A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act concerning the contract bidding process for public
- 2 improvement projects conducted by the state board of
- 3 regents.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 262.34, subsection 1, Code 2019, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- a. When the estimated cost of construction, repairs,
- 4 or improvement of buildings or grounds under charge of the
- 5 state board of regents, including construction, renovation, or
- 6 repairs by a private party of a property to be lease-purchased
- 7 by the board, exceeds one hundred thousand dollars, the board
- 8 shall advertise do all of the following:
- 9 (1) Advertise for bids for the contemplated improvement
- 10 or construction and shall let by publishing a notice to
- 11 bidders. The notice to bidders shall be published at
- 12 least once, not less than thirteen days and not more than
- 13 forty-five days before the date for filing bids, in a relevant
- 14 contractor plan room service with statewide circulation, in a
- 15 relevant construction lead generating service with statewide
- 16 circulation, and on an internet site sponsored by the board.
- 17 If circumstances beyond the control of the board cause a
- 18 scheduled bid letting to be postponed and there are no changes
- 19 to the project's contract documents, a notice to bidders of
- 20 the revised date shall be posted not less than four and not
- 21 more than forty-five days before the revised date for filing
- 22 bids in a relevant contractor plan room service with statewide
- 23 circulation, in a relevant construction lead generating service
- 24 with statewide circulation, and on an internet site sponsored
- 25 by the board.
- 26 (2) Have an engineer licensed under chapter 542B, a
- 27 landscape architect licensed under chapter 544B, or an
- 28 architect licensed under chapter 544A prepare plans and
- 29 specifications and calculate the estimated total cost of the
- 30 contemplated improvement or construction. The plans and
- 31 specifications shall be sufficiently complete to describe
- 32 the entire improvement or construction, permit competitive
- 33 bidding for all labor, materials, and systems, and serve as
- 34 the project's contract documents. The board shall ensure
- 35 that a sufficient number of printed copies and, if available,

- 1 electronic and digital copies of the project's contract
- 2 documents, including but not limited to all drawings, plans,
- 3 specifications, and estimated total costs of the proposed
- 4 improvement, are made available for distribution at no charge
- 5 to prospective bidders, subcontractor bidders, suppliers, and
- 6 contractor plan room services.
- 7 (3) Let the work to the lowest responsive, responsible
- 8 bidder. However, if
- 9 b. If, in the judgment of the board, bids received are
- 10 not acceptable, the board may reject all bids, after making a
- ll specific finding identifying the basis for the rejection of
- 12 each bid received, and proceed with the construction, repair,
- 13 or improvement by a method as the board may determine. All
- 14 plans and specifications for repairs or construction, together
- 15 with bids on the plans or specifications, shall be filed by the
- 16 board and be open for public inspection. All bids submitted
- 17 under this section shall be accompanied by a deposit of money,
- 18 a certified check, or a credit union certified share draft in
- 19 an amount as the board may prescribe.
- 20 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- 22 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 23 This bill modifies the contract bidding process conducted
- 24 by the state board of regents.
- 25 Currently, when the estimated cost of construction, repairs,
- 26 or improvement of buildings or grounds under charge of the
- 27 state board of regents exceeds \$100,000, the board of regents
- 28 must advertise for bids for the contemplated work and shall
- 29 let the work to the lowest responsible bidder. However, if
- 30 in the judgment of the state board of regents bids received
- 31 are not acceptable, the state board of regents may reject all
- 32 bids and proceed with the work by a method as the state board
- 33 of regents may determine. All plans and specifications for
- 34 repairs or construction, together with bids on the plans or
- 35 specifications, must be filed by the state board of regents and

- 1 be open for public inspection. All bids must be accompanied
- 2 by a deposit of money, a certified check, or a credit union
- 3 certified share draft in an amount as the state board of
- 4 regents may prescribe.
- 5 Under the bill, when the estimated cost of the work exceeds
- 6 \$100,000, the state board of regents must advertise for bids by
- 7 publishing notice at least once, not less than 13 and not more
- 8 than 45 days before the date for filing bids, in a relevant
- 9 contractor plan room service with statewide circulation, a
- 10 relevant construction lead generating service with statewide
- 11 circulation, and on an internet site sponsored by the state
- 12 board of regents.
- 13 The state board of regents must also have a licensed
- 14 engineer, landscape architect, or architect prepare plans
- 15 and specifications, and calculate the estimated total cost
- 16 of the contemplated improvement or construction. The plans
- 17 and specification must describe the entire improvement
- 18 or construction, allow competitive bidding for all labor,
- 19 materials, and systems, and serve as the project's contract
- 20 documents. The state board of regents must ensure that a
- 21 sufficient number of printed copies of the project's contract
- 22 documents are made available for distribution at no charge to
- 23 prospective bidders, subcontractor bidders, suppliers, and
- 24 contractor plan room services.
- 25 If the state board of regents determines that none of the
- 26 bids are acceptable, the board, under the bill, must identify a
- 27 specific reason for rejecting each bid received and may proceed
- 28 with the work by a method as the board may determine, as the law
- 29 currently prescribes.
