraph division (a), is no more than
- 12 fifteen miles.
- 13 Sec. 2. Section 321.194, subsection 2, paragraph a,
- 14 subparagraph (3), Code 2020, is amended to read as follows:
- 15 (3) To a service station for the purpose of refueling, so
- 16 long as the service station is the station closest to the route
- 17 on which the licensee is traveling under subparagraph (1), or
- 18 (2), or (03).
- 19 Sec. 3. Section 321.194, subsection 3, paragraph b, Code
- 20 2020, is amended to read as follows:
- 21 b. Upon receipt of a statement of necessity, the department
- 22 shall issue the driver's license provided the applicant is
- 23 otherwise eligible for issuance of the license. The fact that
- 24 the applicant resides at a distance less than one mile from the
- 25 applicant's school of enrollment is prima facie evidence of the
- 26 nonexistence of necessity for the issuance of a license.
- 27 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 30 Under current law, a person holding a special minor's
- 31 driver's license is allowed to operate a motor vehicle during
- 32 the hours of 5:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. between the licensee's
- 33 residence, schools of enrollment, bus stops, and sites,
- 34 facilities, or schools designated by the licensee's district
- 35 or school of enrollment for the accommodation of the school's

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- 1 extracurricular activities, with certain limitations. This
- 2 bill allows a person holding a special minor's driver's license
- 3 who is employed to operate a motor vehicle during the hours of
- 4 5:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. to the licensee's place of employment,
- 5 so long as the driving distance between the licensee's place
- 6 of employment and the nearest point on an authorized route
- 7 between the licensee's residence and school of enrollment or
- 8 the closest bus stop is no more than 15 miles. The bill also
- 9 allows a licensee to operate a motor vehicle to a service
- 10 station along the associated route.
- Under current law, an applicant for a special minor's
- 12 driver's license is required to submit a certification from the
- 13 applicant's school stating that a need exists for the license.
- 14 The fact that an applicant resides at a distance less than one
- 15 mile from the applicant's school of enrollment is prima facie
- 16 evidence of the nonexistence of necessity for the issuance of
- 17 the license. The bill strikes this exclusion.
- 18 A violation of Code section 321.194 is punishable by a
- 19 scheduled fine of \$50.
