- 2 amended by adding the following new paragraph:
- 3 NEW PARAGRAPH. e. A county shall not adopt or enforce an

- 5 an employer from requesting from an applicant for employment
- 6 information related to the applicant's criminal history. Such
- 7 an ordinance, motion, resolution, or amendment adopted prior
- 8 to the effective date of this Act is void and unenforceable
- 9 on and after the effective date of this Act. For purposes of
- 10 this paragraph, "employer" means a person who seeks one or more

- 28 that prohibits an employer from requesting from an applicant
- 29 for employment with the employer information related to the
- 30 applicant's criminal history. Such an ordinance, motion,
- 31 resolution, or amendment adopted prior to the effective date of
- 32 the bill is void and unenforceable on and after the effective
- 33 date of the bill. For purposes of the bill, "employer" means
- 34 a person who seeks one or more employees or who employs one or
- 35 more employees.
