A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the management of soil and water resources,
- 2 including projects described in the Iowa nutrient reduction
- 3 strategy, and the use of a county tax levy.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 161A.3, Code 2019, is amended by adding
- 2 the following new subsections:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 9A. "Iowa nutrient reduction strategy"
- 4 means the same as defined in section 455B.171.
- 5 NEW SUBSECTION. 12A. "Point source" means the same as
- 6 defined in section 455B.171.
- 7 Sec. 2. Section 161A.7, subsection 1, paragraph d, Code
- 8 2019, is amended to read as follows:
- 9 d. To cooperate, or enter into agreements with, and within
- 10 the limits of appropriations duly made available to it by law,
- 11 to furnish financial or other aid assistance to any agency,
- 12 governmental or otherwise, or any owner or occupier of lands
- 13 within the district, in the carrying on of including by doing
- 14 all of the following:
- (1) Carrying out erosion-control and watershed protection
- 16 and flood prevention operations within the district, subject
- 17 to such conditions as the commissioners may deem necessary to
- 18 advance the purposes of this chapter.
- 19 (2) Carrying out projects or operations within the
- 20 district, as provided in paragraph "p", subject to such
- 21 conditions as the commissioners may deem necessary to advance
- 22 the purposes of this chapter.
- 23 Sec. 3. Section 161A.7, subsection 1, Code 2019, is amended
- 24 by adding the following new paragraph:
- 25 NEW PARAGRAPH. p. To carry out soil erosion control,
- 26 watershed protection or improvement, water resource
- 27 restoration, flood prevention or control, and water quality
- 28 protection projects and operations, within the district. The
- 29 water quality protection projects and operations may include
- 30 but are not limited to efforts to maintain, protect, and
- 31 improve the quality of surface water and groundwater from point
- 32 and nonpoint sources, including by doing all of the following:
- 33 (1) Reducing or eliminating pollution caused by access to
- 34 agricultural drainage or sinkholes, sedimentation, or chemical
- 35 pollutants.

- 1 (2) Reducing or removing nutrients and other pollutants in
- 2 or from surface water and groundwater.
- 3 (3) Reducing or eliminating nutrient loads from surface 4 water or groundwater.
- 5 (4) Achieving or furthering any of the objectives, goals,
- 6 and targets described in the Iowa nutrient strategy.
- 7 Sec. 4. Section 161A.13, Code 2019, is amended to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 161A.13 Purpose of subdistricts.
- 10 Subdistricts of a soil and water conservation district may
- 11 be formed as provided in this chapter for the purposes of
- 12 carrying out watershed protection and flood prevention programs
- 13 to carry out the same purposes of the district under section
- 14 161A.7, within the territory of the subdistrict but shall not
- 15 be formed solely for the purpose of establishing or taking over
- 16 the operation of an existing drainage district.
- 17 Sec. 5. Section 161C.1, Code 2019, is amended by adding the
- 18 following new subsections:
- 19 NEW SUBSECTION. 01. "Authorized project" means a project
- 20 that is carried out to support any of the following:
- 21 a. Soil erosion control.
- 22 b. Watershed protection or improvement.
- 23 c. Water resource restoration.
- 24 d. Flood prevention or control.
- 25 e. Water quality protection practices.
- 26 f. Water quality projects and operations, including as
- 27 required to achieve or further any of the objectives, goals,
- 28 and targets described in the Iowa nutrient strategy.
- 29 NEW SUBSECTION. 4A. "Iowa nutrient reduction strategy"
- 30 means the same as defined in section 455B.171.
- 31 NEW SUBSECTION. 5A. "Point source" means the same as
- 32 defined in section 455B.171.
- NEW SUBSECTION. 5B. "Qualified government entity" means a
- 34 county, city, or other political subdivision, or other local
- 35 agency.

- 1 Sec. 6. Section 161C.2, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code 2 2019, is amended to read as follows:
- a. Each A soil and water conservation district, alone
- 4 and whenever practical in conjunction with other districts,
- 5 shall qualified government entities, or financing entities
- 6 may carry out district-wide and multiple-district projects
- 7 to support water protection practices in the district or
- 8 districts, including but not limited to authorized projects
- 9 to protect this state's groundwater and surface water from
- 10 point and nonpoint sources of contamination, including but
- 11 not limited to contamination by agricultural drainage wells,
- 12 sinkholes, sedimentation, or chemical pollutants. The projects
- 13 and operations include but are not limited to practices or
- 14 other efforts to reduce or eliminate pollution caused by access
- 15 to agricultural drainage wells or sinkholes, sedimentation,
- 16 or chemical pollutants, as described in the Iowa nutrient
- 17 reduction strategy.
- 18 Sec. 7. Section 161C.3, Code 2019, is amended to read as
- 19 follows:
- 20 161C.3 Cooperation with other agencies qualified government
- 21 entities and financing entities.
- 22 Soil A soil and water conservation districts district may
- 23 enter into agreements an agreement with the United States
- 24 federal government, as provided by state law, or with the state
- 25 of Iowa or any agency of the state, any other soil and water
- 26 conservation district, or other political subdivision of this
- 27 state a qualified government entity, or a financing entity,
- 28 for cooperation in preventing, controlling, or attempting to
- 29 prevent or control contamination the pollution of groundwater
- 30 or surface water or groundwater by point and nonpoint sources
- 31 of pollution. Soil and water conservation districts may
- 32 accept, as provided by state law, any money disbursed for water
- 33 quality preservation purposes by the federal government or any
- 34 agency of the federal government, and expend the money for the
- 35 purposes for which it was received.

- 1 Sec. 8. Section 161E.1, Code 2019, is amended to read as 2 follows:
- 3 161E.1 Authority of board.
- 4 1. a. If a county, soil and water conservation district,
- 5 a subdistrict of a soil and water conservation district,
- 6 political subdivision of the state, or other local agency a
- 7 qualified government entity, or a financing entity engages or
- 8 in, participates in a project for flood or erosion control,
- 9 flood prevention, or carries out an authorized project,
- 10 including but not limited to a water quality project or
- 11 operation, or engages in, participates in, or carries out a
- 12 project for the conservation, development, utilization, and
- 13 disposal of water, in cooperation with the federal government,
- 14 or a department or agency of the federal government, the
- 15 counties in which the project is carried on out may, act
- 16 through the board of supervisors, construct, or under a chapter
- 17 28E or 28F agreement, to do any of the following:
- 18 (1) Construct, operate, and maintain the project on lands
- 19 under the control or jurisdiction of the county dedicated to
- 20 county use, or furnish.
- 21 (2) Furnish financial and other assistance in connection
- 22 with the projects. Flood, soil erosion control, and watershed
- 23 improvement
- 24 b. Authorized projects, including but not limited to water
- 25 quality projects and operations, are presumed to be for the
- 26 protection of the tax base of the county, for the protection of
- 27 public roads and lands, and for the protection of the public
- 28 health, sanitation, safety, and general welfare.
- 29 Sec. 9. NEW SECTION. 161E.1A Definitions.
- 30 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
- 31 requires:
- 32 1. "Authorized project" means a project that is carried out
- 33 to support any of the following:
- 34 a. Soil erosion control project.
- 35 b. Watershed protection or improvement project.

- 1 c. Water resource restoration project.
- 2 d. Flood prevention or control.
- 3 e. Water quality protection practices.
- 4 f. Water quality projects and operations, including those
- 5 projects described in the Iowa nutrient reduction strategy.
- 6 2. "Iowa nutrient reduction strategy" means the same as
- 7 defined in section 455B.171.
- 8 3. "Point source" means the same as defined in section
- 9 455B.171.
- 10 4. "Qualified government entity" means a county, city, or
- 11 other political subdivision, or a local agency.
- 12 Sec. 10. Section 161E.2, Code 2019, is amended to read as
- 13 follows:
- 14 161E.2 Federal aid assistance.
- 15 A county may, in accordance with this chapter, accept
- 16 federal funds for aid moneys to assist in a supporting an
- 17 authorized project for flood or soil erosion control, flood
- 18 prevention, or the conservation, development, utilization,
- 19 and disposal of water, and. A county may cooperate with
- 20 the federal government or a department or agency of the
- 21 federal government, a soil and water conservation district,
- 22 subdistrict of a soil and water conservation district,
- 23 political subdivision of the state, or other local agency, and
- 24 the or a qualified government entity. The county may assume
- 25 a proportion of the cost of the authorized project as deemed
- 26 appropriate, and may assume the maintenance cost of the project
- 27 on lands under the control or jurisdiction of the county which
- 28 will not be discharged by federal aid assistance or grant.
- 29 Sec. 11. Section 161E.3, Code 2019, is amended to read as
- 30 follows:
- 31 161E.3 Cooperation.
- 32 The counties, county, soil and water conservation districts,
- 33 and subdistricts of soil and water conservation districts,
- 34 and qualified government entities concerned, shall advise and
- 35 consult with each other, upon the request of any of them or

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- 1 any affected landowners, and may cooperate with each other
- 2 or with other state subdivisions or instrumentalities, and
- 3 affected landowners, as well as with the federal government or
- 4 a department or agency of the federal government, or with a
- 5 financing entity, to construct, operate, and maintain suitable
- 6 authorized projects for flood or soil erosion control, flood
- 7 prevention, including but not limited to water quality projects
- 8 and operations, or the conservation, development, utilization,
- 9 and disposal of water on public roads or other public lands or
- 10 other land granted county use.
- 11 Sec. 12. Section 161E.5, Code 2019, is amended to read as
- 12 follows:
- 13 161E.5 Maintenance cost.
- 14 If construction of projects has been completed by the soil
- 15 and water conservation district, subdistricts a subdistrict of
- 16 the soil and water conservation districts district, political
- 17 subdivisions of the state, or other local agencies a qualified
- 18 government entity, or the federal government, or a department
- 19 or agency of the federal government, on private lands under the
- 20 easement granted to the county, only the cost of maintenance
- 21 may be assumed by the county.
- Sec. 13. Section 161E.9, Code 2019, is amended to read as
- 23 follows:
- 24 161E.9 Tax levy.
- 25 The county board of supervisors may annually levy a tax not
- 26 to exceed six and three-fourths cents per thousand dollars of
- 27 assessed value of all agricultural lands in the county, to
- 28 be used for flood and erosion control, including authorized
- 29 projects, including but not limited to furnishing financial
- 30 assistance in connection with water quality projects and
- 31 operations, and for the acquisition of land or interests in
- 32 land, and repair, alteration, maintenance, and operation of
- 33 works of improvement on lands under the control or jurisdiction
- 34 of the county as provided in this chapter.
- 35 Sec. 14. Section 161F.2, Code 2019, is amended to read as

- 1 follows:
- 2 161F.2 Board of supervisors to establish districts strip 3 coal mining.
- 4 1. The board of supervisors of any a county shall have
- 5 jurisdiction, power and authority at any regular, special or
- 6 adjourned session to establish, subject to the provisions
- 7 of this chapter, districts having for their purpose soil
- 8 conservation, and the control of flood waters, or the
- 9 improvement of water quality, and to cause to be constructed
- 10 as hereinafter provided, such improvements and facilities as
- 11 shall be deemed essential for the accomplishment of the purpose
- 12 of soil conservation, and flood control, or the improvement of
- 13 water quality.
- 2. Such The board of supervisors of a county shall also
- 15 have jurisdiction, power and authority at any regular, special
- 16 or adjourned session to establish, in the same manner that
- 17 the districts hereinabove referred to described in subsection
- 18 1 are established, districts having for their purpose soil
- 19 conservation in mining areas within the county, and provide
- 20 that anyone engaged in removing the surface soil over any
- 21 bed or strata of coal in such district for the purpose of
- 22 obtaining such coal shall replace the surface soil as nearly
- 23 as practicable to its original position, and provide that,
- 24 upon abandonment of such removal operation, all surface soil
- 25 shall be so replaced. This section subsection shall apply only
- 26 to surface soil so removed after July 4, 1949, and then only
- 27 if it is essential for the accomplishment of the purpose of
- 28 soil conservation and flood control within the purview of this
- 29 chapter.
- 30 Sec. 15. Section 161F.3, Code 2019, is amended to read as
- 31 follows:
- 32 161F.3 Combination of functions.
- 33 Such districts shall have the power to combine in their
- 34 functions activities affecting soil conservation, flood
- 35 control, and drainage, water quality improvement, or any of

- 1 these objects, singly or in combination with another.
- 2 Sec. 16. CODE EDITOR DIRECTIVE.
- 3 l. The Code editor is directed to make the following 4 transfers:
- 5 a. Section 161E.1A as enacted in this Act to section 161E.1.
- 6 b. Section 161E.1, as amended by this Act, to section
- 7 161E.1A.
- 8 2. The Code editor shall correct internal references in the
- 9 Code and in any enacted legislation as necessary due to the
- 10 enactment of this section.
- 11 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 14 This bill amends various provisions relating to the
- 15 management of soil and water resources including Code chapter
- 16 161A, the "Soil Conservation Districts Law" (Code section
- 17 161A.1) which regulates soil erosion and authorizes the payment
- 18 of cost-share incentives for soil and water conservation
- 19 practices administered by the department of agriculture and
- 20 land stewardship (department) and soil and water conservation
- 21 districts (districts) throughout the state; Code chapter
- 22 161C authorizing districts and other political subdivisions
- 23 to work in conjunction in carrying out districtwide and
- 24 multiple district water protection projects; Code chapter 161E,
- 25 authorizing counties and districts, political subdivisions,
- 26 and other local agencies (qualified government entities) to
- 27 provide for flood control or soil erosion control, including
- 28 by levying a tax of 6.75 cents per \$1,000 of assessed value on
- 29 agricultural land in the county; and Code chapter 161F which
- 30 authorizes the board of supervisors of a county to establish
- 31 soil conservation and flood control districts.
- 32 The bill provides that along with traditional duties and
- 33 powers exercised by these bodies relating to soil erosion
- 34 and flood protection, they may also carry out water quality
- 35 protection projects and operations which include efforts to

- 1 maintain, protect, and improve the quality of surface water
- 2 and groundwater from point and nonpoint sources in a manner
- 3 consistent with the Iowa nutrient reduction strategy. The
- 4 bill authorizes cooperation between districts, subdistricts,
- 5 and political subdivisions including through the use of
- 6 Code chapter 28E and Code chapter 28F agreements. The bill
- 7 authorizes joint financing agreements and the involvement of
- 8 financing entities which are presumably business organizations
- 9 engaged in bonding or other financing arrangements.
