## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to civil liability of sports officials,
- 2 providing criminal penalties for assault of sports
- 3 officials, and including effective date and applicability
- 4 provisions.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 671B.1 Definition.

2 "Sports official" means the same as defined in section 3 708.3A.

4 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 671B.2 Sports officials — limitation 5 of liability.

6 A sports official who officiates an athletic contest at any 7 level of competition in this state shall not be liable to any 8 person in any civil action for injuries or damages claimed to 9 have arisen due to actions or inactions within the confines of 10 the athletic facility at which the athletic contest is played 11 related in any manner to the sports official's officiating 12 duties.

13 Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 671B.3 Sports officials — liability 14 protection not applicable.

15 This chapter does not apply to a sports official who causes 16 injury or damage to a person by actions or inactions that are 17 intentional, malicious, or grossly negligent.

18 Sec. 4. Section 708.3A, subsections 1 through 4, Code 2020, 19 are amended to read as follows:

1. A person who commits an assault, as defined in section 20 21 708.1, against a peace officer, jailer, correctional staff, 22 member or employee of the board of parole, health care 23 provider, employee of the department of human services, 24 employee of the department of revenue, or fire fighter, whether 25 paid or volunteer, or sports official, with the knowledge that 26 the person against whom the assault is committed is a peace 27 officer, jailer, correctional staff, member or employee of 28 the board of parole, health care provider, employee of the 29 department of human services, employee of the department of 30 revenue, or fire fighter, or sports official and with the 31 intent to inflict a serious injury upon the peace officer, 32 jailer, correctional staff, member or employee of the board of 33 parole, health care provider, employee of the department of 34 human services, employee of the department of revenue, or fire 35 fighter, or sports official, is guilty of a class "D" felony.

2. A person who commits an assault, as defined in section
708.1, against a peace officer, jailer, correctional staff,
member or employee of the board of parole, health care
provider, employee of the department of human services,
employee of the department of revenue, or fire fighter,
whether paid or volunteer, or sports official, who knows that
the person against whom the assault is committed is a peace
officer, jailer, correctional staff, member or employee of
the board of parole, health care provider, employee of the
department of human services, employee of the department of
revenue, or fire fighter or sports official, and who uses or
displays a dangerous weapon in connection with the assault, is
quilty of a class "D" felony.

A person who commits an assault, as defined in section
708.1, against a peace officer, jailer, correctional staff,
member or employee of the board of parole, health care
provider, employee of the department of human services,
employee of the department of revenue, or fire fighter, whether
paid or volunteer, or sports official who knows that the person
against whom the assault is committed is a peace officer,
jailer, correctional staff, member or employee of the board of
parole, health care provider, employee of the department of
human services, employee of the department of revenue, or fire
fighter, or sports official, and who causes bodily injury or
mental illness, is guilty of an aggravated misdemeanor.

4. Any other assault, as defined in section 708.1, committed against a peace officer, jailer, correctional staff, member or member of the board of parole, health care provider, employee of the department of human services, employee of the department of revenue, or fire fighter, whether paid or volunteer, or sports official, by a person who knows that the person against whom the assault is committed is a peace officer, jailer, correctional staff, member or employee of the board of parole, health care provider, employee of the department of human services, employee of the department of revenue, or

1 fighter, or sports official, is a serious misdemeanor.

2 Sec. 5. Section 708.3A, subsection 5, Code 2020, is amended 3 by adding the following new paragraph:

NEW PARAGRAPH. f. "Sports official" means an individual 4 5 who serves as a referee, umpire, or linesman, or in a similar 6 capacity, at any athletic contest, and who is a member of 7 or registered with a local, state, regional, or national 8 organization that is engaged, in part, in providing education 9 and training to referees, umpires, linesman, or persons in 10 similar capacities.

Sec. 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of immediate 11 12 importance, takes effect upon enactment.

13 Sec. 7. APPLICABILITY. The following apply to legal actions 14 commenced after the effective date of this Act, including legal 15 actions that allege actions or inactions of a sports official 16 that occurred prior to the effective date of this Act: The section of this Act enacting section 671B.1. 17 1.

18 2. The section of this Act enacting section 671B.2. 19 3. The section of this Act enacting section 671B.3.

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EXPLANATION

The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with 22 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

This bill provides that a sports official who officiates 23 24 an athletic contest at any level of competition in Iowa shall 25 not be liable to any person in any civil action for injuries 26 or damages claimed to have arisen due to actions or inactions 27 within the confines of the athletic facility at which the 28 athletic contest is played related in any manner to the sports 29 official's officiating duties. This provision does not apply 30 to a sports official who causes injury or damage to a person 31 by actions or inactions that are intentional, malicious, or 32 grossly negligent. The bill applies to legal actions commenced 33 after the effective date of the bill, including legal actions 34 that allege actions or inactions of a sports official that 35 occurred prior to the effective date of the bill.

1 The bill provides that a person who commits an assault 2 against a sports official, with the knowledge that the person 3 against whom the assault is committed is a sports official, 4 and with the intent to commit a serious injury, is guilty of a 5 class "D" felony. The bill provides that a person who commits 6 an assault against a sports official, who knows that the person 7 against whom the assault is committed is a sports official, and 8 who uses or displays a dangerous weapon in connection with the 9 assault, is guilty of a class "D" felony. The bill provides 10 that a person who commits an assault against a sports official, 11 who knows that the person against whom the assault is committed 12 is a sports official, and who causes bodily injury or mental 13 illness, is guilty of an aggravated misdemeanor. The bill 14 provides that any other assault committed against a sports 15 official by a person who knows that the person against whom 16 the assault is committed is a sports official is a serious 17 misdemeanor. A class "D" felony is punishable by confinement 18 for no more than five years and a fine of at least \$750 but 19 not more than \$7,500. An aggravated misdemeanor is punishable 20 by confinement for no more than two years and a fine of at 21 least \$625 but not more than \$6,250. A serious misdemeanor is 22 punishable by confinement for no more than one year and a fine 23 of at least \$315 but not more than \$1,875.

The bill defines "sports official" as an individual who serves as a referee, umpire, or linesman, or in a similar capacity, at any athletic contest, and who is a member of or registered with a local, state, regional, or national organization that is engaged, in part, in providing education and training to sports officials.
