A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to permissible honoraria from restricted
- 2 donors to public officials and public employees and making
- 3 penalties applicable.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 68B.23, subsection 2, paragraph a, Code 2 2020, is amended to read as follows:
- 3 a. The honorarium consists of payment, not to exceed four
- 4 hundred ninety-nine dollars per day, of actual expenses of a
- 5 donee for registration, food, beverages, travel, and lodging
- 6 paid in return for participation in a panel or speaking
- 7 engagement at a meeting when the expenses relate directly to
- 8 the day or days on which the recipient has participation or
- 9 presentation responsibilities.
- 10 EXPLANATION
- 11 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 12 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 13 This bill relates to permissible honoraria from restricted
- 14 donors to public officials and public employees.
- Under Code chapter 68B (government ethics and lobbying),
- 16 a public official or public employee is prohibited from
- 17 seeking or accepting an honorarium from a restricted donor,
- 18 subject to certain exceptions. One such exception permits a
- 19 public official or public employee to accept an honorarium if
- 20 the honorarium consists of payment for the public official
- 21 or public employee's actual expenses for registration,
- 22 food, beverages, travel, and lodging paid in return for
- 23 participation in a panel or speaking engagement when the
- 24 expenses relate directly to the day or days on which the public
- 25 official or public employee has participation or presentation
- 26 responsibilities. The bill provides that a public official or
- 27 public employee may not accept an honorarium that is payment
- 28 for actual expenses in exchange for a panel or speaking
- 29 engagement if the payment exceeds \$499 per day.
- 30 A knowing and intentional violation of the limitations on
- 31 accepting an honorarium is a serious misdemeanor. A serious
- 32 misdemeanor is punishable by confinement for no more than one
- 33 year and a fine of at least \$315 but not more than \$1,875.
- In addition, a person who accepts an honorarium in
- 35 violation of Code chapter 68B is subject to civil penalties

- 2 disclosure board and to disciplinary action taken by the ethics
- 3 committees of the senate and house of representatives.
