A BILL FOR

1 An Act appropriating federal funds made available from federal
2 block grants and other nonstate sources, allocating portions
3 of federal block grants, and providing procedures if federal
4 funds are more or less than anticipated or if federal block
5 grants are more or less than anticipated.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. SUBSTANCE ABUSE APPROPRIATION.

2 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
3 8.41 to the department of public health for the following
4 federal fiscal years beginning October 1, and ending September
5 30, the following amounts:

6 FFY 2019-2020:.....	\$ 13,095,358
7 FFY 2020-2021:.....	\$ 13,095,358

8 a. The appropriations made in this subsection are in the
9 amounts anticipated to be received from the federal government
10 for the designated federal fiscal years under 42 U.S.C., ch.
11 6A, subch. XVII, part B, subpart ii, which provides for the
12 prevention and treatment of substance abuse block grant.
13 The department shall expend the funds appropriated in this
14 subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds
15 available and in conformance with [chapter 17A](#).

16 b. Of the funds appropriated for each federal fiscal year
17 in this subsection, an amount not exceeding 5 percent shall be
18 used by the department for administrative expenses.

19 c. (1) For the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019,
20 the department shall expend no less than an amount equal to
21 the amount expended for treatment services in the state fiscal
22 year beginning July 1, 2018, for pregnant women and women with
23 dependent children.

24 (2) For the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, the
25 department shall expend no less than an amount equal to the
26 amount expended for treatment services in the state fiscal
27 year beginning July 1, 2019, for pregnant women and women with
28 dependent children.

29 2. At least 20 percent of the funds remaining from the
30 appropriation made in subsection 1 for each federal fiscal year
31 shall be allocated for prevention programs.

32 3. In implementing the federal prevention and treatment of
33 substance abuse block grant under 42 U.S.C., ch. 6A, subch.
34 XVII, and any other applicable provisions of the federal Public
35 Health Service Act under 42 U.S.C., ch. 6A, the department

1 shall apply the provisions of Pub. L. No. 106-310, §3305,
2 as codified in 42 U.S.C. §300x-65, relating to services
3 under such federal law being provided by religious and other
4 nongovernmental organizations.

5 Sec. 2. COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATION.

6 1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by
7 section 8.41 to the department of human services for the
8 following federal fiscal years beginning October 1, and ending
9 September 30, the following amounts:

10 FFY 2019-2020:.....	\$ 5,377,612
11 FFY 2020-2021:.....	\$ 5,377,612

12 b. The appropriations made in this subsection are in the
13 amounts anticipated to be received from the federal government
14 for the designated federal fiscal years under 42 U.S.C., ch.
15 6A, subch. XVII, part B, subpart i, which provides for the
16 community mental health services block grant. The department
17 shall expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as
18 provided in the federal law making the funds available and in
19 conformance with [chapter 17A](#).

20 c. The department shall allocate not less than 95 percent
21 of the amount of the block grant each federal fiscal year for
22 eligible community mental health services for carrying out
23 the plan submitted to and approved by the federal substance
24 abuse and mental health services administration or required
25 by the federal substance abuse and mental health services
26 administration for the fiscal year involved.

27 d. Of the amount allocated to eligible services providers
28 in paragraph "c" minus expenditures required by the federal
29 substance abuse and mental health services administration,
30 70 percent of the amount each federal fiscal year shall be
31 distributed to mental health and disability services regions
32 established consistent with section 331.389. The moneys
33 distributed shall be used for the purpose of funding services
34 required by section 331.397 and core services for children as
35 identified by the children's system state board established

1 pursuant to executive order two, April 23, 2018.

2 2. An amount not exceeding 5 percent of the funds
3 appropriated in subsection 1 for each federal fiscal year shall
4 be used by the department of human services for administrative
5 expenses. From the funds set aside by this subsection for
6 administrative expenses, the department shall pay to the
7 auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of
8 auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of
9 the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state
10 shall bill the department for the costs of the audits.

11 Sec. 3. MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

12 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
13 8.41 to the department of public health for the following
14 federal fiscal years beginning October 1, and ending September
15 30, the following amounts:

16 FFY 2019-2020:.....	\$ 6,508,785
17 FFY 2020-2021:.....	\$ 6,508,785

18 a. The appropriations made in this subsection are in the
19 amounts anticipated to be received from the federal government
20 for the designated federal fiscal years under 42 U.S.C., ch.
21 7, subch. V, which provides for the maternal and child health
22 services block grant. The department shall expend the funds
23 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law
24 making the funds available and in conformance with [chapter 17A](#).

25 b. Funds appropriated in this subsection shall not be used
26 by the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics for indirect
27 costs.

28 2. An amount not exceeding 10 percent of the funds
29 appropriated in subsection 1 for each federal fiscal year shall
30 be used by the department of public health for administrative
31 expenses.

32 3. The departments of public health, human services, and
33 education and the university of Iowa's mobile and regional
34 child health specialty clinics shall continue to pursue to the
35 maximum extent feasible the coordination and integration of

1 services to women and children.

2 4. a. Sixty-three percent of the amount remaining after
3 the allocation made in subsection 2 for each federal fiscal
4 year shall be allocated to supplement appropriations for
5 maternal and child health programs within the department of
6 public health. Of these funds, the following amounts shall
7 be set aside for the statewide perinatal care program for the
8 following federal fiscal years:

11 b. Thirty-seven percent of the amount remaining after
12 the allocation made in subsection 2 for each federal fiscal
13 year shall be allocated to the university of Iowa hospitals
14 and clinics under the control of the state board of regents
15 for mobile and regional child health specialty clinics. The
16 university of Iowa hospitals and clinics shall not receive an
17 allocation for indirect costs from the funds for this program.
18 Priority shall be given to establishment and maintenance of a
19 statewide system of mobile and regional child health specialty
20 clinics.

21 5. The department of public health shall administer the
22 statewide maternal and child health program and the disabled
23 children's program by conducting mobile and regional child
24 health specialty clinics and conducting other activities to
25 improve the health of low-income women and children and to
26 promote the welfare of children with actual or potential
27 handicapping conditions and chronic illnesses in accordance
28 with the requirements of Tit. V of the federal Social Security
29 Act.

30 Sec. 4. PREVENTIVE HEALTH AND HEALTH SERVICES
31 APPROPRIATIONS.

32 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
33 8.41 to the department of public health for the following
34 federal fiscal years beginning October 1, and ending September
35 30, the following amounts:

2 FFY 2020-2021:..... \$ 1,848,877

3 The appropriations made in this subsection are in the
4 amounts anticipated to be received from the federal government
5 for the designated federal fiscal years under 42 U.S.C., ch.
6 6A, subch. XVII, part A, which provides for the preventive
7 health and health services block grant. The department shall
8 expend the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in
9 the federal law making the funds available and in conformance
10 with chapter 17A.

11 2. Of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 for each
12 federal fiscal year, an amount not exceeding 10 percent shall
13 be used by the department for administrative expenses.

14 3. Of the funds appropriated in subsection 1 for each
15 federal fiscal year, the specific amount of funds stipulated
16 by the notice of the block grant award shall be allocated for
17 services to victims of sex offenses and for rape prevention
18 education.

19 4. After deducting the funds allocated in subsections 2 and
20 3, the remaining funds appropriated in subsection 1 for each
21 federal fiscal year may be used by the department for healthy
22 people 2020 and Iowa's health improvement plan 2012-2016
23 program objectives, preventive health advisory committee, and
24 risk reduction services, including nutrition programs, health
25 incentive programs, chronic disease services, emergency medical
26 services, monitoring of the fluoridation program and start-up
27 fluoridation grants, and acquired immune deficiency syndrome
28 services. The moneys specified in this subsection shall not be
29 used by the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics or by the
30 state hygienic laboratory for the funding of indirect costs.

31 Sec. 5. STOP VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN GRANT PROGRAM
32 APPROPRIATION.

33 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
34 8.41 to the department of justice for the following federal
35 fiscal years beginning October 1, and ending September 30, the

1 following amounts:

4 The appropriations made in this subsection are in the
5 amounts anticipated to be received from the federal government
6 for the designated fiscal years under 42 U.S.C., ch. 46,
7 subch. XII-H, which provides for grants to combat violent
8 crimes against women. The department of justice shall expend
9 the funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
10 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
11 chapter 17A.

12 2. An amount not exceeding 10 percent of the funds
13 appropriated in subsection 1 shall be used by the department of
14 justice for administrative expenses. From the funds set aside
15 by this subsection for administrative expenses, the department
16 shall pay to the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay
17 the cost of auditing the use and administration of the state's
18 portion of the funds appropriated in subsection 1.

19 Sec. 6. RESIDENTIAL SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT FOR STATE
20 PRISONERS FORMULA GRANT PROGRAM. There is appropriated from
21 the fund created by [section 8.41](#) to the governor's office of
22 drug control policy for the following federal fiscal years
23 beginning October 1, and ending September 30, the following
24 amounts:

26 FFY 2020-2021:..... \$ 247,561

27 The appropriations made in this section are the amounts
28 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
29 designated federal fiscal years under 42 U.S.C., ch. 46, subch.
30 XII-G, which provides grants for substance abuse treatment
31 programs in state and local correctional facilities. The drug
32 policy coordinator shall expend the funds appropriated in this
33 section as provided in federal law making the funds available
34 and in conformance with [chapter 17A](#).

35 Sec. 7. EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT

1 PROGRAM APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from the fund
2 created by [section 8.41](#) to the governor's office of drug
3 control policy for the following federal fiscal years beginning
4 October 1, and ending September 30, the following amounts:

7 The appropriations made in this section are in the amounts
8 anticipated to be received from the federal government for the
9 designated fiscal years under 42 U.S.C., ch. 46, subch. V,
10 which provides for the Edward Byrne memorial justice assistance
11 grant program. The drug policy coordinator shall expend the
12 funds appropriated in this section as provided in the federal
13 law making the funds available and in conformance with chapter
14 17A.

15 Sec. 8. COMMUNITY SERVICES APPROPRIATIONS.

16 1. a. There is appropriated from the fund created by
17 section 8.41 to the division of community action agencies
18 of the department of human rights for the following federal
19 fiscal years beginning October 1, and ending September 30, the
20 following amounts:

23 The appropriations made in this subsection are in the
24 amounts anticipated to be received from the federal government
25 for the designated federal fiscal years under 42 U.S.C., ch.
26 106, which provides for the community services block grant.
27 The division of community action agencies of the department
28 of human rights shall expend the funds appropriated in this
29 subsection as provided in the federal law making the funds
30 available and in conformance with [chapter 17A](#).

31 b. Each federal fiscal year, the administrator of the
32 division of community action agencies of the department
33 of human rights shall allocate not less than 96 percent of
34 the amount of the block grants to eligible community action
35 agencies for programs benefiting low-income persons. Each

1 eligible agency shall receive a minimum allocation of not
2 less than \$100,000. The minimum allocation shall be achieved
3 by redistributing increased funds from agencies experiencing
4 a greater share of available funds. The funds shall be
5 distributed on the basis of the poverty-level population in the
6 area represented by the community action areas compared to the
7 size of the poverty-level population in the state.

8 2. An amount not exceeding 4 percent of the funds
9 appropriated in subsection 1 for each federal fiscal year shall
10 be used by the division of community action agencies of the
11 department of human rights for administrative expenses. From
12 the funds set aside by this subsection for administrative
13 expenses, the division of community action agencies of the
14 department of human rights shall pay to the auditor of state
15 an amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and
16 administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated
17 in subsection 1. The auditor of state shall bill the division
18 of community action agencies for the costs of the audits.

19 Sec. 9. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATIONS.

20 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
21 8.41 to the economic development authority for the following
22 federal fiscal years beginning October 1, and ending September
23 30, the following amounts:

26 The appropriations made in this subsection are in the
27 amounts anticipated to be received from the federal government
28 for the designated federal fiscal years under 42 U.S.C., ch.
29 69, which provides for community development block grants.
30 The economic development authority shall expend the funds
31 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law
32 making the funds available and in conformance with [chapter 17A](#).

33 2. a. An amount not exceeding \$1,100,000 for the federal
34 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2019, shall be used by the
35 economic development authority for administrative expenses for

1 the community development block grant. The total amount used
2 for administrative expenses includes \$600,000 for the federal
3 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2019, of funds appropriated
4 in subsection 1 and a matching contribution from the state
5 equal to \$500,000 from the appropriation of state funds for
6 the community development block grant and state appropriations
7 for related activities of the economic development authority.
8 From the funds set aside for administrative expenses by this
9 subsection, the economic development authority shall pay to
10 the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of
11 auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of
12 the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state
13 shall bill the authority for the costs of the audit.

14 b. An amount not exceeding \$1,100,000 for the federal
15 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2020, shall be used by the
16 economic development authority for administrative expenses for
17 the community development block grant. The total amount used
18 for administrative expenses includes \$600,000 for the federal
19 fiscal year beginning October 1, 2020, of funds appropriated
20 in subsection 1 and a matching contribution from the state
21 equal to \$500,000 from the appropriation of state funds for
22 the community development block grant and state appropriations
23 for related activities of the economic development authority.
24 From the funds set aside for administrative expenses by this
25 subsection, the economic development authority shall pay to
26 the auditor of state an amount sufficient to pay the cost of
27 auditing the use and administration of the state's portion of
28 the funds appropriated in subsection 1. The auditor of state
29 shall bill the authority for the costs of the audit.

30 Sec. 10. SURFACE TRANSPORTATION BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM
31 APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from the fund created
32 by [section 8.41](#) to the department of transportation for the
33 following federal fiscal years beginning October 1, and ending
34 September 30, the following amounts:

2 The appropriations made in this section are the amounts
3 anticipated to be received from the federal government for
4 the designated fiscal years under 23 U.S.C., ch. 23, §133,

7 department shall expend the moneys appropriated in this section
8 as provided in the federal law making the funds available and
9 in conformance with chapter 17A.

10 Sec. 11. LOW-INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE APPROPRIATIONS.

11 1. There is appropriated from the fund created by section
12 8.41 to the division of community action agencies of the
13 department of human rights for the following federal fiscal
14 years beginning October 1, and ending September 30, the
15 following amounts:

18 The appropriations made in this subsection are in the
19 amounts anticipated to be received from the federal government
20 for the designated federal fiscal years under 42 U.S.C., ch.
21 94, subch. II, which provides for the low-income home energy
22 assistance block grants. The division of community action
23 agencies of the department of human rights shall expend the
24 funds appropriated in this subsection as provided in the
25 federal law making the funds available and in conformance with
26 chapter 17A.

27 2. Up to 15 percent, or up to 25 percent if a waiver is
28 approved by the United States department of health and human
29 services, of the amount appropriated in this section that is
30 actually received for each federal fiscal year shall be used
31 for residential weatherization or other related home repairs
32 for low-income households. Of this allocation amount, not more
33 than 10 percent may be used for administrative expenses.

34 3. After subtracting the allocation in subsection 2, up to
35 10 percent of the remaining moneys for each federal fiscal year

1 are allocated for administrative expenses of the low-income
2 home energy assistance program of which \$377,000 is allocated
3 each federal fiscal year for administrative expenses of the
4 division. The costs of auditing the use and administration
5 of the portion of the appropriation in this section that is
6 retained by the state shall be paid from the amount allocated
7 in this subsection each federal fiscal year to the division.
8 The auditor of state shall bill the division for the audit
9 costs.

10 4. The remaining moneys of the appropriation made in this
11 section for each federal fiscal year following the allocations
12 made in subsections 2 and 3, shall be used to help eligible
13 households as defined in 42 U.S.C., ch. 94, subch. II, to meet
14 home energy costs.

15 5. Not more than 10 percent of the amount appropriated in
16 this section each federal fiscal year that is actually received
17 may be carried forward for use in the succeeding federal fiscal
18 year.

19 6. Expenditures for assessment and resolution of energy
20 problems shall be limited to not more than 5 percent of the
21 amount appropriated in this section for each federal fiscal
22 year that is actually received.

35 appropriated in this subsection as provided in the federal law

1 making the funds available and in conformance with chapter 17A.

2 2. Not more than the following amounts of the funds
3 appropriated in subsection 1 for the following federal fiscal
4 years shall be allocated by the department of human services
5 for general administration:

10 From the funds set aside in this subsection for general
11 administration for each federal fiscal year, the department
12 of human services shall pay to the auditor of state an
13 amount sufficient to pay the cost of auditing the use and
14 administration of the state's portion of the funds appropriated
15 in subsection 1.

16 3. In addition to the allocation for general administration
17 in subsection 2, the remaining funds appropriated in subsection
18 1 for each federal fiscal year shall be allocated in the
19 following amounts to supplement appropriations for the
20 following federal fiscal years for the following programs
21 within the department of human services:

7 Sec. 13. SOCIAL SERVICES BLOCK GRANT PLAN. The department
8 of human services during each state fiscal year shall develop a
9 plan for the use of federal social services block grant funds
10 for the subsequent state fiscal year.

11 The proposed plan shall include all programs and services
12 at the state level which the department proposes to fund with
13 federal social services block grant funds, and shall identify
14 state and other funds which the department proposes to use to
15 fund the state programs and services.

16 The proposed plan shall also include all local programs and
17 services which are eligible to be funded with federal social
18 services block grant funds, the total amount of federal social
19 services block grant funds available for the local programs and
20 services, and the manner of distribution of the federal social
21 services block grant funds to the counties. The proposed plan
22 shall identify state and local funds which will be used to fund
23 the local programs and services.

24 The proposed plan shall be submitted with the department's
25 budget requests to the governor and the general assembly.

26 Sec. 14. PROJECTS FOR ASSISTANCE IN TRANSITION FROM
27 HOMELESSNESS.

28 1. Upon receipt of the minimum formula grant from
29 the federal substance abuse and mental health services
30 administration to provide mental health services for the
31 homeless, for the federal fiscal years beginning October 1,
32 2019, and October 1, 2020, the department of human services
33 shall assure that a project which receives funds under the
34 formula grant shall do all of the following:

35 a. Provide outreach and engagement to homeless individuals

1 and individuals at risk of homelessness and assesses those
2 individuals for serious mental illness.

3 b. Enroll those individuals with serious mental illness who
4 are willing to accept services through the project.

5 c. Provide case management to homeless persons.

6 d. Provide appropriate training to persons who provide
7 services to persons targeted by the grant.

8 e. Assure a local match share of 25 percent.

9 f. Refer homeless individuals and individuals at risk of
10 homelessness to primary health care, job training, educational
11 services, and relevant housing services.

12 2. A project may expend funds for community mental health
13 services, diagnostic services, crisis intervention services,
14 habilitation and rehabilitation services, substance-related
15 disorder services, supportive and supervisory services to
16 homeless persons living in residential settings that are
17 not otherwise supported, and housing services including
18 minor renovation, expansion, and repair of housing, security
19 deposits, planning of housing, technical assistance in
20 applying for housing, improving the coordination of housing
21 services, the costs associated with matching eligible homeless
22 individuals with appropriate housing, and one-time rental
23 payments to prevent eviction.

25 is appropriated from the fund created by [section 8.41](#) to
26 the department of human services for the following federal
27 fiscal years beginning October 1, and ending September 30, the
28 following amounts:

31 The appropriations made in this section are in the amounts
32 anticipated to be received from the federal government for
33 the designated federal fiscal years under 42 U.S.C., ch.
34 105, subch. II-B, which provides for the child care and
35 development block grant. The department shall expend the funds

1 appropriated in this section as provided in the federal law
2 making the funds available and in conformance with [chapter 17A](#).

3 Moneys appropriated in this section that remain unencumbered
4 or unobligated at the close of the fiscal year shall revert to
5 be available for appropriation for purposes of the child care
6 and development block grant in the succeeding fiscal year.

7 Sec. 16. PROCEDURE FOR REDUCED FEDERAL FUNDS.

8 1. Unless otherwise necessary to meet federal requirements,
9 if the funds received from the federal government for the
10 block grants specified in this Act are less than the amounts
11 appropriated, the funds actually received shall be prorated
12 by the governor for the various programs, other than for the
13 services to victims of sex offenses and for rape prevention
14 education under section 4, subsection 3, of this Act, for which
15 each block grant is available according to the percentages that
16 each program is to receive as specified in this Act. However,
17 if the governor determines that the funds allocated by the
18 percentages will not be sufficient to accomplish the purposes
19 of a particular program, or if the appropriation is not
20 allocated by percentage, the governor may allocate the funds in
21 a manner which will accomplish to the greatest extent possible
22 the purposes of the various programs for which the block grants
23 are available.

24 2. Before the governor implements the actions provided for
25 in subsection 1, the following procedures shall be taken:

26 a. The chairpersons and ranking members of the senate and
27 house standing committees on appropriations, the appropriate
28 chairpersons and ranking members of subcommittees of those
29 committees, and the director of the legislative services agency
30 shall be notified of the proposed action.

31 b. The notice shall include the proposed allocations,
32 and information on the reasons why particular percentages or
33 amounts of funds are allocated to the individual programs,
34 the departments and programs affected, and other information
35 deemed useful. Chairpersons and ranking members notified shall

1 be allowed at least two weeks to review and comment on the
2 proposed action before the action is taken.

3 Sec. 17. PROCEDURE FOR INCREASED FEDERAL FUNDS.

4 1. Unless otherwise necessary to meet federal requirements,
5 if funds received from the federal government in the form of
6 block grants exceed the amounts appropriated in sections 1, 2,
7 3, 4, 7, 9, and 13 of this Act, the excess shall be prorated
8 to the appropriate programs according to the percentages
9 specified in those sections, except additional funds shall not
10 be prorated for administrative expenses.

11 2. If actual funds received from the federal government
12 from block grants exceed the amount appropriated in section 12
13 of this Act for the low-income home energy assistance program,
14 not more than 15 percent of the excess may be allocated to the
15 low-income residential weatherization program and not more than
16 10 percent of the excess may be used for administrative costs.

17 3. If funds received from the federal government from
18 community services block grants exceed the amount appropriated
19 in section 8 of this Act, 100 percent of the excess is
20 allocated to the community services block grant program.

21 Sec. 18. PROCEDURE FOR EXPENDITURE OF ADDITIONAL FEDERAL
22 FUNDS. If other federal grants, receipts, and funds and other
23 nonstate grants, receipts, and funds become available or are
24 awarded which are not available or awarded during the period
25 in which the general assembly is in session, but which require
26 expenditure by the applicable department or agency prior to
27 March 15 of the fiscal years beginning July 1, 2019, and July
28 1, 2020, these grants, receipts, and funds are appropriated to
29 the extent necessary, provided that the fiscal committee of
30 the legislative council is notified within 30 days of receipt
31 of the grants, receipts, or funds and the fiscal committee of
32 the legislative council has an opportunity to comment on the
33 expenditure of the grants, receipts, or funds.

34 Sec. 19. OTHER GRANTS, RECEIPTS, AND FUNDS. Federal grants,
35 receipts, and funds and other nonstate grants, receipts, and

1 funds, available in whole or in part of the state fiscal years
2 beginning July 1, 2019, and July 1, 2020, are appropriated to

11 EXPLANATION

12 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
13 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

14 This bill makes appropriations of federal block grants,
15 other federal funds, and nonstate funds.

16 The bill appropriates for the 2019-2020 federal fiscal year
17 and the 2020-2021 federal fiscal year block grants available
18 from the federal government and provides procedures for
19 increasing or decreasing the appropriations if the amounts
20 block grants are increased or decreased from the amounts
21 anticipated. The federal fiscal year begins on October 1, and
22 the state fiscal year begins July 1.

23 The bill also makes standing appropriations for the
24 2019-2020 state fiscal year and the 2020-2021 state fiscal year
25 of other federal grants receipts, and funds, and other nonstate
26 funds.
