Section 1. Section 135.173A, subsection 4, paragraph p,
 Code 2019, is amended to read as follows:

3 p. One person who is part of a local program implementing 4 the statewide preschool program for four-year-old young 5 children under chapter 256C.

6 Sec. 2. Section 135.173A, subsection 6, paragraph f, Code 7 2019, is amended to read as follows:

8 f. Make recommendations for improving collaborations 9 between the child care programs involving the department of 10 human services and programs supporting the education and 11 development of young children including but not limited to the 12 federal head start program; the statewide preschool program 13 for four-year-old young children; and the early childhood, 14 at-risk, and other early education programs administered by the 15 department of education.

16 Sec. 3. Section 256C.1, subsections 1 and 4, Code 2019, are
17 amended to read as follows:

18 1. "Approved local program" means a school district's 19 program for four-year-old young children approved by the 20 department of education to provide high quality preschool 21 instruction.

22 4. "Preschool program" means the statewide preschool program
23 for four-year-old young children created in accordance with
24 this chapter.

25 Sec. 4. Section 256C.1, Code 2019, is amended by adding the 26 following new subsection:

27 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 7. *Young children* means children who are 28 four years of age or who are five years of age on specified 29 dates as provided in section 256C.3, subsection 1, paragraph 30  $a^{-}$ .

31 Sec. 5. Section 256C.2, Code 2019, is amended to read as 32 follows:

33 256C.2 Statewide preschool program for four-year-old young
 34 children — purpose.

35 1. A statewide preschool program for four-year-old young

LSB 2800YC (2) 88 md/jh 1 children is established. The purpose of the preschool program 2 is to provide an opportunity for all young children in the 3 state to enter school ready to learn by expanding voluntary 4 access to quality preschool curricula for all children who are 5 four years old.

6 2. The state board shall adopt rules in accordance with 7 chapter 17A as necessary to implement the preschool program as 8 provided in this chapter.

9 Sec. 6. Section 256C.3, subsection 1, paragraphs a and b, 10 Code 2019, are amended to read as follows:

11 a. A child who is a resident of Iowa and <u>who</u> is <u>either</u> four 12 years of age on or before September 15 of a school year <u>or who</u> 13 <u>reaches five years of age on or after March 15 but on or before</u> 14 <u>September 15 of the calendar year during which the school year</u> 15 <u>begins</u> shall be eligible to enroll in the preschool program 16 under this chapter. If such a child is enrolled under this 17 chapter, the child shall be considered to be of compulsory 18 attendance age as provided in section 299.1A, subsection 3.

19 b. If space and funding are available, including funding 20 from another school district account or fund from which 21 preschool program expenditures are authorized by law, a school 22 district approved to participate in the preschool program 23 may enroll and pay the cost of attendance for a younger or 24 older child in the preschool program who does not satisfy the 25 requirements under paragraph "a"; however, the child shall not 26 be counted for state funding purposes.

27 Sec. 7. Section 256C.3, subsection 4, paragraph b, Code 28 2019, is amended to read as follows:

29 b. Subject to implementation of chapter 28E agreements 30 between a school district and community-based providers of 31 services to four-year-old children and eligible five-year-old 32 children, a four-year-old child or eligible five-year-old child 33 who is enrolled in a child care center or child development 34 home licensed or registered under chapter 237A, or in an 35 existing public or private preschool program, shall be eligible

3 Sec. 8. Section 256C.4, subsection 2, Code 2019, is amended 4 to read as follows:

5 2. Eligible student enrollment.

a. To be included as an eligible student in the enrollment
7 count of the preschool programming provided by a school
8 district approved to participate in the preschool program, a
9 child must be four years of satisfy the age by September 15
10 requirements of section 256C.3, subsection 1, paragraph "a" in
11 the base year and be attending the school district's approved
12 local program.

b. The enrollment count of eligible students shall not include a child who is included in the enrollment count determined under section 257.6 or a child who is served by a program already receiving state or federal funds for the purpose of the provision of four-year-old <u>or five-year-old</u> preschool programming while the child is being served by the program. Such preschool programming includes but is not limited to child development assistance programs provided under chapter 256A, special education programs provided under section programs and other programs provided under chapter 256I, and federal head start programs and the services funded by Tit. I of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965.

Sec. 9. Section 298A.2, subsection 2, paragraph a, subparagraph (1), Code 2019, is amended to read as follows: (1) An approved local program under the statewide preschool program for four-year-old young children under chapter 256C. Sec. 10. Section 298A.2, subsection 2, paragraph c, subparagraph (1), Code 2019, is amended to read as follows: (1) Start-up costs for an approved local program under the statewide preschool program for four-year-old young children under chapter 256C.

35 Sec. 11. Section 299.1A, subsection 3, Code 2019, is amended

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2 3. A child who has reached the age of four by September 15 3 or five and who is enrolled in the statewide preschool program 4 under chapter 256C shall be considered to be of compulsory 5 attendance age unless the parent or guardian of the child 6 submits written notice to the school district implementing the 7 program of the parent's or guardian's intent to remove the 8 child from enrollment in the preschool program.

9 Sec. 12. APPLICABILITY. This Act applies to school budget 10 years beginning on or after July 1, 2020.

EXPLANATION

12The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with13the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

14 The statewide preschool program for four-year-old children 15 under Code chapter 256C provides that a child who is a resident 16 of Iowa and is four years of age on or before September 15 of 17 a school year shall be eligible to enroll in the preschool 18 program. Additionally, to be included as an eligible student 19 in the enrollment count of the preschool programming for 20 state funding purposes, a child must be four years of age 21 by September 15 in the base year and attending the school 22 district's approved local program.

This bill expands the eligibility and state funding provisions of the statewide preschool program for four-year-old children under Code chapter 256C to also include five-year-old children who reach the age of five on or after March 15 but on or before September 15 of the calendar year during which the school year begins.

References to four-year-old children in the program named in Code chapter 256C and in related Code provisions are changed to "young children" or expanded to also refer to eligible five-year-old children and Code section 299.1A relating to compulsory education is also modified to reflect changes made a in the bill.
